

<u>ORDER</u>

On May 3, 1999, SprintCom, Inc. ("SprintCom") filed an application seeking a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to build and operate a personal communications services ("PCS") facility for the Cincinnati Basic Trading Area. SprintCom has requested authorization to construct a PCS site in Grant County. SprintCom was previously granted the authority to operate in Case No. 97-294.¹

The proposed PCS site is located at 307 North Main Street, Crittenden, Grant County, Kentucky ("the Crittenden PCS site"). The coordinates for the Crittenden PCS site are North Latitude 38° 47' 4" by West Longitude 84° 36' 00".

SprintCom has provided information regarding the structure of the tower, safety measures, and antenna design criteria for the Crittenden PCS site. Based upon the application, the design of the tower and foundation conforms to applicable nationally

recognized building standards, and a Registered Professional Engineer has certified the plans.

Pursuant to KRS 100.987(2), SprintCom has submitted the uniform application to the Grant County Planning Commission ("GCPC") for the pending construction. The GCPC rejected the site, stating that better sites were available, yet in documents filed with this Commission it did not recommend any specific alternative sites. The Commission may override a Planning Commission rejection - KRS 100.987(5) - if the public convenience and necessity require the construction and if no suitable alternative exists. SprintCom has demonstrated that the public convenience and necessity requires the construction. Moreover, no specific alternative sites have been recommended to the Commission for radio frequency analysis. SprintCom has filed and received approval from the Federal Aviation Administration and the Kentucky Airport Zoning Commission for the construction and operation of the Crittenden PCS site.

SprintCom has filed notices verifying that each person who owns property within 500 feet of the Crittenden PCS site has been notified of the pending construction. The notice solicited any comments and informed the property owners or residents of their right to intervene. In addition, notice was posted in a visible location on the proposed site for at least two weeks after SprintCom's application was filed. The City of Crittenden intervened and a hearing was scheduled for October 12,1999. Prior to the hearing, the City withdrew its opposition and the hearing was cancelled.

Pursuant to KRS 278.280, the Commission is required to determine proper practices to be observed when it finds, upon complaint or on its own motion, that the -2-

facilities of any utility subject to its jurisdiction are unreasonable, unsafe, improper, or insufficient. To assist the Commission in its efforts to comply with this mandate, SprintCom should notify the Commission if it does not use this antenna tower to provide PCS radio telecommunications services in the manner set out in its application and this Order. Upon receipt of such notice, the Commission may, on its own motion, institute proceedings to consider the proper practices, including removal of the unused antenna tower, which should be observed by SprintCom.

The Commission, having considered the evidence of record and being otherwise sufficiently advised, finds that SprintCom should be granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to construct and operate the Crittenden PCS site under its previously approved tariff.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. SprintCom is hereby granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to construct and operate the Crittenden PCS site.

2. SprintCom shall immediately notify the Commission in writing, if, after the antenna tower is built and utility service is commenced, the tower is not used for a period of 3 months in the manner authorized by this Order.

<u>ORDER</u>

On May 3, 1999, SprintCom, Inc. ("SprintCom") filed its application in this matter. By letter dated June 2, 1999, the Grant County Planning Commission (the "Planning Commission") notified this Commission that it had, pursuant to its jurisdiction under KRS Chapter 100, rejected SprintCom's application. Subsequently, SprintCom filed a motion requesting that this Commission override the Planning Commission's rejection on the bases that service needs require a wireless telecommunications facility at the proposed location and that there is no suitable alternative site reasonably available upon which SprintCom can construct. <u>See</u> KRS 100.987(5)(a).

The City of Crittenden ("City") then moved to intervene in this matter, citing objections to the proposed site. The Commission granted the motion and scheduled a hearing for October 12, 1999. A copy of the Order was mailed to the Planning Commission, although it had not requested intervention. Shortly before the hearing was scheduled to take place, the Commission was notified that the City, the only intervenor in the case, no longer opposed the construction and that it wished to be dismissed as a

party. SprintCom then filed a motion to cancel the hearing and to submit the matter to the Commission. The Commission granted the respective motions of SprintCom and the City by Order dated October 12, 1999.

On October 13, 1999, the Planning Commission filed a motion to intervene in the case. It states that it had expected the City to "represent the Planning Commission and the citizens of the City of Crittenden and County of Grant in expressing our concerns on the placement of this tower," and that the City's unexpected withdrawal had precipitated the Planning Commission's motion to intervene. SprintCom has filed a response to the motion, arguing principally that 807 KAR 5:001, Section 3, requires a motion to intervene to be "timely," and that granting the Planning Commission's motion at this stage of the proceedings would unduly complicate them.

