<u>O R D E R</u>

On June 6, 2001, ACC of Kentucky, LLC and SBA Network Services, Inc. ("Applicants") filed an application seeking a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to construct and operate a wireless telecommunications facility. The proposed facility is to be located at 1117 Gaston Avenue, Columbia, Adair County, Kentucky. The coordinates for the proposed facility are North Latitude 37° 5′ 28.2" by West Longitude 85° 18′ 3.9".

The Applicants have provided information regarding the structure of the tower, safety measures, and antenna design criteria for the proposed facility. Based upon the application, the design of the tower and foundation conforms to applicable nationally recognized building standards, and a Licensed Professional Engineer has certified the plans.

Pursuant to KRS 100.987, the Applicants have submitted the uniform application to the local planning unit. To date, the local planning unit has filed no comments. The Applicants have filed applications with the Federal Aviation Administration ("FAA") and the

Kentucky Airport Zoning Commission ("KAZC") seeking approval for the construction and operation of the proposed facility. The FAA has approved the application, but the KAZC decision is pending.

The Applicants have filed evidence of the appropriate notices provided pursuant to 807 KAR 5:063. The notices solicited any comments and informed the recipients of their right to request intervention. On June 19, 2001, the Commission received a letter of concern to the placement of the tower from James D. Zornes. Mr. Zornes wrote the letter on behalf of six elderly residents who lived in the area near the proposed construction. Commission staff responded through a letter dated June 29, 2001, which provided a window of 10 days for a motion for intervention to be filed. However, no request for intervention was ever received.

Pursuant to KRS 278.280, the Commission is required to determine proper practices to be observed when it finds, upon complaint or on its own motion, that the facilities of any utility subject to its jurisdiction are unreasonable, unsafe, improper, or insufficient. To assist the Commission in its efforts to comply with this mandate, the Applicants should notify the Commission if they do not use this antenna tower to provide service in the manner set out in their application and this Order. Upon receipt of such notice, the Commission may, on its own motion, institute proceedings to consider the proper practices, including removal of the unused antenna tower, which should be observed by the Applicants.

The Commission, having considered the evidence of record and being otherwise sufficiently advised, finds that the Applicants have demonstrated that a facility is necessary

to provide adequate utility service and therefore should be granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to construct the proposed facility.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. The Applicants are granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to construct a wireless telecommunications facility. The proposed facility is to be located at 1117 Gaston Avenue, Columbia, Adair County, Kentucky. The coordinates for the proposed facility are North Latitude 37° 5′ 28.2″ by West Longitude 85° 18′ 3.9″.

2. The Applicants shall file a copy of the final decisions regarding their pending KAZC application for the proposed construction within 10 days of receiving this decision.

3. The Applicants shall immediately notify the Commission in writing if, after the antenna tower is built and utility service is commenced, the tower is not used for a period of 3 months in the manner authorized by this Order.
