Dear Mr. Huelsmann:

As you are aware, I have recently been working with Mr. Dale Wright of your staff in an effort to bring The Gas Group into full compliance with all the rules and regulations of the Commission.

From my study of the rules and regulations of the Commission, as well as discussions with your staff, this appears to be a case in which the procedure required is somewhat uncertain. Initially, I had considered making this filing as an Application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity. However, this system was initially constructed as a major transportation line with farm taps. In recent years, however, the Company has lost their wholesale purchaser and the existing system has just continued serving the same farm taps. Thus, it appears to me, that The Gas Group is required to file aa tariff with the Commission, but should not file an Application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity since the distribution line has already been constructed.

HISTORY:

The Gas Group, Inc. was formed as a Kentucky Corporation on December 11, 1992. A copy of the Articles of Incorporation are attached as exhibit no. 1.

The Gas wells from which the major transportation line was constructed in 1993, are located near Richardsville, in Warren County, Kentucky. The major transportation line was constructed in Warren, Butler and Edmonson Counties. The line is 28 miles long

and terminates at Highway 185 north of Bowling Green at the Grayson County line.

Peak Energy, Inc. purchased the gas transported during 1993 and 1994, but the farm taps made pursuant to KRS 278.485 have continued to this date to be served by the previous transportation line constructed.

When the major transportation line was constructed a permit was obtained by the Kentucky Highway Department to place some of the line on highway right-of-way. A copy of the of this Permit and Bond are attached as exhibit no. 2. No application was filed with the Public Service Commission for the construction of the line.

On April 14, 1999, the Commission entered an Order in Case No. 99-130 find specified violations of the Commission Rules and Regulations. The representative of the Company, Basil Pollitt, failed to appear as ordered and the Commission subsequently entered an Order fining The Gas Group the sum of \$25,000.00.

Mr. Pollitt met with the Commission staff in May, 1999, with regard to the safety concerns previously found in an inspection. Mr. Pollitt then proceeded to correct each of the safety concerns and another field inspection was conducted in June, 1999, and Mr. Pollitt was under the impression that all deficiencies were corrected. However, he failed to follow up by filing a tariff and seeking a reconsideration of the fine previously imposed.

CURRENT FILING:

I have attached hereto a tariff filing by The Gas Group, Inc. for the service presently being provided the farm taps along the original transportation line. This tariff is marked as exhibit no.

I am also filing a map of the transportation system. Mr. Pollitt has previously provided the Commission staff the location of road crossing and cutoff valves. If the staff requires further information in this regard we will respond accordingly. This map is marked as exhibit no. 4.

With this filing, I would assume the Commission staff would advise us as to whether this filing is in full compliance with the Commission rules and regulations. We would then address any deficiencies in response to any such request by the staff. As soon as we have fully complied with all the Commission rules and regulations, I would advise that we plan to file with the



Enclosed you will find a copy of an Order issued by the Commission on March 23, 2000. It appears to me that the substance of this Order would apply to Basil Pollitt. It is my general understanding that The Gas Group's pipeline was constructed to provide natural gas to a major transportation line, and the intervening consumers, and now current customers, were the farm taps. In that configuration, the Public Service Commission had no regulatory authority save and except safety issues.

Now I understand that the major transportation line is no longer the end-user. This converts The Gas Group's pipeline into a local distribution system. At any rate, The Gas Group's distribution pipeline was constructed in the early 90's and has "transformed" into a distribution system. As such, it is subject to PSC regulation, but the enclosed Order clearly indicates that no Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity is needed. I suspect it would be a good idea to submit some type of "asbuilt" plans detailing the system and where its various valves and other mechanical features are located.

Also enclosed is a blank copy of the "Rates, Rules and Regulations" which form the basis of a tariff. In addition, enclosed is the completed tariff for Citypower, LLC, which went into effect in September 1998. This material should provide you with guidelines to construct a cover letter explaining the background and development of the pipeline and the company called The Gas Group, Inc. As I have already advised, the deadline for this filing is May 10. If there is any further delay, correspondence and contact should be made with Honorable Martin J. Huelsmann, Executive Director of the Public Service Commission. If I can be of further service, please do not hesitate to contact me.

