





Miscellaneous/Tarif Changes
Gas Charge - Gas Cost Adjustment Clause (GCAC) Changes
Western proposes to separate its current Commodity Charge into two components: a Gas Charge and a Distribution Charge. The Gas Charge GCAC meter will establish a meter-based GCAC by eliminating the charge GCAC meter will establish a meter-based GCAC by eliminating the GCAC will be calculated from zero.

Distribution Charge
Western proposes to establish a volumetric charge to recover a portion of its distribution costs. The charge will be based on the amount of gas delivered through the Company's existing distribution system. The charge will be applied to the applicable rate class.

Weather Normalizing Adjustment (WNA) Rider
Western proposes a WNA to stabilize the effects of winter weather on gas demand.

Premises Charge
Western proposes to add a charge to be applicable only to connect new residential premises where the meter is not located on the existing gas line. A main extension is required to establish new service. The proposed charge is \$13.05 per month for 15 years. If a main extension is not required to establish new service, the proposed charge is \$11.25 per month for 15 years. The Premises Charge is proposed to become effective January 1, 2001.

Demand Side Management (DSM) Surcharge
Western proposes to continue its weatherization of low-income residential customers for 3 years as conducted through the cooperation of the Kentucky Energy Development Corporation (KEDC) under the provisions of 278.285. The DSM surcharge is proposed to be applicable to the applicable residential class of customers, Rate G-1 Sales Service. The initial proposed charge is \$0.0380 per Mcf.

Margin Loss Recovery Mechanism Rider
Western proposes this rider to recover from all Sales Service customers 90% of future margin losses resulting from regulated large customer contract reductions.

Gas Research Institute Research & Development (GRI R&D) Unit Charge Rider
Western proposes a phased-in restructuring of the collection of GRI R&D costs consistent with the settlement reached at the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission and its currently retained in the hands of the gas research institute. The charge is proposed to be applied to the applicable residential class of customers, Rate G-1 Sales Service. The proposed Distribution Charge through 2004. This proposal will not result in an increase in charges to customers.

Miscellaneous Tariff Changes

Gas Charge - Gas Cost Adjustment Clause (GCAC) Changes
Western proposes to separate its current commodity charge into two components - a Gas Charge and a Distribution Charge. The Gas Charge GCAC rider will establish a zero-based GCAC by eliminating the base cost of gas and all non-gas costs from the calculation of the GCAC. The GCAC will be calculated from zero.

Distribution Charge

Western proposes to establish this volumetric charge to recover a portion of its non-gas costs, such as those formerly collected through the Commodity Charge. The remaining portion of non-gas costs are collected through the Company's other charges.

Weather Normalization/Adjustment (WNA) Rider

Western proposes a WNA to stabilize the effects of winter weather volatility on customer bills during the months of November through April. The WNA will be applicable to the Distribution Charge. As a result of the WNA, customers will pay a Distribution Charge equivalent to the charge that would be applicable during "normal" winter weather.

Late Payment Charge

Western proposes to establish a late payment charge of 5% applicable to Rate G-1 Sales Service. This penalty will be applicable to past due billing amounts.

Premises Charge

Western proposes this new charge to be applicable only to connect new residential premises where facilities to the premises do not presently exist. If a main extension is required to establish new service, the proposed charge is \$13.05 per month for 15 years. If a main extension is not required to establish new service, the proposed charge is \$11.25 per month for 15 years. The Premises Charge is proposed to become effective January 1, 2001.

Demand Side Management (DSM) Surcharge

Western proposes to continue its weatherization of low-income residences for 3 years as conducted through the cooperation of community action agencies in Western's service area. Pursuant to KRS 278.285, the DSM surcharge is proposed to be applicable to the eligible residential class of customers. Rate G-1 Sales Service. The initial proposed charge is \$0.0380 per Mcf.

Margin Loss Recovery Mechanism Rider

Western proposes this rider to recover from all Sales Service customers 90% of future margin losses resulting from negotiated large customer contract reductions.

Gas Research Institute Research & Development (GRI R&D) Unit Charge Rider

Western proposes a phased-in restructuring of its collection of GRI R&D costs consistent with the settlement reached at the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission and as currently reflected in the tariffs of the interstate pipelines. The GRI R&D Unit Charge is proposed to be phased out of the GCA and into a component of the proposed Distribution Charge through 2004. This proposal will not result in an increase in charges to customers.

