

ORDER

By Order dated January 15, 1999, the Commission directed Louisville Gas and Electric Company ("LG&E") to appear at a hearing on February 24, 1999 to show cause why it should not be subject to the penalties provided for under KRS 278.990 for the probable violation of Commission Regulation 807 KAR 5:006, Section 26(1)(a), which requires a utility to notify the Commission within two hours following discovery of any utility-related accident which results in death or injury requiring medical treatment, and three probable violations of 807 KAR 5:041, Section 3(1), which requires utility facilities to be maintained in accordance with the National Electric Safety Code, 1990 Edition ("NESC"). The cited violations of the NESC include Section 42, Rule 420H, which requires utility employees to use the personal protective equipment and devices provided for their work; Section 42, Rule 421A, which requires the first level supervisor or person in charge to adopt such precautions as are within the individual's authority to prevent accidents and to see that the safety rules and operating procedures are observed by the employees under the direction of this individual; and Section 44, Rule 444D, which requires an employee working on de-energized circuits to immediately proceed to make the employee's own protective grounds or verify that adequate grounds have been applied on the disconnected lines or equipment.

The probable violations arose from a July 23, 1998 accident in Jefferson County, Kentucky, involving an LG&E employee, William E. Hundley. Mr. Hundley was working on an energized primary lead to a subgrade transformer when the lead arced to a metal protective grading. Mr. Hundley received a flash burn to his right arm and was hospitalized.

At LG&E's request, the hearing was held in abeyance and an informal conference was convened on March 10, 1999 to provide an opportunity to discuss the operative facts surrounding the accident. As a result of the discussions at the informal conference, LG&E and Staff entered into a Stipulation of Facts and Agreement ("Stipulation"), which was filed in the record on May 24, 1999. This Stipulation, attached hereto as Appendix A, provides that the facts as set forth in the Staff's Utility Accident Investigation Report, appended to the Commission's January 15, 1999 Order, accurately presents the facts relevant to this proceeding, discusses the changes in operating procedures initiated by LG&E when work is to be performed on subgrade transformers, and details the additional equipment and training provided to employees with respect to working on subgrade transformers. In addition, LG&E has agreed to pay a civil penalty in the amount of \$6,000 in full settlement of this proceeding.

In determining whether the results of the Stipulation are in the public interest and are reasonable, the Commission has taken into consideration the comprehensive nature of the Stipulation and LG&E's willingness to cooperate to achieve a speedy resolution of this case. Based on the evidence of record and being sufficiently advised, the

Commission hereby finds that the Stipulation is in accordance with the law and does not violate any regulatory principal. The Stipulation is the product of arms-length negotiations among capable, knowledgeable parties, is in the public interest, and results in a reasonable resolution of all issues in this case.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. The Stipulation is adopted and approved in its entirety as a complete resolution of all issues in this case.
- 2. LG&E shall pay \$6,000 as a civil penalty within 30 days of the date of this Order by certified check or money order made payable to the Kentucky State Treasurer and mailed or delivered to the Office of General Counsel, Public Service Commission, 730 Schenkel Lane, Frankfort, Kentucky.

STIPULATION OF FACTS AND AGREEMENT

By Order dated January 15, 1999, the Commission initiated this proceeding to determine whether Louisville Gas and Electric Company ("LG&E") should be subject to the penalties prescribed in KRS 278.990 for one violation of Commission Regulation 807 KAR 5:006, Section 26(1)(a), and three violations of 807 KAR 5:041, Section 3(1). The Order arose out of an accident that occurred on July 23, 1998 in Louisville, Kentucky, in which an LG&E employee was injured while working on an energized subgrade transformer. Pursuant to LG&E's request, an informal conference with Commission Staff was held at the Commission's offices on March 10, 1999.

LG&E and the Staff submit the following agreement for the Commission's consideration in rendering its decision in this proceeding:

1. LG&E agrees that the Staff's Utility Accident Investigation Report, appended to the Commission's Order dated January 15, 1999, accurately presents the facts relevant to this proceeding.

