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ORDER

This matter arises upon several pending motions. The motions are: (1) the joint motion of Louisville Gas and Electric Company and Kentucky Utilities Company ("LG&E/KU"), filed on April 28, 2014, requesting a two-day extension in which to file their response to Commission Staff's Third Request for Information; (2) the joint motion of LG&E/KU, filed on May 7, 2014, requesting leave to file rebuttal testimony and for an extension of time to request an evidentiary hearing; and (3) the motion of Wal-Mart Stores East, LP and Sam's East, Inc. (collectively "Wal-Mart"), filed on May 23, 2014, for leave to file supplemental direct testimony.¹ The Commission will address each in turn.

LG&E/KU, in support of their motion for a two-day extension in which to file their response to Commission Staff's Third Request for Information, state that they required two additional days to complete and prepare the requested information due to the press of business and the amount of work necessary to complete and prepare the requested

information. LG&E/KU state that filing the information on April 30, 2014, rather than on April 28, 2014, the original filing date, will not prejudice any party to the proceeding. There are no objections to this motion.

LG&E/KU, in support of their motion requesting leave to file rebuttal testimony and for an extension of time to request an evidentiary hearing, request that they be allowed to file rebuttal testimony on June 10, 2014, in response to testimony submitted by witnesses for several intervenors. LG&E/KU also state that because discovery requests to intervenors were due on May 27, 2014, due process requires that LG&E/KU be permitted to offer commentary in their rebuttal testimony, just as the intervenors were able to offer testimony on LG&E/KU's discovery responses. LG&E/KU state that allowing rebuttal testimony will not prejudice the investigation of the current procedural schedule, and they also request that the date by which to request an evidentiary hearing be moved from June 2, 2014, to June 16, 2014.

On May 12, 2014, Wallace McMullen and Sierra Club (collectively "Sierra Club") filed a response to LG&E/KU's motion requesting leave to file rebuttal testimony and for an extension of time to request an evidentiary hearing. Sierra Club stated that it had no objection to LG&E/KU's motion, but requests that if LG&E/KU is granted leave to file rebuttal testimony, the deadline for requesting an evidentiary hearing be extended as well.

Wal-Mart, in support of its motion to file supplemental direct testimony, states that subsequent to the filing of the written direct testimony of Kenneth E. Baker, Wal-Mart became aware of information relevant to Wal-Mart's participation in demand

response programs that LG&E/KU offer. Wal-Mart states that it is appropriate to clarify the testimony in that narrow regard. Wal-Mart also states that it does not object to LG&E/KU's motion to file rebuttal testimony. There are no objections to this motion.

Based on the foregoing, the Commission finds that the three motions discussed above should be granted, except to the extent that the dates for deadlines requested shall allow for sufficient time to prepare the filing.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- LG&E/KU's motion for an extension of time to file their responses to Commission Staff's Third Request for Information is granted.
- 2. LG&E/KU's responses to Commission Staff's Third Request for Information are accepted for filing on April 30, 2014.
- 3. LG&E/KU's motion for leave to file rebuttal testimony and for an extension of time to request an evidentiary hearing is granted.
 - 4. LG&E/KU shall file rebuttal testimony no later than June 17, 2014.
- 5. Wal-Mart's motion for leave to file supplemental direct testimony is granted.
- 6. Wal-Mart may file supplemental direct testimony no later than June 12, 2014.

7. Parties shall file a request for an evidentiary hearing no later than June 23,

2014.
