O R D E R

On December 22, 2004, the Commission established a procedural schedule to consider the petition filed by BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. ("BellSouth") regarding amendments to interconnection agreements resulting from the change of law entitled Kentucky Broadband Act, KRS 278.546, 278.5461, and 278.5462. Cinergy Communications Company ("Cinergy"), SouthEast Telephone, Inc., and Aero Communications, LLC have requested a brief extension. BellSouth has no objection to the extension, but asks that the informal conference be canceled and this matter be submitted to the Commission through the filing of legal briefs. Cinergy, on the other hand, has raised additional issues which appear appropriate to address in an informal conference. BellSouth also has submitted dates upon which its representatives would be available to participate in an informal conference.

The Commission, having considered the filings of BellSouth and Cinergy and having been otherwise sufficiently advised, finds that the procedural schedule should be modified as follows:

1. By no later than January 27, 2005, the CLECs named by BellSouth in its petition shall submit their comments in writing.

2. The informal conference shall be rescheduled to February 24, 2005, beginning at 10:00 a.m., Eastern Standard Time, in the Commission's offices. The purpose of the informal conference will be to discuss BellSouth's petition, BellSouth's January 11, 2005 letter, Cinergy's January 20, 2005 letter, and the CLECs' comments.

BE IT SO ORDERED.
