In this case, the consideration was money exchanged between Shirley Jackson & Dialog; in which Dialog has electronically drafted full payment from Mrs. Jackson's checking account. She has paid Dialog a total of \$5,004.66 since entering into a contract with Dialog on September 7, 2004.

③ The third element of a valid contract is competent parties. Mrs. Jackson is of sound mind and it can be assumed that Dialog Communications cannot claim to be an incompetent party.

④ The final element is legal purpose, which only means that no part of the contract can be against the law. It is legal in the state of Kentucky to procure telephone service from any Local Exchange Carrier of their choice.

In conclusion, if Dialog Communications does not intend to offer their customers UNLIMITED local and long distance calling, then the word Unlimited must not be used. Dialog should offer plans similar to Cellular Telephone companies in which plans are sold by the minutes, or place a limit and tell each customer what that limit will be.
