ORDER TO SATISFY OR ANSWER



On April 11, 2004 while I was cutting a limb of a fir tree (not a hardwood tree) the limb fell on the electric service entrance wires to my house. This limb did not break the wires but just the weight of the limb brought down the telephone pole. This pole would not have fallen if it had not been completely rotten at the base. The only thing holding this pole in place were the electric and telephone wires on either side. If the limb had been heavy it would have broken the service entrance wires instead of pulling the pole over. When the limb fell on the wire the pole was too rotten to stand. This limb of a fir tree was definitely not heavy enough to bring down a telephone pole, therefore, if this pole had not been rotten it would not have fallen requiring the time to make the repairs.

I requested Kentucky Utilities to examine the pole but they refused my request. I still have the pictures of the pole which I have already sent to the Public Service Commission and the rotten pole as proof.
