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On September 22, 2021, Big Rivers Electric Corporation (BREC) filed a motion, pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 13, and KRS 61.878, requesting that the Commission grant confidential treatment indefinitely for Exhibit F and Exhibit G attached to its application filed in this proceeding.

In support of its motion, BREC states that Exhibit F contains detailed drawings of an existing transmission facility and proposed changes to that facility, and that Exhibit G contains detailed drawings and plans of a proposed transmission facility. BREC states that these documents are considered Critical Energy Infrastructure Information and as such are protected from public disclosure under KRS 61.878(1)(m)(1)(f).

Having considered the motion and the material at issue, the Commission finds that Exhibits F and G contain Critical Energy Infrastructure Information and that their disclosure would have a reasonable likelihood of threatening public safety. Therefore, these exhibits meet the criteria for confidential treatment and are exempted from public disclosure pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 13, and KRS 61.878(1)(m)(1)(f). IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. BREC's motion for confidential treatment is granted.

2. The designated material granted confidential treatment by this Order shall not be placed in the public record or made available for public inspection for an indefinite period or until further Order of this Commission.

3. Use of the designated material granted confidential treatment by this Order in any Commission proceeding shall comply with 807 KAR 5:001, Section 13(9).

4. BREC shall inform the Commission if the designated material granted confidential treatment by this Order becomes publicly available or no longer qualifies for confidential treatment.

5. If a nonparty to this proceeding requests to inspect the material granted confidential treatment by this Order and the period during which the material has been granted confidential treatment has not expired, BREC shall have 30 days from receipt of written notice of the request to demonstrate that the material still falls within the exclusions from disclosure requirements established in KRS 61.878. If BREC is unable to make such demonstration, the requested material shall be made available for inspection. Otherwise, the Commission shall deny the request for inspection.

6. The Commission shall not make the requested material available for inspection for 30 days from the date of service of an Order finding that the material no longer qualifies for confidential treatment in order to allow BREC to seek a remedy afforded by law.
