ORDER REGARDING REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIAL TREATMENT

On August 22, 2014, Louisville Gas and Electric Company and Kentucky Utilities Company ("LG&E and KU") jointly moved pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 13, that certain materials filed with the Commission be afforded confidential treatment and not be placed in the public record subject to public inspection for five years.

In support of their Joint Petition for Confidential Treatment, LG&E and KU state that the information they are requesting to be held confidential is contained in David Sinclair's August 22, 2014 Supplemental Testimony and Exhibit DSS-3. The information is more particularly described as present value revenue requirement calculations that are based in part on the companies' ability to market renewable energy certificates ("REC") in the REC marketplace.

Having carefully considered the petition and the materials at issue, the Commission finds that:

- 1. The materials for which LG&E and KU seek confidential treatment meet the criteria for confidential treatment and are exempted from public disclosure pursuant to KRS 61.878(1)(c)(1) and 807 KAR 5:001, Section 13.
- 2. The materials for which LG&E and KU seeks confidential treatment should not be placed in the public record or made available for public inspection for a five-year period from the date of this Order, or until further Orders of this Commission.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- LG&E and KU's Joint Petition for Confidential Treatment is hereby granted.
- 2. The materials for which LG&E and KU seeks confidential treatment shall not be placed in the public record or made available for public inspection for a five-year period from the date of this Order, or until further Orders of this Commission.
- 3. Use of the materials in question in any Commission proceeding shall be in compliance with 807 KAR 5:001, Section 13(9).
- 4. LG&E and KU shall inform the Commission if the materials in question become publicly available or no longer qualify for confidential treatment.
- 5. If a non-party to this proceeding requests to inspect materials granted confidential treatment by this Order and the period during which the materials have been granted confidential treatment has not run, then LG&E and KU shall have 20 days from receipt of written notice of the request to demonstrate that the materials still fall within the exclusions from disclosure requirements established in KRS 61.878. If LG&E and KU are unable to make such demonstration, the requested materials shall be made

available for inspection. Otherwise, the Commission shall deny the request for inspection.

6. The Commission shall not make the requested materials available for inspection for 20 days following an Order finding that the materials no longer qualify for confidential treatment in order to allow LG&E and KU to seek a remedy afforded by law.
