Consistent with Appendix F of the Service Quality Measurements Plan adopted by this Commission on July 18, 2005, BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc., d/b/a AT&T Georgia ("AT&T Georgia") is filing a Proposed Notification Report for March 2007 data month. There are no changes to be placed on the Preliminary April 2007 Data Notification List. The March 2007 changes will be discussed at the February 7, 2007 industry conference call.

There is one additional matter that AT&T Georgia would like to bring to the attention of the Commission and the parties.


In its November 2006 Data Notification filed on September 27, 2006, AT&T Georgia provided notice that it would begin taking timestamps for Bulk LSRs from EDI or SGG instead of LNP Gateway. AT&T Georgia discovered a coding issue with the implementation of this item and corrected it with December data. This change has no adverse impact on CLEC results.

PROPOSED MARCH 2007 DATA NOTIFICATION

BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc., d/b/a AT&T Georgia (“AT&T Georgia”) is considering making the changes described in this document to generate results for the March 2007 data month. Results for the March 2007 data month will be posted as follows:

Preliminary results April 20, 2007
Final results May 2, 2007

AT&T Georgia provides Data Notifications each month in compliance with the SQM Plan. This order specifies that when AT&T Georgia proposes making any changes to the methods by which performance data is calculated, it must provide written notice. This notice must be provided on the first business day of the month before the data month in which the change will be made. AT&T Georgia must also provide notification if it is considering making changes to the method of calculating data for the following month.

ENCORE Releases may affect monthly data flows from the source systems (e.g., LEO, LESOG, etc.) that PMAP uses to calculate measurements. AT&T Georgia will make changes to PMAP to ensure that data continues to be correctly captured as ENCORE Releases are implemented.

Change Management Measurements

- (1) *Affected Measures:* CM-8 (CRR)

Description of Change: Currently, on the 12-month report, the results for each month are repeated multiple times. This situation also affects the formatting of the report when exported to Excel. AT&T Georgia proposes to modify PMAP to change how the report is displayed. This proposed change was Item (1) on the Preliminary March 2007 Data Notification filed on January 2, 2007. (RQ8735)

Impact of Change: There is no impact to the data. The report and chart will be formatted correctly. Due to the impact of this change, re-posting is not necessary.

Special Access Measurements

- (2) *Affected Measures:* SA-1 (FOCT) Georgia Only

Description of Change: Currently, the aggregate report in Georgia is reporting the incorrect denominator for BellSouth Long Distance, Inc., d/b/a AT&T Long Distance Service (“AT&T Long Distance”) and the IXC’s. The total for zero due dated orders are not being included in the overall volumes throughout each interval disaggregation. AT&T Georgia proposes to modify PMAP to include zero due date orders in the volumes. This proposed change was Item (2) on the Preliminary March 2007 Data Notification filed on January 2, 2007. (RQ8906)

Impact of Change: For October 2006, the product of DS3 Optical with a zero day interval changed for the IXC from 400% to 80% while the AT&T Long Distance metric remained at 0%. Due to the impact of this change, re-posting is not necessary.

(3) *Affected Measures:* SA-1 (FOCT)

Description of Change: Currently, PMAP is not reporting the correct denominator for some intervals on the IXC Specific Reports. This situation occurs when associated company keys are different from the parent company key and, therefore, are not rolled up to the parent company when calculating the volume for an interval. AT&T Georgia proposes to modify PMAP to include these orders in the calculation of the volume. This proposed change was Item (3) on the Preliminary March 2007 Data Notification filed on January 2, 2007. (RQ8907)

Impact of Change: For October 2006, the product of DS3 Non-Optical for an IXC metric would change from 63.64% to 58.33% for the zero due date interval. Due to the impact of this change, re-posting is not necessary.

(4) *Affected Measures:* P-1 (HOI), P-2A (PJ48), P-2B (PJ), P-3 (PMI), P-4 (OCI), P-5 (CNI) and P-9 (PPT)

Description of Change: Currently, PMAP captures new Retail ADSL with USOC codes ADL96 and ADL99 in the Retail Residence and Business (Dispatch) product group. AT&T Georgia proposes to modify its code to identify these products in the appropriate ADSL Provided to Retail product group.

Impact of Change: For December 2006 OCI in Florida, the metric for the Retail Analog product group Retail Residence and Business (Dispatch)/<6 circuits would increase from 3.46 to 3.50 days. For December 2006 OCI in Georgia, the metric for the Retail Analog product group Retail Residence and Business (Dispatch)/<6 circuits would increase from 3.96 to 4.05 days. Due to the impact of this change, re-posting is not necessary.

For December 2006 OCI in Florida, the metric for ADSL Provided to Retail (Dispatch)/<6 circuits would increase from 3.11 to 3.15 days. For December 2006 OCI in Georgia, the metric for ADSL Provided to Retail (Dispatch)/<6 circuits would increase from 2.97 to 3.06 days. Due to the impact of this change, re-posting is not necessary.
