#### ORDER

On February 8, 2017, West McCracken Water District ("West McCracken") submitted an application for authority to revise its meter connection charge through the Commission's tariff filing system. Finding that further proceedings were necessary to determine the reasonableness of the proposed increase, the Commission issued an Order on March 8, 2017, suspending the proposed charge from March 10, 2017, up to and including August 9, 2017. On April 11, 2017, Commission Staff's First Request for Information ("Staff's First Request") was filed into the record, with responses due by April 28, 2017. On April 27, 2017, West McCracken filed responses to Staff's First Request. On June 1, 2017, Commission Staff's Second Request for Information ("Staff's Second Request") was filed into the record, with responses due by June 15, 2017. On June 15, 2017, West McCracken filed responses to Staff's Second Request. West McCracken did not request an informal conference or a hearing. No party requested intervention into this proceeding.

West McCracken proposed to use the estimated length of 70 feet for road boring in its long-side service calculation at a cost of \$12 per foot. West McCracken contracts

with a local contractor, D.W. Excavating, to perform meter installations. Responding to Staff's First Request, West McCracken supported the estimated 70-foot length with invoices from recent long-side service installations.<sup>2</sup> When West McCracken last increased its meter connection charge in PSC Case Number 2006-00542,<sup>3</sup> 50 feet was the length used for road boring expense in the long-side service calculation.

For the period January 1, 2007, through December 31, 2016, West McCracken installed 184 service connections.<sup>4</sup> All 184 service connections installed during this period were made on two-lane state or county roads.<sup>5</sup> Therefore, all residential service connections installed during this period were made on two-lane state or county roads.

Keith Murt of Murtco Inc. provided a price quote to West McCracken for meter sets and directional boring. The estimated length for directional boring in the quote was 50 feet, and the supporting comments for this length stated that the average road bore would be between 40 feet and 50 feet for a standard two-lane county road.<sup>6</sup> West McCracken provided no compelling evidence demonstrating a change in the rural nature of the system that would support the use of 70 feet for a road bore in its calculation.

The Commission, having reviewed the record and being sufficiently advised, finds that:

- West McCracken has not provided adequate evidence of the proposed road-boring expense incurred to provide the services associated with the proposed meter connection charge.
- 2. The length of 50 feet for directional road boring should be used in the calculation for long-side service. The resulting calculations reduce the proposed average installation labor expense by \$120.7
- The proposed meter connection charge is not supported by the expenses incurred to provide the associated services and should be denied.
- 4. The charges set forth in the Appendix to this Order are fair, just, and reasonable, and should be approved.

#### IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- West McCracken's proposed meter connection charge is denied.
- The charges in the Appendix are approved for services rendered on and after the date of this Order.
- Within 20 days of the date of this Order, West McCracken shall file with the Commission, using the Commission's electronic Tariff Filing System, revised tariff sheets showing the rates approved herein.
