## <u>ORDER</u>

On December 16, 2002, Meade County Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation (Meade RECC) submitted an application to the Commission requesting authority to adjust its rates. In its application, Meade RECC requests permission to deviate from the requirements of 807 KAR 5:001, Section 10(6)(s).

807 KAR 5:001, Section 10(6)(s), requires the submission of the applicant's Securities and Exchange Commission's annual report for the most recent 2 years, Form 10-Ks and any Form 8-Ks issued within the past 2 years, and Form 10-Qs issued during the past six quarters updated as current information becomes available. Meade RECC states in support of its request that it is not subject to SEC regulation. Meade RECC also states that the filing requirements of 807 KAR 5:001, Sections 10(6)(f) and (v) regarding local exchange carriers and Section 10(7)(c) regarding proposed pro forma adjustments reflecting plant additions are not applicable to it.

The Commission, having reviewed the filing and being otherwise sufficiently advised, finds that good cause has been shown to grant Meade RECC a deviation from the requirements of 807 KAR 5:001, Section 10(6)(s) and Section 10(7)(c). The Commission finds no deviation is required from the filing requirements of 807 KAR 5:001, Section 10(6)(f) and (v) since the filing requirements imposed by these sections

of the regulation are for local exchange carriers only. The Commission further finds that the application contains filing deficiencies and that the application cannot be considered filed until all deficiencies are cured.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. Meade RECC is granted permission to deviate from the filing requirements of 807 KAR 5:001, Sections 10(6)(s) and 10(7)(c).

2. Meade RECC's application shall not be considered filed until all filing deficiencies are cured.