ORDER

On April 14, 1999, the Commission entered an Order that directed Basil C. Pollitt d/b/a The Gas Group, Inc. a/k/a The Gas Group ("Gas Group") to answer and to appear at a hearing on May 18, 1999 to show cause why it should not be penalized pursuant to KRS 278.990(1) and KRS 278.992(1) for its alleged violations of the above named subsections of KRS Chapter 278, sections of 807 KAR and 49 U.S.C. 4, Section 60101, et seq., and amendments thereto.

On April 22, 1999, Basil C. Pollitt, owner and operator of Gas Group, was personally served with a copy of a show cause Order and <u>notice</u> of the date, time and place of the hearing. Personal service was accomplished by a deputy from the Office of the Jefferson County Sheriff. Neither Mr. Pollitt nor anyone on his behalf filed a response or answer to the show cause Order.

Hearing in this matter was conducted on May 18, 1999. Mr. Pollitt failed to appear at the hearing, either personally or by a representative. Appearing on behalf of the Commission was Dale Wright, Staff Attorney. Members of the Commission Staff appearing and testifying were: Jordan Neel, custodian of the records and schedules of rates and conditions of service (tariffs); Susan Hutcherson, custodian of the records of show cause Orders and other permanent records; William Feldman, custodian of the records of annual reports of utilities; David Kinman, gas pipeline safety investigator; and Allen Gregory, hazardous material inspector for the Kentucky State Fire Marshal's Office.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The record, including the transcript of evidence with exhibits, taken at hearing on May 18, 1999 and the "Tour of Gas Group Lines" report prepared by David Kinman on June 18, 1999 established undisputed facts.

On February 15, 1999, Commission Staff was contacted about an unmarked natural gas line discovered by highway workers. The line was located north of Richardsville, Warren County, Kentucky near State Highway 185. On February 16, 1999, David Kinman investigated with the assistance of Allen Gregory, hazardous material inspector of the Kentucky Fire Marshal's Office. Initially, the extent of the gas line and facilities could not be determined. The situation could be potentially dangerous because the gas could be contaminated by the presence of hydrogen sulfide, producing "sour gas." This has occurred in some instances in this particular area of Kentucky. Basil C. Pollitt was and is the owner and operator of the natural gas distribution facility doing business as The Gas Group a/k/a The Gas Group, Inc. The system consisted of

22 miles of three and four-inch plastic pipe which extends northward along Kentucky Highway 185. The system is pressurized and valves are located at 4-mile intervals. The gas distribution system services natural gas to approximately 50 customers. The utility facility is connected to 5 natural gas wells, although, as of June 17, 1999 (the date of the second inspection), only one well was providing natural gas. The presence of hydrogen sulfide was not detected by David Kinman upon testing on June 17, 1999.

It is further found, as undisputed facts, the following:

- 1. Basil C. Pollitt is and was operating a natural gas distribution system near Richardsville, Kentucky. Commission records show that Mr. Pollitt has never applied for nor received a certificate of convenience and necessity to construct this natural gas distribution facility or provide natural gas service. KRS 278.020 provides in part: "No person ... shall commence providing utility service ... or begin construction of any ... facility ... until that person has obtained ... a certificate that public convenience and necessity require the service or construction" Mr. Pollitt was advised that it was necessary for him to secure a certificate to continue to operate his facility. The records of the Commission reflect that, as of the date of this Order, Mr. Pollitt has failed to make application for or receive a certificate. Mr. Pollitt is in violation of KRS 278.020, and therefore is operating a natural gas distribution system unlawfully.
- 2. Basil C. Pollitt has never filed with the Commission a schedule of rates and conditions of service (tariff) relating to the above-named natural gas distribution facility. KRS 278.160 provides in part: "... such utility (person) shall file with the Commission ... schedules showing all rates and conditions of service" Mr. Pollitt is

in violation of KRS 278.160, and therefore is operating a natural gas distribution system unlawfully.