- 2. As a result of this accident, LG&E has changed the procedures which it utilizes when working on subgrade transformers. Rather than treating the equipment as energized, and taking the necessary precautions for working on energized equipment, the equipment will be de-energized and appropriate grounds installed before work is commenced. In addition, LGE has purchased and supplied its work crews with new meters designed to check subgrade transformers for voltage. Training on these new procedures and the use of the new metering equipment has been incorporated into the formal training for all linemen, and LG&E agrees to also provide this training on an annual basis.
- 3. LG&E agrees to pay a civil penalty in the amount of \$6,000 in full settlement of this proceeding. The \$6,000 penalty represents a negotiated amount based upon the following: 1) \$2,000 attributable to the probable violation of 807 KAR 5:006, Section 26(1)(a); 2) \$2,000 attributable to the probable violation of 807 KAR 5:041, Section 3(1), National Electric Safety Code, 1990 Edition ("NESC"), Section 42, Rule 420.H; 3) \$2,000 attributable to the probable violation of 807 KAR 5:041, Section 3(1), NESC Section 42, Rule 421.A; and no penalty for the alleged violation of 807 KAR 5:041, Section 3(1), NESC Section 44, Rule 444.D, due to the acknowledgement that the facilities were believed to be energized. Neither the payment of the civil penalty, nor any other agreement contained in this Stipulation of Facts and Agreement, is intended to constitute an admission by LG&E that it violated any of the Commission's regulations, nor shall it be used in any civil proceeding relating to this incident.
- 4. In the event that the Commission does not adopt this Stipulation of Facts and Agreement in its entirety, LG&E and Staff reserve their rights to withdraw therefrom

and require that a hearing be held on any and all issues involved herein, and that none of the provisions contained herein shall be binding upon the parties hereto or used as an admission by either party.

5. LG&E and Staff agree that the foregoing Stipulation of Facts and Agreement is reasonable, is in the public interest, and should be adopted in its entirety by the Commission. If so adopted by the Commission, LG&E agrees to waive its right to a hearing and no petition for rehearing or judicial appeal will be led.

ANSWER AND REQUEST FOR INFORMAL CONFERENCE

Louisville Gas and Electric Company ("LG&E") hereby submits its Answer to the Commission's Order dated January 15, 1999, in this case, and requests that the Commission schedule an informal conference between the Staff and LG&E.

ANSWER

- 1. LG&E admits those facts that appear in the body of the Commission's Order of January 15, 1999, and further admits those facts contained in the Utility Accident Investigation Report that is attached as an Appendix to that Order.
 - 2. For further answer, LG&E avers the following additional facts:
 - a. Mr. Hundley and the other LG&E employees on the crew incorrectly believed that they were working on de-energized conductors. Mr. Hundley incorrectly assessed the internal switching capabilities and the external indicators of the sub-grade transformer being removed and assumed that the transformer was fed from the opposite direction that it was actually being fed. Mr. Hundley pulled the "hot" elbow to the transformer, which he believed had de-energized the transformer. With

the help of a co-worker, Mr. Hundley put the elbows on stand-off bushings to further isolate the cables before proceeding with removal of the transformer. The crew had tested and isolated the load break elbows and believed that it was safe to perform the removal of the transformer without grounds. Mr. Hundley had worn appropriate personal protective equipment during the isolation and testing phases of the job.

b. Mr. Grismer was not Mr. Hundley's direct supervisor on the job in question. At the time of the accident Mr. Hundley was a line technician with twenty (20) years experience with underground electrical equipment.
Mr. Grismer was an overhead lead line technician and was the senior employee on the site; however, Mr. Hundley was leading a cross-training operation at the time of the accident.

REQUEST FOR INFORMAL CONFERENCE

LG&E requests, pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001 §4(4), that the Commission establish an informal conference between its Staff and LG&E for the purpose of discussing the Staff Utility Accident Investigation Report and exchanging information regarding the incident discussed in the Staff Report and the January 15, 1999 Order, and determining whether the case can be submitted to the Commission for resolution on stipulated facts. LG&E believes that an informal conference will save the time and resources of both the Staff and LG&E and will allow for a more efficient disposition of the proceeding.

