ALLEGED FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATION 807 KAR 5:041, SECTION 3 CASE NO. 98-275

ORDER

Kentucky Utilities Company ("KU"), a Kentucky corporation which engages in the distribution of electricity to the public for compensation for lights, heat, power, and other uses, is a utility subject to Commission jurisdiction. KRS 278.010(3)(a).

KRS 278.280(2) directs the Commission to prescribe rules and regulations for the performance of services by utilities. Pursuant to this statutory directive, the Commission promulgated Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:041, Section 3, which requires electric utilities to maintain their plant and facilities in accordance with the standards of the National Electrical Safety Code (1990 edition) ("NESC").

Commission Staff has submitted to the Commission a Utility Accident Investigation Report dated August 14, 1997, appended hereto, in which Commission Staff alleges:

1. On June 19, 1997, Danny Luck was injured while setting a utility pole near the KU Tunnel Hill Substation in Robards, Kentucky.

2. At the time of the incident, a KU work crew consisting of Luck, Shea Davis, Rodney Roberson, Mike Schuette, and Tony Bingham were setting a 35-foot utility pole on an energized 3-phase 7,200 volt circuit at the entrance of KU's Tunnel Hill Substation.

3. At the time of the incident, the KU crew had covered the center phase and road phase of the 7,200 volt circuit with line hose and had tagged out the field phase. Using an extendo stick, Davis held the primary phase out of the way. Roberson operated a digger derrick truck which held the new utility pole in place while Bingham shovelled dirt around the pole and Luck tamped that dirt with a hydraulic tamper.

4. After installing the utility pole, the KU crew began removing and storing its equipment. While Roberson removed the derrick truck's boom from the 3-phase circuit, the pole grabber assembly at the end of the boom penetrated the line slot on the underneath side of the line hose. As a result, the truck became energized. At the time, Luck was storing the hydraulic tamper on the derrick truck. He received an electric shock and suffered burns to his right hand.

5. At the time of the incident, the derrick truck was not grounded and Luck was wearing only work gloves.

6. At the time of the incident, Schuette was in charge of the work site.

7. At the time of the incident, Luck and Schuette were KU employees and were acting within the scope of their employment.

8. NESC Rule 422A1 requires that, <u>inter alia</u>, when setting poles in or in the vicinity of energized lines, employees shall wear suitable insulating gloves.

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9. NESC Rule 422A2 requires that contact with trucks, or other equipment which are not bonded to an effective ground, being used to set poles in or in the vicinity of energized lines shall be avoided by employees standing on the ground or in contact with grounded objects unless employees are wearing suitable protective equipment.

10. Luck failed to comply with NESC Rules 422A1 and 422A2.

11. Schuette failed to see that all safety and operating procedures were observed by those under his direction. His failure is a violation of NESC Rule 421A which requires a person in charge to adopt such precautions as are within his authority to prevent accidents and to see that all safety rules and operating procedures are observed by those under his direction.

Based on its review of the Utility Accident Investigation Report and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the Commission finds that <u>prima facie</u> evidence exists that KU has failed to comply with Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:041, Section 3.

The Commission, on its own motion, HEREBY ORDERS that:

1. KU shall appear before the Commission on October 6, 1998, at 9:00 a.m., Eastern Daylight Time, in Hearing Room 1 of the Commission's offices at 730 Schenkel Lane, Frankfort, Kentucky, for the purpose of presenting evidence concerning the alleged violations of Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:041, Section 3, and of showing cause why it should not be subject to the penalties prescribed in KRS 278.990(1) for these alleged violations.

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2. KU shall submit to the Commission within 20 days of the date of this Order a written response to the allegation contained in theUtility Accident Investigation Report.

The Utility Accident Investigation Report of August 14, 1997, a copy of 3. which is appended hereto, is made part of the record of this proceeding.

Any motion requesting any informal conference with Commission Staff to 4. consider any matter which would aid in the handling or disposition of this proceeding shall be filed with the Commission no later than 20 days from the date of this Order.

The crew had covered the center phase and road phase with line hose. The field phase had been tagged out and the primary neutral was being held out of the way with an extendo stick by Shea Davis. Rodney Roberson was operating the digger derrick truck and holding the pole in place while Tommy Bingham shoveled dirt around the pole. Danny Luck was tamping the dirt around the pole with a hydraulic tamper. Danny Luck finished his job and was putting the tamper back on the truck when he received a shock and burn to the heal of his palm on his right hand. At the same moment, Rodney Roberson was removing the truck's boom out of the three phase circuit, when the pole grabber assembly on the end of the boom inadvertently penetrated the line slot on the underneath side of the line hose causing the truck to be energized. The truck was not grounded and Danny Luck was wearing only work gloves. Mike Schuette was the supervisor on site and in charge at the time of the accident.