Gas Research Institute Research & Development (GRI R&D) Unit Charge

Rider

Western proposes a phased-in restructuring of its collection of GRI R&D costs consistent with the settlement reached at the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission and as currently reflected in the tariffs of the interstate pipelines. The GRI R&D Unit Charge is proposed to be phased out of the GCA and into a component of the proposed Distribution Charge through 2004. This proposal will not result in an increase in charges to customers.

Alternate Receipt Point Service

Western proposes this new service, subject to availability, to provide additional receipt point flexibility for transportation customers. A \$0.10 per Mcf charge for this service is proposed, in addition to all other charges applicable to transportation customers.

All other charges not specifically mentioned herein shall remain the same as those presently in effect.

The proposed rates will result in an overall approximate increase in the amount of \$14,127,650 or 11.7% with increases of approximately \$9,221,264 or 13.5% for residential consumers, and \$3,427,255 or 9.9% for commercial consumers, and approximately \$1,057,997 or 6.4% for industrial consumers. Changes from other gas revenue will increase \$421,139 or 53.8%. The average monthly bill for residential consumers will increase approximately \$4.83 or 13.5%. The average monthly bill for commercial consumers will increase approximately \$14.57 or 9.9%. The average monthly bill for industrial consumers will increase approximately \$209.46 or 6.4%. The impact on each customer's average bill will vary according to individual consumption or transportation levels. However, this impact can be determined by each customer by applying the proposed rates listed above to their respective average consumption or transportation levels.

The rates contained in this notice are the rates proposed by Western, however, the KPSC may order rates to be charged that differ from the proposed rates contained in this notice. Such action may result in rates for customers other than the rates included in this notice.

Any corporation, association, or person with a substantial interest in this matter may, by written request to the KPSC, within thirty (30) days after publication or mailing of this notice of the proposed rate changes, request to intervene; intervention may be granted beyond the thirty (30)-day period for good cause shown. 

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

Western proposes a phased-in restructuring of its collection of GRI R&D costs consistent with the interests of its customers. The GRI R&D Unit Charge Rider will be a component of the Distribution Charge through 2004. This proposal will not result in an increase in charges to customers.

Alternate Receipt Point Service
Western proposes this new service, subject to availability, to provide additional receipt point flexibility for transportation customers. A \$0.10 per Mcf charge for this service is proposed, in addition to all other charges applicable to transportation customers.
All other charges not specifically mentioned herein shall remain the same as those presently in effect.

The proposed rates will result in an overall approximate increase in the amount of \$14,127,650 or 1.7%, with increased rates for residential consumers and \$3,427,255 or 1.7% for commercial consumers. 

Gas Charge - Miscellaneous Tariff Changes
Western proposes to separate its current Common Code Gas into two components - a Gas Charge and a Distribution Charge. The Gas Charge GCA rider will establish a "zero based GCA" by eliminating the base cost of gas and all non-gas costs from the calculation of the GCA. The GCA will be calculated from zero.

Weather Normalization
Western proposes to establish this volumetric charge to recover a portion of its non-gas costs, such as those formerly collected through the Common Code Charge. The remaining portion of non-gas costs are collected through the Company's other charges (WMA Rider).

Weather Normalization
Western proposes to establish the effect of winter weather volatility on customer bills during the months of November through April. The WNA will be applicable to the Distribution Charge. As a result of the WNA, customers will pay a Distribution Charge equivalent to the charge that would be applicable during "normal" winter weather.

Rate Payment Change
Western proposes to establish late payment charge of 5% applicable to Rate G-1, Sales Service. This penalty will be applicable to past due billing amounts.

Premises Charge
Western proposes this new charge to be applicable only to connect new residential premises where facilities to the premises do not presently exist. If a main extension is required to establish new service, the proposed charge is \$125 per month for 15 years. If a main extension is not required to establish new service, the proposed charge is \$11.25 per month for 15 years. The Premises Charge is proposed to become effective January 1, 2000.

Demand Side Management (DSM) Surcharge
Western proposes to continue its weatherization of low-income residences for 3 years as conducted through the cooperation of community action agencies in Western's service area. Pursuant to KRS 278.226, the DSM surcharge is proposed to be \$1.50 per month for the initial proposed charge is \$0.080 per Mcf.

