O R D E R

On March 29, 2001, the city of Lawrenceburg (“the City”) and Glenview, Inc. (“Glenview”) filed a joint application for Commission approval of the transfer of Glenview’s sewage system, facilities, and other property to the City, pursuant to KRS 278.020(4) and (5) and 807 KAR 5:001, Section 8. The Attorney General of Kentucky (“AG”) was granted intervention on April 9, 2001. None of the parties in this case requested a formal hearing.

Having considered the evidence of record and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the Commission finds that:

1. Glenview is a sewer treatment facility as defined in KRS 278.101(3)(f).
2. Glenview currently owns and operates a sewer treatment facility and system serving approximately 80 customers in Anderson County, Kentucky.
3. The City is a municipal corporation situated in Anderson County, Kentucky and presently owns and operates a sewer treatment facility serving more than 3,400 customers.

4. Glenview and the City have entered into a contract for the transfer of the utility facilities.

5. The City has sufficient certified wastewater treatment plant personnel to operate the Glenview sewer system.

6. The City has the financial, technical, and managerial abilities to provide reasonable utility service to the customers currently served by Glenview.

Glenview must file with the Commission any and all normal and usual utility reports that reflect its activities up to the date of actual transfer of its facilities and functions to the City.

Having considered the application and the evidence of record, and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the Commission HEREBY ORDERS that:

1. The proposed transfer is approved.
2. Until the actual date of transfer of the Glenview facilities and responsibilities for wastewater sewage treatment to the City, the Commission shall retain jurisdiction over Glenview.
3. Glenview shall file all normal and usual utility reports with the Commission reflecting its activity up to the date of transfer.
4. Glenview shall notify the Commission when the transfer has been completed.
5. After full compliance with this Order, Glenview is authorized to cease operations as a utility.
