# PSC Proc-1

# Rules of Procedure

# PSC: Proc-1-IX Application or Notice for Authority to Adjust Rates.

3. In order to comply with the regulations of the Federal Price Commission issued under the authority of the Economic Stabilization Act of 1970, all filings by a public utility involving a general increase in rates shall, during the continued effectiveness of such regulations, make a showing that the following conditions have been satisfied:

- (a) The increase is cost justified and does not reflect further inflationary expectations.
- (b) The increase is the …inimum required to assure continued, adequate and safe service or to provide for necessary expansion to meet future requirements.
- (c) The increase will ac.iev. the minimum rate of return needed to attract capital at reasonable costs and not to impair the credit of the public utility.
- (d) The increase does not reflect labor costs in excess of those allowed by policies of the Federal Price Commission.
- (e) The increase takes into account expected and obtainable productivity gains.
