## ORDER

On August 31, 1993, in Case No. 92-346, the Commission approved certain adjusted rates for The Union Light, Heat and Power Company ("ULH&P") and provided for their further adjustment on a quarterly basis in accordance with ULH&P's gas cost adjustment ("GCA") clause.

On June 29, 2001, ULH&P filed a request to shorten the notice period for this GCA from 30 to 20 days, pursuant to KRS 278.180. ULH&P states that good cause exists to shorten the notice period due to the January 30, 2001 Order in Administrative Case No. 384<sup>1</sup> and the subsequent informal conference held on February 22, 2001 to discuss issues related to the Order's requirement that ULH&P and Kentucky's other major local gas distribution companies make monthly GCA filings.

ULH&P also states that the additional time will allow it to compute its GCA in accordance with the January 30, 2001 Order in Administrative Case No. 384, and that moving the filing date closer to the proposed effective date of July 31, 2001 for the new

GCA amount, will enable it to more accurately calculate the expected gas cost to be

included in the GCA. ULH&P asks that it be permitted to file its new GCA on or before

July 11, 2001 for the new GCA rate to become effective on July 31, 2001.

After reviewing ULH&P's request and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the

Commission finds that:

1. ULH&P has shown good cause for its request to shorten the notice period

in this proceeding from 30 days to 20 days.

2. Shortening the notice period as requested will not disadvantage ULH&P's

customers as the July 31, 2001 effective date of the new GCA will be the same as if

ULH&P had made its GCA filing on July 1, 2001, with the normal 30-day notice required

by KRS 278.180.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. ULH&P's request to shorten the notice period for this GCA filing from

30 days to 20 days is granted.

2. ULH&P shall file its monthly GCA with the Commission, which includes a

new GCA rate to become effective July 31, 2001, on or before July 11, 2001.
