## <u>O R D E R</u>

On November 23, 2005, the Commission initiated this proceeding to investigate Edmonson County Water District's ("Edmonson District") proposed rules and regulations for the provision of sewer service.<sup>1</sup> The Commission had previously granted Edmonson District a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to construct a wastewater collection system and established the rates for such service.<sup>2</sup> Edmonson District's proposed rules and regulations would govern the provision of such service.

Following the establishment of this proceeding, Commission Staff held two conferences with the parties to discuss possible revisions to the proposed rules and regulations to ensure their compliance with Commission regulations.<sup>3</sup> On March 24,

2006, Edmonson District submitted to the Commission a revised version of its proposed rules and regulations that addressed the concerns of Commission Staff and the parties.

Based upon our review of the revised rules and regulations, we find that these rules and regulations are reasonable and are consistent with the provisions of KRS Chapter 278 and the Commission's administrative regulations. We further find that these rules and regulations should be permitted to become effective for sewer service provided on and after the date of this Order.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. Edmonson District's proposed rules and regulations for sewer service, as submitted to the Commission on March 24, 2006, are approved for service rendered on and after the date of this order.

2. Edmonson District shall file with the Commission within 20 days of the date of this Order the approved rules and regulations in the form that Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:006, Section 3, requires and bearing the signature of an officer of Edmonson District who is authorized to issue tariffs.