This Commission must agree. This case was docketed six months ago. A hearing has been scheduled and, by mutual agreement of the parties, canceled. Moreover, the Planning Commission itself held a hearing in regard to the proposed construction, rejected the application, and filed its decision with this Commission. Pursuant to KRS 100.897, this Commission may, on a motion to override, consider only the public convenience and necessity and whether an acceptable alternative site exists. Thus, the Planning Commission's views, and its decision, are already of record in this case.

The Commission, having been sufficiently advised, HEREBY ORDERS that the motion of the Grant County Planning Commission to intervene be, and it hereby is, denied.

APPLICANT'S RESPONSE TO GRANT COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION MOTION TO INTERVENE

Comes the Applicant, SprintCom, Inc., by counsel, and for its Response to the Grant

County Planning Commission's Motion to Intervene in this matter states the following.

1. 807 KAR 5:001 Section 3 governs the procedure for intervening in matters before

the Public Service Commission. These regulations require that a person or entity who wishes to become a party to the proceeding file a *timely* motion to intervene.

2. The Application herein was filed with the Public Service Commission on May 03,

1999. By letter to the Commission dated June 02, 1999, the Grant County Planning Commission ("Grant County") recommended denial of said Application.

The undersigned filed with this Commission a Motion to Override the Grant
County recommendation on July 20, 1999. Applicant served a copy of said Motion upon Grant
County.

4. On September 02, 1999, the City of Crittenden ("the City") moved to intervene in this matter. This Commission granted intervenor status to the City by Order dated September

07, 1999.

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5. This Commission issued a scheduling Order on September 14, 1999, setting a hearing date for October 12, 1999. The Commission provided a copy of said scheduling order to Grant County for the "purpose of notification that the . . . scheduled hearing may affect locations and relocations of service facilities within the planning unit's jurisdiction." *See* Commission Order of September 14, 1999. Despite having had notice of the Applicant's challenge to their decisions and of the Commission's intention to hold a public hearing on the matter, Grant County filed no protest letter, no response to Applicant's motion, and made no motion to intervene prior to the scheduled hearing date.

6. As the City of Crittenden was the only intervenor in this matter,¹ Applicant contacted City officials and entered into negotiations to resolve whatever issues the City had with the proposed facility. The City and the Applicant entered into an agreement resolving said issues approximately one week prior to the scheduled hearing date. As a result of said agreement, the City moved to withdraw its intervention and SprintCom moved to cancel the hearing and to have the matter stand submitted on the record before the Commission.

On October 12, 1999, the date upon which the hearing had been sceduled, Grant
County filed its motion to intervene.²

8. Grant County's motion to intervene should be denied, as it was not timely filed. As the City of Crittenden is the location of the proposed facility and the City has resolved its issues

with the Applicant regarding said facility, any interest on the part of Grant County has been adequately represented. To allow Grant County intervenor status at this late stage would unduly complicate this matter, and would prejudice both Applicant and the City with regards to their respective rights under their negotiated agreement.

The Grant County Planning Commission would like to make a Motion to Intervene with regards to the above case.

On May 24th, 1999 the Planning Commission held a hearing concerning this application. The Planning Commission made a recommendation to the PSC for denial. We received numerous comments from citizens and a strong concern from the City of Crittenden that the placement of the tower was in a residential area. Along with our recommendation of denial the City of Crittenden filed a letter of intervention on their own. We received notice of a hearing that was to be held on Oct. 12, 1999 but did not intervene because we believed that the City was going to uphold their decision of intervening in this matter. We have come to learn that the City has withdrawn their concerns. The Planning Commission still feels that their recommendation to deny the site should be upheld and we have received several calls from neighboring property owners and citizens concerning the tower and wish to be heard. The Planning commission is requesting that a hearing be scheduled in order to hear the concerns of the community and also the Planning Commission.

Please understand that we had very strong support from the City in our recommendation of denial and because of their support we believed that they would represent the Planning Commission and the citizens of the City of Crittenden and County of Grant in expressing our concerns on the placement of this tower. But do to their unexpected withdraw the Planning Commission would like an opportunity to express their concerns and also for the citizens to address this issue.

1) The hearing scheduled for October 12, 1999 is cancelled.



On May 3, 1999, SprintCom, Inc. ("SprintCom") filed an application with the Commission requesting a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to construct and operate a cellular facility at 307 North Main Street, Crittenden, Grant County, Kentucky. Pursuant to KRS 100.987(2), SprintCom submitted the uniform application to the Grant County Planning Commission ("Planning Commission"). Subsequent to a public hearing on the matter, the Planning Commission disapproved the proposed construction. The Planning Commission's written record of the meeting in which the finding was made has been filed into the record in this case. This Commission may override the decision of the Planning Commission only if the public convenience and necessity require the construction and if there is no acceptable alternative site from which service can be provided. KRS 100.987(5).

