O R D E R

On June 1, 2005, St. Francis DeSales High School (“Complainant”) filed with the Commission a formal complaint against Louisville Gas and Electric Company (“LG&E”). Complainant alleged that it should not be responsible for the costs associated with the removal of a downed tree and the associated debris located on Complainant’s property. LG&E cut down Complainant’s tree because it presented a hazard to LG&E’s lines.

On June 3, 2005, the Commission ordered LG&E to satisfy or answer the matters in the complaint. On June 13, 2005, LG&E responded to the Commission’s Order, stating that it has made arrangements to remove the tree wood and debris during the week of June 13, 2005, and that it would pay all associated costs. In its response, LG&E requests that the Commission dismiss the complaint as satisfied and remove the case from the Commission’s docket.

The Commission finds that, prior to the dismissal of the complaint, Complainant should be afforded an opportunity to respond to LG&E’s Notice of Satisfaction. If no

response is received within 20 days of the date of this Order, the Commission finds that the complaint has been satisfied and that this case should be dismissed and removed from the Commission's active docket.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. If it wishes to comment on whether LG&E has satisfied the complaint, Complainant may file, within 20 days of the date of this Order, a response to LG&E's Notice of Satisfaction and state therein the specific grounds for its allegation.

2. If Complainant does not file a response to LG&E's Notice of Satisfaction within 20 days of the date of this Order, this complaint shall be dismissed as satisfied and shall be removed from the Commission's docket.
