O R D E R

On January 6, 2000, Muhlenberg County Water District No. 3 ("Muhlenberg") applied for authority to increase certain non-recurring charges and revise its multiple users on one meter policy. Muhlenberg has provided adequate evidence of the individual expenses incurred to provide the services associated with the proposed charges.

The Commission, having reviewed the record and being sufficiently advised, finds that:

1. The proposed charges are equal to the expenses incurred to provide the associated services.
2. The charges and policies set forth in the Appendix to this Order are fair, just, and reasonable and should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. The charges in the Appendix are approved for services rendered on and after March 1, 2000.
2. The proposed tariff sheets filed by Muhlenberg are approved as filed.

APPENDIX A

APPENDIX TO AN ORDER OF THE KENTUCKY PUBLIC SERVICE  
COMMISSION IN CASE NO. 2000-017 DATED JANUARY 28, 2000

The following rates, charges, and policies are prescribed for the customers in the area served by Muhlenberg County Water District No. 3. All other rates, charges, and policies not specifically mentioned herein shall remain the same as those in effect under authority of the Commission prior to the effective date of this Order.

Non-Recurring Charges

Special Charges:

Meter Moving Charge (with bore)	\$100.00
Meter Moving Charge (without bore)	50.00
Reconnect Service Charge	25.00
Connection Service Charge	25.00

Policy:

Multiple Users on one meter:

- (a) Each district meter is to serve only one residence or mobile home.
- (b) For existing customers, where two or more residences, apartment units, mobile homes, businesses, or family units residing in a duplex or other multi-unit premise, are served by a single meter, prior to March 1, 2000, they will be allowed to continue until such time as the Water District has PSC approval to direct otherwise. When the original property changes owners each residence will be required to purchase their own meter. Any multiple users after March 1, 2000, will be in violation of the tariff.
