## COMMISSION STAFF S FIRST SET OF INTERROGATORIES AND REQUESTS FOR PRODUCTION OF DOCUMENTS TO BOONE COUNTY WATER DISTRICT

Pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Commission Staff requests that Boone County Water District (Boone) file the original and 8 copies of the following information with the Commission no later than February 14, 2003 with a copy to all parties of record. When a number of sheets are required for an item, each sheet should be appropriately indexed, for example, Item 1(a), Sheet 2 of 6. Include with each response the name of the witness who will be responsible for responding to questions relating to the information provided. Careful attention should be given to copied material to ensure its legibility. When the requested information has been previously provided in this proceeding in the requested format, reference may be made to the specific location of that information in responding to this request.

1. In Case No. 2000-00206,<sup>1</sup> Boone projected the rate to be paid for wholesale water from the Boone-Florence Water Commission (BFWC) to begin at

\$2.13 per 1,000 gallons and decline to \$1.88 per 1,000 gallons over a 26-year period.<sup>2</sup>

In this application the actual rate being charged to Boone by BFWC is \$2.65 per 1,000

gallons. Provide a detailed explanation of the difference between the anticipated rate of

\$2.13 per 1,000 gallons and the actual rate of \$2.65 per 1,000 gallons. The response

shall include, but not be limited to, an explanation of how the \$2.65 rate was

determined, the assumptions used to determine the projected rates of BFWC in Case

No. 2000-00206, and why the rate of \$2.65 is significantly higher than projected in Case

No. 2000-00206.
