## ORDER

On November 27, 2000, Robert L. Madison, a residential electric customer, filed a motion requesting full intervention. Louisville Gas and Electric Company ("LG&E") filed an objection to the intervention, claiming that Mr. Madison has no special interest in this proceeding, and that any interest he may have is adequately protected by other intervenors. Mr. Madison subsequently filed a reply asserting that his positions on issues do not always coincide with those of other intervenors and, therefore, he should be entitled to intervene on his own behalf.

Based on the motion and objection thereto, and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the Commission finds that as Mr. Madison is the only residential LG&E customer having requested intervention, his intervention is likely to present issues and develop facts that will assist the Commission in fully considering the matter without unduly complicating or disrupting the proceedings. While the objection of LG&E is hereby overruled, the Commission does so without prejudice to LG&E's right to file

subsequent objections should it believe that Mr. Madison is straying into matters that are not at issue or are otherwise not relevant to this proceeding.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. Full intervention is granted to Robert L. Madison and the objection of

LG&E is denied.

2. Robert L. Madison shall be entitled to the full rights of a party and shall be

served with the Commission's Orders and with filed testimony, exhibits, pleadings,

correspondence, and all other documents submitted by parties after the date of this

Order.

3. Should Robert L. Madison file documents of any kind with the Commission

in the course of these proceedings, he shall also serve a copy of said documents on all

other parties of record.
