Exemptions from this requirement are provided in KRS 61.878(1). The procedure for obtaining confidential protection of information filed with the Commission is provided in 807 KAR 5:001, Section 7. BellSouth Cellular Corporation, on behalf of its affiliate, has not met the procedural requirements of the regulation and the information cannot be protected as confidential.

This Commission being otherwise sufficiently advised,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The request to protect the Annual Report of Kentucky CGSA, Inc. is hereby denied.

2. The information sought to be protected shall be held and retained by this Commission as confidential and shall not be open for public inspection for a period of 20

days from the date of this Order to allow BellSouth Cellular Corporation to seek any remedy

afforded by law.

3. If at the expiration of the 20-day period no action has been taken by BellSouth

Cellular Corporation, the information shall be placed in the public record without further

Orders herein.1