- 3. The initial inspection of the natural gas distribution system that was discovered by highway workers was conducted on February 16, 1999. David Kinman, assisted by Allen Gregory, inspected the facility to the extent possible at that time. Since they did not know the extent of the system, their inspection was limited, but the following violations were discovered.
- a. Violation of 807 KAR 5:022, Section 14(5)(a), and 49 CFR 192.707(a) for failure to display line markers or signs to indicate the presence of a natural gas pipeline.
- b. Violation of 807 KAR 5:022, Section 14(5)(c)(2) and 49 CFR 192.707(e)(2) for failure to have line markers on above-ground pipeline, which include a telephone number to call in case of emergency.
- c. Violation of 807 KAR 5:022, Section 14(5)(e)(2) and 49 CFR 192.707(e)(2) for failure to provide a phone number to call in the event of emergency.
- d. Violation of 807 KAR 5:022, Section 13(9) and 49 CFR192.615 for failure to establish contact with local police, fire, and other officials regarding actions to be taken during an emergency.
- e. Violation of 807 KAR 5:023 and 49 CFR 199 for failure to adopt and provide an anti-drug and alcohol plan.

Since receiving a copy of the show cause Order, Mr. Pollitt has placed line markers and signs showing the location of the natural gas pipeline, but the markers and signs provide a long-distance telephone number, not a local one.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Commission has jurisdiction of the subject matter herein and has personal jurisdiction on Basil C. Pollitt for purposes of notice of hearing and hearing. Basil C. Pollitt has been and is now the owner and operator of a natural gas distribution utility. The Commission concludes that Basil C. Pollitt has violated the statutes and regulations as set out hereinabove in the Findings of Fact.

The Commission, having reviewed the evidence of record and having been otherwise sufficiently advised, HEREBY ORDERS that:

- 1. Gas Group is assessed a civil penalty in the amount of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) for violating KRS 278.020.
- 2. Gas Group is assessed a civil penalty in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250) for violating KRS 278.160.
- 3. Gas Group is assessed a civil penalty in the amount of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) each for violating 49 CFR 192.707(a), 49 CFR 192.707(e)(2) (two violations), 49 CFR 192.615, and 49 CFR 199, or a total of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000) for violations of pipeline safety regulations.
- 4. Within 15 days of receipt of this Order, Gas Group shall file with the Commission, pursuant to KRS 278.020, its application for a certificate of convenience and necessity to operate a natural gas distribution system, and shall file, pursuant to KRS 278.160, its schedule of rates and conditions of service (tariff). If Gas Group fails to make the above filings within the time provided, the Commission shall take the necessary judicial steps to enforce this Order and to terminate operation of the natural gas distribution system.

5. Within 10 days of receipt of this Order, Gas Group shall pay to the Commonwealth of Kentucky the total sum of Twenty-five Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$25,750). This payment shall be made in the form of a cashier's check payable to "Treasurer, Commonwealth of Kentucky," and shall be mailed or delivered to Office of General Counsel, Public Service Commission, 730 Schenkel Lane, Post Office Box 615, Frankfort, Kentucky 40602.

ORDER

The Gas Group is a natural gas distribution system operating in an area north of Richardsville, Warren County, Kentucky. The Gas Group is subject to the regulatory and safety jurisdiction of the Commission pursuant to KRS 278.010(3)(b), KRS 278.040(2), KRS 278.990(1) and KRS 278.992(1).

The Commission regulates natural gas facilities pursuant to Title 807, Chapter 5 of the Kentucky Administrative Regulations, specifically including 807 KAR 5:022; 5:023; 5:026; 5:227; and, 5:031. Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:022 sets, *inter alia*, standards for safety, and 807 KAR 5:023 addresses antidrug and drug testing programs. In addition, the Commission enforces the minimum safety standards adopted by the United States Department of Transportation pursuant to the Federal Pipeline Safety Laws, 49 U.S.C. 4 Section 60101, et seq., and amendments thereto, pursuant to KRS 278.992(1).