The city of Crittenden has requested and has been granted intervention in this case. Accordingly, the Commission, on its own motion, has scheduled a hearing to assist it in determining whether the circumstances presented in this case require it to

override the decision of the Planning Commission. The hearing will be held on October 12, 1999, at 9:00 a.m., Eastern Daylight Time, in Hearing Room 2 of the Commission's offices at 677 Comanche Trail, Frankfort, Kentucky.

2. SprintCom shall appear at the hearing and be prepared to present testimony on the need to construct a facility to serve wireless telecommunications customers and on its efforts made to locate a facility at other, more suitable locations.

3. Neither opening statements nor witnesses' summaries of prefiled testimony shall be permitted.

4. Any interested person shall have the opportunity to present testimony or comment on the proposed cell site.

5. Prefiled testimony, if any, shall be filed by September 30, 1999.

6. Any party wishing to introduce at hearing evidence of potential alternative sites for the proposed facility shall file, not later than September 30, 1999, a document listing such dates.

7. Pursuant to KRS 100.324, a copy of this Order is being sent to the Grant County Planning Commission for the purpose of notification that the above-scheduled hearing may affect locations or relocations of service facilities within the planning unit's jurisdiction.

#### ITEM 9. PUBLIC HEARING - CELL TOWER - 307 NORTH MAIN STREET - CRITTENDEN

Chairman, John Lawrence declared the public hearing open at 7:55.

John Simkonis stated that all fees were paid and notices sent. He stated that the request was made by SPRINTCOM to locate a tower at 307 N. Main St in Crittenden. Staff Recommendation is approval – this request is not in conflict with the comprehensive plan. The findings are: 1. The current planning period and comprehensive plan calls for an increase in wireless technology to the county. 2. Towers are needed to supply services for wireless communications. 3. SPRINTCOM has met all application requirements for Grant County as stated in the Grant County Planning Commission Administrative Policy Number One (Regulations for Cellular Towers) 4. SPRINTCOM has requested a waiver for the following: a. tower have a height of 250 instead of 200 feet. B. The utility carrier use surrounding land around compound instead of designing off-street parking. He also stated that they requested that barbwire be allowed on the fence.

Terry Shumate, representative of SPRINTCOM, stated that they were asking for the variance to the height of 250 feet in order to reduce the number of towers needed. He stated that with the 250 ft. height there would be 4 towers and with 200 ft. would require possibly 4 more towers. He stated he felt the waiver was just and would benefit the county. Mr. Shumate stated that they requested the barbwire because the locations were not very visible and the barbwire would prevent anyone from entering the fence. He stated that the regulations require 1 off street parking and they were requesting that they not have to pave the parking or entrance area. He stated the regulations require landscaping when abutting a residential area, he stated that this site abuts a residential area on the East side and they were planning landscaping on the east and the north side even though the north side does not abut residential area.

Chairman, John Lawrence read a letter from Erpenbeck Engineers.

Steve Leesman stated that he visited several sites and most were paved and had barbwire, he stated even though the barbwire wasn't permitted he thought that it should be waived and be permitted. He also stated that the access drive and parking area should be paved.

Mr. Shumate stated that he agreed that the off street parking be paved but that the road to the asphalt plant should be considered the access drive and they are asking for a waiver in paving the parking area.

Nick Stevens, head R.F. Engineer, showed the commission propagation studies that showed the difference between a 200 ft. tower and a 250 ft. tower.

Mike Drysdale asked if there were 250 ft. towers and those towers became filled up would there be a need for new towers?

Mr. Stevens stated that there could be a need for smaller towers to fill in the area.

Mr. Shumate stated that the towers are co-locatable for 3 or more carriers depending on the weight. He presented a letter from AT&T stating that they were interested in using this tower for co-location and the height needed to be 240 ft.

The commission asked if anyone had talked to the city concerning this tower.

Mr. Shumate stated that he had not talked the city; he stated that his associate had talked to the Judge Executive concerning these sites and he personally had worked with Mr. Simkonis.

John Simkonis stated that the Planning Commission was the final stop for the county and it was not required that they go to the city.

Ken Rylee stated that now where is it required that anyone go to the city, the Planning Commission acts on behalf of everyone in the Joint Local Commission and their recommendation is forwarded to the PSC. He also stated that all the legislative bodies are represented on the planning commission and any comments could come through the representatives.

Chairman, John Lawrence asked if anyone wished to speak on the request.

Judge Executive, Darrell Link, stated he wanted to clarify the conversation with Mr. Barrymore. He stated that he told him that it would not be appropriate to locate in a residential area and should look at the Industrial Parks but there were no specific sites mentioned. Mr. Link stated that the Planning Commission was the voice for the county and if the 250 was approved does this open the door for another to request even more.

