## ORDER

Ledbetter Water District ("Ledbetter District"), a water district that owns and operates facilities that distribute water to approximately 1,221 customers in Livingston County, Kentucky, 1 is a utility subject to Commission jurisdiction. 2

A five-member board of commissioners controls and manages the affairs of Ledbetter District.<sup>3</sup> William Phillip Dae, Kevin Bailey, Terry Teitloff, Arnie Puckett, and Bill Gillahan have served as members of Ledbetter District's Board of Commissioners since on or after March 31, 2004.

KRS 278.015 provides that, when a wholesale supplier selling water to a water district increases its rates, the water district may increase its rates commensurate with the wholesale supplier without the prior approval of the Commission. It further provides

that, within 20 days after any such increase in rates, the water district must file its revised tariffs with the Commission, "together with a copy of the notice from its wholesale supplier showing the increase in the rate charged to the utility, and a statement of the volume of purchased water used or sewage treated to calculate the increase in rates."

KRS 278.160(1) provides that "[n]o utility shall charge, demand, collect, or receive from any person a greater or less compensation for any service rendered or to be rendered than that prescribed in its filed schedules . . . ."

On November 21, 2008, Ledbetter District advised the Commission in writing<sup>4</sup> that it had increased its general rates for service in 2004 as a result of an increase in its wholesale supplier's wholesale rate. In its letter, a copy of which is appended hereto, Ledbetter District stated that, after receiving assistance from Commission Staff in the preparation of an application for a purchased water adjustment, it submitted its application to the Commission together with an application for an adjustment in certain nonrecurring charges. In its letter, Ledbetter District also provided evidence of publication of notice of the purchased water adjustment application.

Ledbetter District requests that the Commission "review all files and records in this case to determine whether the District was deficient in filing the application for the Purchased Water Adjustment and, if so, to determine the extent of the deficiency." It further requests that the Commission "rule on the legitimacy of the Purchased Water

Adjustment that was enacted, and the resulting rates that the District has charged subsequent to the enactment of the PWA [purchased water adjustment] in 2004."

Commission records indicate that the Commission received the water district's application for adjustment of certain nonrecurring charges on March 26, 2004 and approved the proposed revisions. They do not, however, indicate that the Commission received any application for a purchased water adjustment or adjusted Ledbetter District's general rates for water service. The general rates that Ledbetter District placed into effect in 2004 and is currently charging differ from those that the Commission had previously approved and are currently on file with the Commission.

Based upon the above, the Commission finds the existence of *prima facie* evidence that Ledbetter District has failed to comply with KRS 278.015 and KRS 278.160 and that the members of Ledbetter District's Board of Commissioners have aided and abetted this failure. The Commission finds that a proceeding should be established to investigate Ledbetter District's actions and the lawfulness of the rates that Ledbetter District has assessed since on or about March 31, 2004.

No. 2003-00237, Application of Ledbetter Water District for an Adjustment of Rates Pursuant to the Alternative Rate Filing Procedure for Small Utilities (Ky. PSC Sep. 16, 2003). In addition to the adjustments to its meter connection charge and leak adjustment rate, which the Commission approved in Case No. 2004-00107, the Commission approved a second adjustment of Ledbetter District's meter connection charges in 2007. See Case No. 2004-00107, The Application of Ledbetter Water District to Increase Certain Non-Recurring Charges (Ky. PSC April 23, 2004); Case No. 2007-00324, Application of Ledbetter Water District for Authority to Revise Certain Non-Recurring Charges (Ky. PSC Sep. 6, 2007).

The Commission, on its own motion, HEREBY ORDERS that:

- 1. Ledbetter District shall appear before the Commission on March 18, 2009 at 1:30 p.m., Eastern Daylight Time, in Hearing Room 2 of the Commission's offices at 211 Sower Boulevard, Frankfort, Kentucky, for the purposes of presenting evidence concerning the alleged violations of KRS 278.015 and KRS 278.160 and showing cause why it should not be subject to the penalties prescribed in KRS 278.990 for these alleged violations.
- 2. William Phillip Dae, Kevin Bailey, Terry Teitloff, Arnie Puckett, and Bill Gillahan shall also appear before the Commission on March 18, 2009 at 1:30 p.m., Eastern Daylight Time, in Hearing Room 2 of the Commission's offices at 211 Sower Boulevard, Frankfort, Kentucky, for the purposes of presenting evidence concerning the allegations that they aided and abetted Ledbetter District's violation of KRS 278.015 and KRS 278.160 and showing cause why each should not be subject to the penalties prescribed in KRS 278.990 for the alleged violations.
- 3. A telephone conference shall be held on March 4, 2009 at 10:00 a.m., Eastern Standard Time, with Ledbetter District and its officers and Commission Staff to consider any matter that would aid in the handling or disposition of this proceeding. Parties may access this conference call by telephoning (502) 564-3940 and requesting connection to Conference Bridge 7099. Ledbetter District shall have such officers and employees participate who are knowledgeable concerning the issues.
- 4. Corporate entities are advised that, under Kentucky law, a corporation, its employees, and any representative not licensed to practice law in Kentucky are not

permitted to make objections or examine or cross-examine witnesses in administrative hearings.<sup>8</sup>

5. Within 20 days of the date of this Order, Ledbetter District, William Phillip Dae, Kevin Bailey, Terry Teitloff, Arnie Puckett, and Bill Gillahan shall each file a written response to the Commission concerning the allegations contained herein.