On February 15, 1999, the District Office of the Department of Highways in Bowling Green, Kentucky contacted Commission Staff regarding a natural gas pipeline

at and near Highway 185 North of Richardsville, Warren County, Kentucky. Commission Staff determined that there are no records on file with the Commission relative to a natural gas distribution system or facility in the area reported. Specifically, Commission records reflect that <u>no</u> certificate of convenience and necessity has been issued as required by KRS 278.020, authorizing the construction and operation of a natural gas utility in the area along Highway 185 North of Richardsville. Pursuant to KRS 278.160 "[E]ach utility shall file with the Commission. . . , schedules showing all rates and conditions for service established by it and collected or enforced. . . ." The Gas Group has failed to make such filing with the Commission.

On February 16, 1999, Commission Staff, with the assistance of a representative of the State Fire Marshal, conducted, to the extent possible, an inspection of the Gas Group's facilities. Commission Staff was unable to determine the extent of the facilities because the owner or operator could not be located. Based upon said inspection, Commission Staff issued a Comprehensive Inspection Report ("Report") dated March 12, 1999 [copy attached]. Since that inspection was conducted, Commission Staff has attempted to contact and communicate with the alleged owner or operator of said facility without success.

An examination of the Commission's records establishes that Gas Group has failed to comply with KRS 278.020 and KRS 278.160 (numbered paragraphs 1 and 2 below). To the extent possible, the Report details the discovery of five (5) apparent violations of 807 KAR 5:022, 807 KAR 5:023, and 49 CFR 192 and 49 CFR 199 as follows (numbered paragraphs 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7):

- 1. The Commission has not issued a certificate of convenience and necessity authorizing the construction and operation of a natural gas utility in or near the area described herein above. KRS 278.020.
- 2. The Gas Group has failed to file any schedules of rates and conditions for service as required by KRS 278.160.
- 3. There are no line markers or signs to indicate the presence of a natural gas pipeline. 807 KAR 5:022, Section 14(5)(a) and 49 CFR 192.707(a).
- 4. There is pipeline aboveground on Anna Sandhill Road near Richardsville, Warren County, Kentucky. There is no sign marking the aboveground pipe which bears a telephone number to call in case of emergency. 807 KAR 5:022, Section 14(5)(c)(2) and 49 CFR 192.707(d)(2).
- 5. Customers of this facility are provided with no local telephone number to call in the event of an emergency. 807 KAR 5:022, Section 14(5)(d)(2) and 49 CFR 192.707(d)(2).
- 6. The Gas Group has not made contact with the appropriate fire, police and other public officials regarding actions to be taken during an emergency. 807 KAR 5:022, Section 13(9) and 49 CFR 192.615.
- 7. There is no proof that the Gas Group has an antidrug and alcohol plan. 807 KAR 5:023 and 49 CFR 199.

The Report notes that the facts as set out herein present a potentially dangerous situation because the gas field in this area of Warren County, Kentucky is known to produce hydrogen sulfide or "sour" gas and because the extent of the distribution system cannot be determined by observation of the aboveground pipe of the system.

The Commission, based upon the facts contained in the Comprehensive Inspection Report dated March 12, 1999, finds sufficient evidence to believe that the Gas Group has failed to comply with the above-identified provisions of KRS 278.020, Title 807, Chapter 5 and 49 CFR 192 and 199.

The Commission, on its own motion, HEREBY ORDERS that:

- The Gas Group shall submit to the Commission within 20 days from the date this Order is delivered to you a written response to the allegations contained in the Order and the Comprehensive Inspection Report.
- 2. The Gas Group shall appear on May 18, 1999, at 10:00 a.m., Eastern Daylight Time, in Hearing Room 1 of the Commission's offices at 730 Schenkel Lane, Frankfort, Kentucky for the purposes of presenting evidence regarding the alleged violations above-named and of showing cause, if any, why it should not be subject to the penalties prescribed in KRS 278.990(1) and KRS 278.992(1) for the alleged violations.
- 3. The Comprehensive Inspection Report dated March 12, 1999 is hereby made a part of the record herein.
- 4. Any request for an informal conference with Commission Staff to consider any matter which would expedite the handling or disposing of this proceeding shall be filed with the Commission no later than 20 days from the date of this Order.