WHEREFORE, Louisville Gas and Electric Company respectfully requests that the Commission schedule an informal conference in this case and for such other relief as may be proper.

<u>O R D E R</u>

Louisville Gas and Electric Company ("LG&E") is a Kentucky corporation engaged in the generation, transmission, and distribution of electricity to the public for compensation for lights, heat, power, and other uses and is a utility subject to Commission jurisdiction. KRS 278.010.

KRS 278.280(2) directs the Commission to prescribe rules and regulations for the performance of services by utilities. Pursuant to this statutory directive, the Commission promulgated 807 KAR 5:006, Section 26(1)(a), which requires utilities to notify the Commission within two hours following discovery of any utility-related accident which results in death or shock or burn requiring medical treatment at a hospital or similar medical facility. In addition, the Commission promulgated 807 KAR 5:041, Section 3(1), which requires the maintenance of utility facilities to be in accordance with the National Electric Safety Code, 1990 Edition ("NESC"). The NESC, Section 42, Rule 420H, requires utility employees to use the personal protective equipment and devices provided for their work; Section 42, Rule 421A, requires the first level supervisor or

person in charge to adopt such precautions as are within the individual's authority to prevent accidents and to see that the safety rules and operating procedures are observed by the employees under the direction of this individual; and Section 44, Rule 444D, which requires an employee working on a de-energized circuits to immediately proceed to make the employee's own protective grounds or verify that adequate grounds have been applied on the disconnected lines or equipment.

Commission staff submitted to the Commission a Utility Accident Investigation Report dated September 21, 1998, attached hereto as Appendix A, which alleges that on July 23, 1998 an LG&E employee, William E. Hundley, was working on an energized primary lead to a subgrade transformer when the lead arced to a metal protective grading. Mr. Hundley received a flash burn to his right arm and was hospitalized. One lead to the transformer had been disconnected but neither Mr. Hundley nor the foreman in charge at the job site, Mickey Grismer, were aware that there was a loop feed to the transformer. Protective grounds had not been installed and Mr. Hundley was not wearing rubber gloves or rubber sleeves. LG&E notified the Commission of the accident five days later, on July 28, 1998.

The Utility Accident Investigation Report notes four probable violations of Commission regulations: 1) 807 KAR 5:006, Section 26(1)(a), due to LG&E's failure to notify the Commission within two hours of discovering an accident resulting in a burn requiring hospitalization; 2) 807 KAR 5:041, Section 3(1), due to a violation of NESC Rule 420H, by Mr. Hundley's failure to wear personal protective equipment and protective devices consisting of rubber gloves and rubber sleeves; 3) 807 KAR 5:041, Section 3(1), due to a violation of NESC Rule 421A by the failure of Mr. Grismer, the

first line supervisor, to adopt such precautions within his authority to prevent accidents and to see that the safety rules and operating procedures were observed by the employee under his direction; and 4) 807 KAR 5:041, Section 3(1), due to a violation of NESC Rule 444D by the failure of the employee in charge to make his own protective grounds or verify that adequate grounds had been applied.

The Commission, on its own motion, HEREBY ORDERS that:

- LG&E shall submit to the Commission within 20 days of the date of this
 Order a written response to the allegations contained in the Utility Accident Investigation
 Report.
- 2. LG&E shall appear on February 24, 1999, at 9:00 a.m., Eastern Standard Time, in Hearing Room 1 of the Commission's offices at 730 Schenkel Lane, Frankfort, Kentucky, to present evidence concerning the incident which is the subject of the Utility Accident Investigation Report, specifically the alleged violations of Commission regulations 807 KAR 5:006, Section 26(1)(a), and 807 KAR 5:041, Section 3(1), and to show cause, if any it can, why it should not be subject to the penalties of KRS 278.990 for the four probable violations of the aforementioned Commission regulations.
- 3. The Utility Accident Investigation Report dated September 21, 1998 is hereby made a part of the record of this case.
- 4. Any request by LG&E for an informal conference with the Commission Staff shall be set forth in writing and filed with the Commission within 20 days of the date of this Order.
