## <u>ORDER</u>

On April 8, 2022, Green-Taylor Water District (Green-Taylor District) applied for approval to adjust its rates pursuant to the purchased water adjustment procedure set forth in KRS 278.015 and 807 KAR 5:068.

# LEGAL STANDARD

In accordance with KRS 278.015, when a wholesale supplier selling water to a water district increases its rates, the water district has the authority to increase its rates commensurate with the wholesale supplier. The water district must file a copy of the notice from the wholesale supplier showing the increase in the wholesale rate, and a statement of the volume of purchased water used to calculate the rate adjustment. The Commission shall approve the filing by order after the above documents are filed.

## <u>DISCUSSION</u>

#### Unaccounted-for Water

Commission regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 6(3), states that for ratemaking purposes a utility's unaccounted-for water loss shall not exceed 15 percent of the total water produced and purchased, excluding water consumed by a utility in its own operations. In its 2020 Annual Report filed with the Commission, Green-Taylor District

reported a water loss of 16.9464 percent.<sup>1</sup> Green-Taylor District's application provides updated purchase and sales information for a more current period than the 2020 Annual Report. Based upon the updated information in the application and the percentage of other water consumed by the utility in its 2020 Annual Report, Green-Taylor District's unaccounted-for water loss is 14.1788 percent for the updated period.<sup>2</sup> Green-Taylor District's total cost of water loss is \$122,132.10.<sup>3</sup>

#### Financial Condition and Rates

Based on a review of Commission records, Green-Taylor District has not sought a general base rate adjustment since February 2018. In Case No. 2021-00233, the Commission ordered Green-Taylor District to file an application for a traditional adjustment in rates or an alternative rate adjustment by August 13, 2022.<sup>4</sup>

Green-Taylor District received notification of a wholesale rate increase effective August 1, 2021, from Campbellsville Municipal Water on May 28, 2021.<sup>5</sup> Seven months passed after the increased rates became effective before Green-Taylor District filed the instant case to pass through the increase to its customers. Green-Taylor District has a

responsibility to use due diligence to ensure financial soundness and to file with the Commission in a timely manner. In Case No. 2019-00041<sup>6</sup> the Commission found that rural water utilities that fail to increase rates cannot maintain financial integrity over the long-term.<sup>7</sup>

In the final Order in Case No. 2019-00041, the Commission discussed the problems that can occur when utilities intentionally avoid a review of their financial records by relying solely on financing cases to increase rates.<sup>8</sup> A key recommendation from that proceeding was that water districts should monitor the sufficiency of their base rates closely and, in general, apply for base rate adjustments on a more frequent basis.<sup>9</sup>

As documented in annual and audit reports filed with the Commission, Green-Taylor District reported net operating losses for the past four years.<sup>10</sup> It is unclear to the Commission whether Green-Taylor District's base rates are sufficient subsequent to the rate increase authorized in Case No. 2018-00030 without a more detailed analysis of Green-Taylor District's finances than is available in the audit reports.

Due to Green-Taylor District's continued net operating losses into the calendar year 2020 the Commission finds that Green-Taylor District shall comply with the August 13, 2021 Order in Case No. 2021-00233 by filing, on or before August 13, 2022, an

application for a general base rate adjustment or an alternative rate adjustment to ensure that its revenue is sufficient to support adequate and reliable service. Any filing for a rate adjustment filed under KRS 278.023 does not relieve Green-Taylor District from this requirement.

## **FINDINGS**

Having reviewed the record and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the Commission finds that:

- 1. Green-Taylor District purchases water from Campbellsville Municipal Water (Campbellsville), Greensburg Water Works (Greensburg), Green River Valley Water District (Green River Valley District), and on an emergency basis from Adair County Water District (Adair District).
- 2. Campbellsville notified Green-Taylor District on May 28, 2021, that its wholesale rate would increase from \$2.20 per 1,000 gallons to \$2.38 per 1,000 gallons, effective August 1, 2021. Green-Taylor District proposes to increase the water rates to its customers effective May 1, 2022, to reflect the increased cost of purchased water from Campbellsville.
- 3. Green-Taylor District proposed a purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.09 per 1,000 gallons in its application.
- 4. During the 12 months ended February 28, 2022, Green-Taylor District purchased 137,162,000 gallons of water from Campbellsville, 199,171,000 gallons of water from Greensburg, and 37,355,000 gallons of water from Green River Valley District. During the same period, Green-Taylor District sold 295,680,758 gallons of water. The

increase in the cost of purchased water is \$24,689.16, resulting in a purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.09 per 1,000 gallons.

- 5. The purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.09 per 1,000 gallons, as calculated in Appendix A to this Order, is fair, just and reasonable and shall be approved, because the water adjustment factor is supported by evidence of the increase in rates from Green-Taylor District's wholesale water supplier and the volume of purchased water used to calculate the rates in accordance with KRS 278.015.
  - 6. Green-Taylor District's proposed rates are approved.
- 7. The rates as set forth in Appendix B to this Order are fair, just and reasonable and shall be approved for water service rendered by Green-Taylor District on and after May 1, 2022, because the rates are supported by evidence of the increase in rates from Green-Taylor District's wholesale water supplier and the volume of purchased water used to calculate the rates in accordance with KRS 278.015.
- 8. On or before August 13, 2022, Green-Taylor District shall file an application for a general rate adjustment pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 16, or an application for an alternative rate adjustment pursuant to 807 KAR 5:076.

#### IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. The purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.09 per 1,000 gallons is approved.
  - 2. The rates proposed by Green-Taylor District are approved.
- 3. The rates as set forth in Appendix B to this Order are approved for water service rendered by Green-Taylor District on and after May 1, 2022.

4. Within 20 days of the date of entry of this Order, Green-Taylor District shall file with the Commission, using the Commission's electronic Tariff Filing System, revised tariff sheets showing the rates approved herein.

5. On or before August 13, 2022, Green-Taylor District shall file an application for a general rate adjustment pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 16, or an application for an alternative rate adjustment pursuant to 807 KAR 5:076. Any filing for a rate adjustment filed under KRS 278.023 does not relieve Green-Taylor District from this requirement.

6. This case is closed and removed from the Commission's docket.
