SECOND DATA REQUEST OF COMMISSION STAFF

Big Rivers Electric Corporation ("Big Rivers"), Duke Energy - Kentucky ("Duke - KY"), East Kentucky Power Cooperative, Inc. ("EKPC"), Kentucky Power Company ("Kentucky Power"), Kentucky Utilities Company, ("KU"), and Louisville Gas and Electric Company ("LG&E"), pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, are to file with the Commission the original and seven copies of the following information, with a copy to all parties of record. The information requested herein is due on or before December 22, 2008. Responses to requests for information shall be appropriately bound, tabbed and indexed. Each response shall include the name of the witness responsible for responding to the questions related to the information provided.

Each response shall be answered under oath or, for representatives of a public or private corporation or a partnership or association or a governmental agency, be accompanied by a signed certification of the preparer or person supervising the preparation of the response on behalf of the entity that the response is true and accurate to the best of that person's knowledge, information, and belief formed after a reasonable inquiry.

Big Rivers, Duke - KY, EKPC, Kentucky Power, KU and LG&E shall make timely amendment to any prior responses if they obtain information which indicates that the response was incorrect when made or, though correct when made, is now incorrect in any material respect. For any requests to which Big Rivers, Duke - KY, EKPC, Kentucky Power, KU and LG&E fail or refuse to furnish all or part of the requested information, Big Rivers, Duke - KY, EKPC, Kentucky Power, KU and LG&E shall provide a written explanation of the specific grounds for failure to completely and precisely respond.

Careful attention should be given to copied material to ensure that it is legible. When the requested information has been previously provided in this proceeding in the requested format, reference may be made to the specific location of that information in responding to this request. When applicable, the requested information shall be separately provided for total company operations and jurisdictional operations.

The following questions relate to Kentucky's 7-Point Strategy for Energy Independence ("7-Point Strategy) presented to Governor Beshear by the Energy and Environment Cabinet ("EEC") on November 20, 2008. - a. the near-term (1-3 years);
