Based on a review of the allegations set forth in the complaint relating to the demand charge being billed to the complainants, the Commission is unable to conclusively determine whether the complaint establishes a *prima facie* case. However, the Commission notes the rate issues raised in the complaint have previously been set forth in letters that were filed as public comments in Case No. 2014-00371,¹ and that the filing of an answer by KU addressing the merits of the rate issue will assist in our investigation of this complaint.

PARTIES

JURISDICTION/VENUE

4. Jurisdiction and venue is appropriate in the Public Service Commission inasmuch as the matters concerned and/or alleged herein fall within the purview of the Public Service Commission, as granted under statute and/or regulation.

FACTS

Plaintiffs, and each of them, are engaged in farming operations, including the grain drying operations..

- 6. Plaintiffs, in expanding their farming operations, have gone to great lengths in constructing grain bins, as well as establishing a grain drying system for their respective farming operations.
- 7. Plaintiffs, and each of them, expended substantial sums of money with Defendant, KU, for purposes of running electrical services to Plaintiffs' respective properties to enable for the grain bin drying operations to take place.
 - 8. Plaintiffs, and each of them, paid for these expenses.
- 9. The respective grain drying operations are seasonal in nature and each of the Plaintiffs operate the grain bin drying equipment on a two to three month basis.
- 10. Defendant, in calculating their utility services, charged the Plaintiffs a demand rate that includes a 50 percent minimum, and what would appear to be a charge for recovering of installation costs.
- 11. The demand rate, whether in whole or in part, is believed to be calculated premised on the fact that Defendant is recovering the costs of the initial installation of the power and/or utilities to the property of Plaintiffs.

demand rate equates to a sum substantially greater over the course of the year than the utilities that are actually used if paid for directly; therefore, resulting in a windfall for Defendant and/or otherwise unjustly enriching

WHEREFORE, Plaintiffs, and each of them, request that the Public Service Commission enter an Order requiring Defendant to refund to Plaintiffs, with interest, those monies unjustly received since the installation of the utility services paid for by Plaintiffs, and any other monies that the Public Service Commission deems appropriate under the circumstances on utility charges that exceed the actual cost of the production of the utilities over the course of the year or billing cycle; attorney fees, if authorized; and any and all other relief to which the Plaintiffs may be entitled.

PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

I'm writing this letter to suggest a need for a new rate to deal with Agriculture and Rural Churches and other buildings in Rural areas. My family built a new Grain Facility in 2014, KU put us on a Demand Meter, which we were told that this would be the best rate for us. When we started using the facility the bill was comparable to our other facilities that are on Kenergy. What we didn't know was what the bill would be in the off season. Since we hit a \$5,000 Demand in season we are billed 50% of that for the next 11 months, where Kenergy resets their Demand each month. KU tells me to have my meter turn on/off 2-3 times a year to help manage my bill or to install more meters to help stay under their demand, which would be 4 more at this point and \$25,000 for me to rewire. Did I mention I paid \$22,500 for them to build a new service to my lot so KU could get my service, because my lot fell in KU territory. Long story short I have used my facility 2 months out of the last 5 and have an average electric bill of \$3200 a month. YOU ask why only have I used it 2 months? A Grain Facility on a farm is only used to dry grain during the harvest of that year. The rest of the time it sets empty or grain stored until I sell it and grain has to be aired ever so often to keep it from ruining until it is sold, which makes it hard to turn my meter on an off through the year because who knows exactly what the grain market is going to do. Any other farm in my area that has a Grain Facility on KU was grandfathered in when this took place in 2009. Being in a rural area it has taken this long for this problem to surface. KU usage only rate is \$.09225 and I have paid them \$16,284.49 for 78,600KWH which is a \$.20 KWH rate. If we take the taxes and other charges off I have paid them \$13,327.49 for 78,600 KWH and that comes to a \$.16 KWH rate. This is almost double of their GS rate as they call it. Since I have been dealing with this it has come to my attention that the new Church my Community is building, which I set on the Board, is on the same Demand meter. Last month bill was \$931 for 800 KWH which is a \$1.16 KWH rate. They have agreed to return us to a GS rate until construction is complete, but this issue will come up again. Also Hendrickson Farms is a neighbor that built a new Grain Facility in 2014. They are facing the same thing. Also our county fairgrounds with the John Arnold Arena are facing this to due to only booking events a few months out of the year. This is why I think KU needs to introduce some kind of seasonal or agricultural rate or be able to be put on a usage only rate, if that be the case I still would have paid them over \$7,200 for my 78,600 KWH. This is a serious issue, it will continue to come up more as years go on. I have included my bills for you to see and one from the church which they have agreed to change for now. As for my grain facility I plan to turn it off when I empty it until this is figured out. Please fill free to contact me for anything, there is a lot more to this, this is just the highlights.

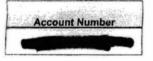

Please be advised that Womack Law Office, LLC, represents the interest of David Shouse, d/b/a David Shouse Farms, concerning Kentucky Utilities Case No. 2014-00371, and the circumstances under which he is currently paying an inordinate amount of fees to the KU facility, the direct and proximate result of his being charged a demand fee that is most unreasonable when compared to the seasonal nature of his business.

It is understood and appreciated the necessity for certain demand charges; however, the seasonal work, i.e., farming, and the utilities associated with farming that are operated on a very limited seasonal basis enable KU to realize a windfall situation with respect to the customer that is, as a practical legal term, unjust enrichment, concerning the electrical charges made against Mr. Shouse.

In order to substantiate or validate the need or necessity for demand charges, there must be some substantial likelihood that the demand will be exercised by the customer. In the circumstances of David Shouse Farms, that demand or the demand charges is not realistic with the nature of the business in which Shouse Farms is involved, which is seasonal. It is understood that demand charges could be based on

the highest level of usage during a period, but that period of usage or standard continues for other customers throughout the course of the year and does not for the Shouse Farms.

It should be noted that Shouse Farms went to great expense to have the utilities run to its particular facility and the application of the demand charge against the customer throughout the course of the entire year cannot be justified, nor would it pass, in our opinion, legal muster. KU did not pay anything in the running of the line to our client's farming operation. That undertaking was paid for by Shouse Farms. As a direct result, the demand charge would be collecting something other than any fixed charge that would exist with respect to this particular customer because Shouse Farms paid for running of the service to its property. This is tantamount to gouging.

For these reasons, we respectfully request you reconsider Mr. David Shouse's request for an adjustment; otherwise, we intend to seek legal redress.