Margin Loss Recovery Mechanism Rider
Western proposes this rider to recover from all Sales Service customers 90% of future margin losses resulting from negotiated gas purchases. The rider is proposed to be effective January 1, 2000.

Gas Research Institute Research & Development (GRI R&D) Unit Charge Rider
Western proposes a plan in restructuring of its collection of GRI R&D costs consistent with the settlement reached at the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission Panel 68. The GRI R&D rider is proposed to be phased out of the GCA and into a component of the proposed Distribution Charge through 2004. This proposal will not result in an increase in charges to customers.

Alternate Receipt Point Service
Western proposes this new service, subject to availability, to provide an alternate receipt point for residential customers. A \$0.10 per Mcf charge for this service is proposed in addition to all other charges applicable to transportation customers. All other charges not specifically mentioned herein shall remain the same as those presently in effect.

Proposed Rates
The proposed rates will result in an overall approximate increase in the proposed rates of 11.7% with increases of approximately \$2,271.28 or 13.5% for residential consumers, and \$3,427.25 or 9.9% for commercial consumers, and approximately \$1,057.992 or 6.4% for industrial consumers. Charges from other gas revenue will increase \$24,138 or 55.5%. The average monthly bill for residential consumers will increase approximately \$1,057.992 or 6.4%. The average monthly bill for industrial consumers will increase approximately \$208.46 or 6.4%. The impact on each customer's transportation costs will vary according to individual consumption or transportation needs. However, this impact can be listed above to their respective average consumption or transportation levels.

Rate Changes
The rates contained in this notice are the rates proposed by Western, however, the KPSC may order rates to be changed that differ from the proposed rates contained in this notice. Such action may result in rates for customers other than the rates included in this notice.

Do you really want a dog?

You think you want a dog, but what kind? A reader called and asked me what breed I would recommend for her. This is a question only the potential dog owner or the family can answer. Here are some questions a person or family should consider before getting a book to look at the different breeds.

1. Why do I want a dog? The answer may range from a companion to an animal I can show. Earning obedience, tracking and other titles.

2. Do I want an active dog? If you jog for exercise, you might want a dog that enjoys long runs.

3. How about grooming? A long-haired dog requires at least weekly combing and brushing especially during shedding seasons.

4. Where am I going to keep my dog? Dogs are pack oriented and need to be with their "pack" whether canine or human. If you plan to keep the dog inside, is your house and apartment large enough for the breed you like?

5. Do I have time to take care of a dog, giving it the necessary training, playtime and companionship?

6. Have I changed my budget to include quality dog food, grooming tools, medical bills and training classes?

After answering these questions you can research the breeds. If you are interested in a large dog, select the large breeds to study. Check the temperaments and medical problems of each. Even if you plan to get a mixed breed, do this research because you will then look for a mixed breed with as many qualities as possible that you want.

Finally, you are ready to look at individual dogs, but your scrutiny continues. Each individual dog has his or her own personality and that is vital to your goal of getting the "right" dog for you or your family.

For example, border collies are highly specialized sheep herders. However, when I traveled to Minnesota with my dogs,

I responded that I believed that my dog had earned her right to live since she had worked with children who were afraid of dogs for the majority of her six years. (Actually she continued this work for another two years before I retired her.)

There are temperament tests for puppies to see how outgoing, curious or friendly they can be. Some of these tests are useful in evaluating adult dogs, especially those in a shelter.

Don't expect a dog that tests shy and introverted to turn into a dominant, territorial, protective. Such a shy dog can become a fear biter if it is stressed too much.

It seems border collies can have one of three personalities: Aggressive, which is highly desirable in the mountains where the dogs need to defend the sheep from coyotes, cougars and bears; neutral but hard-working, which is the kind selected by the sheep ranches in the plains; and finally, the shy, introverted type which are destroyed.

"We know this is the best we've got," Mckeon said. "All we can do is stay positive and hope the magic wand somehow works."

