## ORDER

On March 31, 1998, BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. ("BellSouth") filed a tariff which introduced the BellSouth 25¢ Call Plan. On May 29, 1998, the Commission suspended the operation of these tariffs for further review. AT&T Communications of the South Central States, Inc. ("AT&T") moved to intervene in this case, stating, among other things, that it should be permitted to review confidential information relating to the tariff. AT&T also requests a hearing. However, it does not appear that a formal hearing is required to complete this inquiry. The filing of written comments should be sufficient. If AT&T believes otherwise, it may file for reconsideration of the issue after its receipt of BellSouth's responses to its data requests. To investigate this tariff fully, the Commission establishes the following procedural schedule:

## IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. Within 10 days of the date of this Order, the parties shall file comments regarding AT&T's request to review confidential information relating to this tariff, together with information regarding the parties' efforts, if any, to enter into a protective agreement.
- 2. Within 30 days of the date of this Order, AT&T shall file its data requests, if any, regarding this tariff.

3. Within 45 days of the date of this Order, responses to any data requests shall be submitted.

4. Any further written comments shall be submitted no later than 60 days from the date of this Order.

5. If the Commission receives no request for hearing within 60 days of the date of this Order, this matter shall be submitted to the Commission without a public hearing.