Mr. Perkins stated that it was his understanding that after this hearing the government was involved and the people had no say.

John Simkonis stated that the PSC could override the commission recommendation

Chairman, John Lawrence asked why they decided on this site.

Mr. Shumate stated that it would be less intrusive on the area because it was located next to an asphalt plan.

The Commission questioned about other sites that were considered.

Mr. Shumate stated that within the application was a list of other sites and reasons they were not chosen.

Marjorie Kenner asked the number that would be needed in between the 200 ft. towers.

Mr. Shumate stated it could be as many as 4 more.

Chuck Givin stated that 250 ft. would be better than 200 ft. because there would be fewer towers, he also stated he was concerned over what the appearance of the base units would be and that paving and landscaping should be required because the building could be seen.

Dick Austin stated that the tower could have been located in an Industrial area away from any residential developments

John Lawrence asked what the city or county gets from locating the towers.

Mr. Shumate stated that the residents get better service and they also give the city and county opportunities to place emergency equipment on the towers free of charge. He also stated that the base unit is 16 x 11 concrete pad that holds cabinets in which the equipment is located.

The Commission questioned if the Industrial Park was considered.

Ken Rylee stated that the only information that can be discussed is information particular to this site.

Martha Hicks, Mayor of Crittenden, stated that this area was to develop and could be located is an area that was less likely to develop.

Mr. Shumate stated that there is a certain search ring that it is determined that the tower must be placed in order to connect the network.

Mr. Stevens stated that the search ring is 0.6 miles in diameter.

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The commission discussed going into executive session to discuss the other locations that were discovered.

Chuck Givin questioned if 3 boxes and the concrete pad were enough for future co-locations.

Mr. Shumate stated that it was a possibility that there would be a need for more boxes and more concrete pads.

Mike Drysdale made a motion to go into executive session section 61.810 (g), Robert Worthington seconded the motion. A hand vote was taken, all members in attendance voting in favor of the motion. Motion passes.

Mike Drysdale made a motion to come out of executive session, Brooke Wooton seconded the motion. A hand vote was taken, all members in attendance voting in favor of the motion. Motion passes.

Chairman, John Lawrence stated that no action was taken and also informed the commission that criminal action could be taken if anything they discussed was released.

Ken Rylee Stated that the Commission must forward a recommendation 60 days after the date of application or the site is automatically approved.

Mr. Shumate stated that he had talked to the Mayor of Crittenden and he would agree to adding slats to the fence and landscaping around the entire site, and agree to a legal written agreement that they would maintain the cabinetry and replace any landscaping in a reasonable amount of time.

Chairman, John Lawrence declared the public hearing closed at 10:02.

William Covington stated he thought the access drive and parking area should be pave.

Mr. Shumate stated that he withdrew that request for a waiver.

Sam Womble made a motion to accept the request with the waiver allowing 250 ft. tower, they pave the parking and access area, 8 ft. with barbwire and slats be constructed with landscaping and a written agreement be drawn up stating the company would provide maintenance of the exterior of the equipment and replace landscaping within a reasonable amount of time, Vernon Webster seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken: Vernon Webster – yes, Robert Worthington – yes, Samuel Womble – yes, Dudley Peddicord – yes, Mike Drysdale – no, William Covington – no, Steven Mann – no, Brooke Wooton – no and John Lawrence – no. Motion fails 5 to 4.

Mike Drysdale made a motion to deny the request because better sites could be available, Brooke Wooton seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken: Vernon Webster – no, Robert Worthington – yes, Samuel Womble – yes, Dudley Peddicord – yes, Mike Drysdale – yes, William Covington – yes, Steven Mann – yes, Brooke Wooton – yes. Motion passes 7 to 1.

The Commission is in receipt of your letter concerning the above application for approval to construct a cell facility. The Commission will carefully analyze this application before rendering its final decision. If you wish to intervene in this matter, you must notify the Commission in writing. The Commission greatly appreciates your impute in this matter.

It may be helpful for you to know that authority, specifically that of the Public Service Commission, in this matter has been limited by federal law. For example, Section 704 of the federal Telecommunications Act of 1996 prohibits this Commission from regulating the placement of wireless facilities on the basis of environmental effects of radio frequency emissions to the extent the facilities comply with Federal Communications Commission regulations. Section 704 also prohibits a state or local government from prohibiting telecommunications facilities construction if such denial will have the effect of prohibiting service. In addition, this Commission is required by statute to ensure that utility service, including telecommunications service, is adequate and reliable. The Commission does, however, consider appropriate placement of necessary facilities within applicable engineering boundaries. It also pursues a policy of collocation of facilities whenever possible.