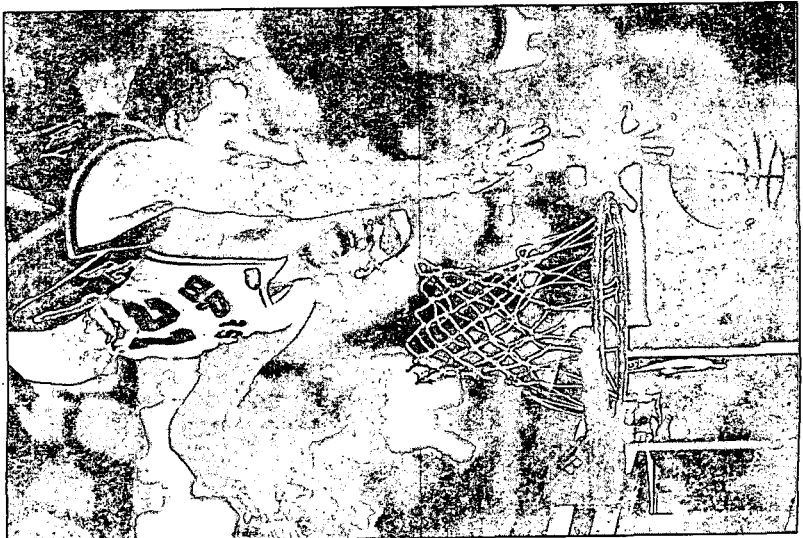
"These guys are doing the best they can. We'd hope we can get them to rise to another level, if they can. With some guys, it's a learning process that takes a while to go through.

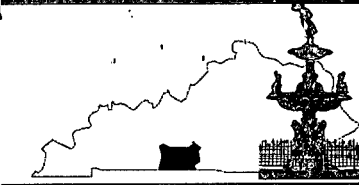

DeWitt, who was wearing casual clothes and driving a civilian truck when he stopped McNally, described a nervous and "antsy" McNally who wouldn't stand still after DeWitt identified himself as a law enforcement officer.

"When I questioned him, he refused any answer about his name or where

reduced to 10.

Michael Carnel was a 14-year-old freshman when he fired a pistol into a student prayer group before school Dec. 1, 1997. Three students were killed and another five were injured.

On Monday, Special Judge Will Shadoun set a trial date of Aug. 7, 2000. He also allowed attorneys to begin depositions but did prohibit questioning of Michael Carnel.

Carnel's doctors have said that his mental condition is unstable and that questioning him now could cause permanent mental damage.

"I am not going to do anything that could harm him (Carnel) personally," the told Michael Brecken, the attorney for the parents who argued the questioning should be

allowed to proceed.

Brecken said reports that Carnel is unstable conflict with testimony and documents presented in December, when Carnel was sentenced after pleading guilty but mentally ill to murder and attempted murder.

At that time, doctors said Carnel was remorseful for his actions, he was mentally stable and he understood the consequences of pleading guilty.

Carnel was sentenced to life in prison without the possibility of parole for 25 years.

Shadoun, though, said documents and letters he received from those treating Carnel indicate that his unstable mental condition is not permanent, and that in the future he should be able to answer questions.

DeWitt said "Most burglars don't have any ID on them and wear dark apparel. In my opinion, something had occurred."

McNally testified Monday that DeWitt showed him his badge and picture identification in such a way that he doubted if DeWitt really was a law enforcement officer.

"From the time I asked him the first question, he kept escalating up the scale of resistance," DeWitt said. "It was a very potentially volatile situation that I was trying to calm down."

When DeWitt asked to do a pat-down search of McNally, the man consented and then used his arm to block the search, DeWitt said.

McNally felt a "nudge" in his arm when DeWitt tried to handcuff him, McNally testified Monday. A physician described McNally's broken ribs as similar to a common arm wrestling injury, said Assistant U.S. Attorney Candace Hill, who is representing DeWitt.

DeWitt testified that he didn't know when McNally's arm was broken. If he did break the man's arm, it was because McNally was struggling so hard while his arms were in a fragile position, DeWitt said.

The hearing continues today.



state inquiry, education commissioner William Cody penalized the school by giving zeros on all the high school tests.

Alternate Receipt Point Service
Western proposes this new service, subject to availability, to provide additional receipt point flexibility for transportation customers. A \$0.10 per Mcf charge for this service is proposed. In addition to all other charges applicable to transportation customers.

All other charges not specifically mentioned herein shall remain the same as those presently in effect.

