<u>ORDER</u>

On September 30, 1997, Sprint Spectrum, on behalf of WirelessCo, L.P. ("WirelessCo") and SBA Towers Kentucky, Inc., filed an application seeking a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to build a wireless communications tower at 2275 North Broadway, Fayette County, Lexington, Kentucky.

After receiving protests regarding the proposed PCS site, WirelessCo asked that this case be held in abeyance. Finally, on June 22, 1999, WirelessCo proposed an alternative site, which the Commission docketed as Case No. 99-194-UAC.¹ On December 21, 1999, the Commission approved that alternate site.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that this proceeding is dismissed as moot