The proposed rates will result in an overall average rate increase of the amount of \$11.72/1000 or 1.17%, with increases of approximately \$9.27/264 or 13.5% for residential customers and \$1.52/999 or 1.52% for commercial customers. The average monthly bill for residential customers will increase approximately \$4.85 or 13.5%. The average monthly bill for commercial customers will increase approximately \$14.57 or 9.9%. The average monthly bill for industrial customers will increase approximately \$209.46 or 6.4%. The impact on each customer's average bill will vary according to individual consumption or transportation levels. However, this impact can be determined by each customer by applying the proposed rates listed above to their respective average consumption or transportation levels.

The rates contained in this notice are the rates proposed by Western. However, the rates proposed by the KYSC may be changed that differ from the proposed rates contained in this notice. Such action may result in rates for customers other than those included in this notice.

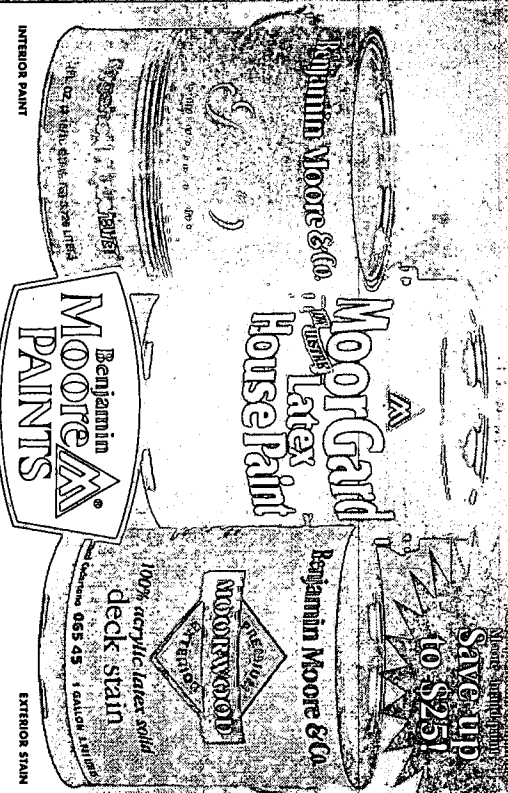

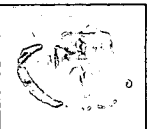

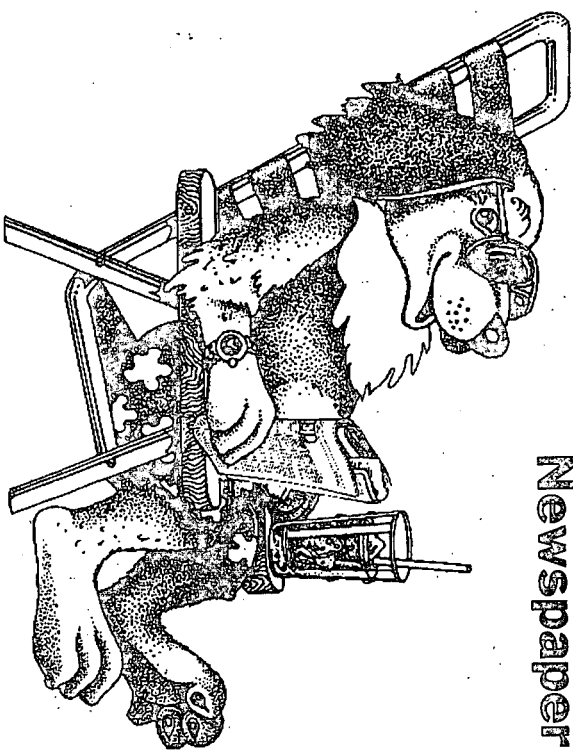

The proposed rates will result in an overall approximate increase in the amount of \$14,127,650 or 1.7% with increases of approximately \$2,231,284 or 13.5% for residential consumers, and \$3,427,235 or 9.4% for industrial consumers. Charges from other gas revenue will increase \$421,139 or 55.8%. The average monthly bill for residential consumers will increase approximately \$4.85 or 13.5%. The average monthly bill for commercial consumers will increase approximately \$3.50 or 6.4%. The impact on each customer's average bill will vary according to individual consumption or transportation levels. However, this impact can be determined by each customer by applying the proposed rates listed above to their respective average consumption or transportation levels.

The rates contained in this notice are the rates proposed by Western, however, the KPS/C may order rates to be charged that differ from the proposed rates contained in this notice. Such action may result in rates for customers other than the rates included in this notice.