COMPREHENSIVE INSPECTION REPORT

THE GAS GROUP Bowling Green, Kentucky

March 12, 1999

BRIEF

As a result of a query from the State Highway Department in Bowling Green, Kentucky, a partial inspection of a natural gas system known as The Gas Group was conducted. This inspection was conducted in accordance with the Public Service Commission's ("PSC") policy of inspecting all jurisdictional operators. Natural gas operators are jurisdictional to the PSC under KRS 278.040, 278.495 and also through a 5(a) Agreement with the United States Department of Transportation, Office of Pipeline Safety, for the enforcement of the Natural Gas Pipeline Safety Act of 1968.

INSPECTION

Assisted by Assistant State Fire Marshal, Alan Gregory, a partial inspection was conducted on February 16, 1999. During the investigation, several residential type meter sets were noted along Highway 185 in Warren County, Kentucky. Aboveground steel pipeline was also found on Anna SandHill Road. This aboveground steel piping was apparently connected to a gas compressor at some point in time. There is no compressor at this site at present; however, the gas lines are still active. Given the configuration of the meters, it must be assumed that this is a natural gas distribution system. Were it a farm tap system, the meters would be required to conform to farm

tap standards (2 regulators, automatic shut-off incorporated into the low-pressure regulator, and pressure relief valves).

Numerous violations of the pipeline safety standards were found and will be further discussed in the findings section of this report,

FINDINGS

The following deficiencies were found:

- 1. There are no line markers or signs to indicate the presence of a natural gas pipeline. 49 CFR 192.707(a) and 807 KAR 5:022, Section 14(5)(a).
- 2. The aboveground piping on Anna Sandhill Road has no sign with a telephone number to call in the event of an emergency. 49 CFR 192.707(d)(2) and KAR 5:022, Section 14(5)(c)(2).
- 3. Customers of this system have no local telephone number to call in the event of an emergency. 49 CFR 192.707(d)(2) and KAR 5:022, Section 14(5)(d)(2).
- 4. The Gas Group has not made contact with the appropriate fire, police and other public officials regarding actions to be taken during emergency situations. 49 CFR 192.615 and KAR 5:022, Section 13(9).
- 5. In the absence of any evidence to the contrary, it must be assumed that this company does not have an anti-drug or an alcohol plan. 49 CFR 199 and KAR 5:023.

RECOMMENDATIONS

It appears that a potentially dangerous situation exists on this pipeline. It is recommended that the Commission initiate a hearing to allow The Gas Group to show cause they should not be penalized to the fullest extent of the law. It should be further noted that the maximum penalty allowable is \$25,000 per day of violation not to exceed \$500,000.

19	A.	David Kinman, K-i-n-m-a-n.
20	Q.	Who are you employed by?
21	A.	The Public Service Commission of Kentucky.

23	A.	Since 1986.
24	Q.	What is your present position?
25	A.	Gas Pipeline Safety Investigator.

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1	Q.	How long have you held that position?
2	Α.	Since 1986.
3	Q.	What are the general duties and responsibilities of
4		your position?
5	A.	We investigate gas companies for code violations, the
6		Federal Pipeline Safety Code as well as the Kentucky
7		Public Service Commission Safety Code violations.
8	Q.	Is that all over the State of Kentucky?
9	A.	Yes, sir.
10	Q.	Did you work in the natural gas industry prior to your
11		employment with the Public Service Commission?
12	A.	Yes. I worked for a private concern for 15 years. We
13		dealt primarily with leakage.
14	Q.	Over the years of your experience involving natural
15		gas, have you ever had any special educational courses,
16		training, physical training, involving natural gas?
17	A.	Yes, sir. Over the years, I've had numerous classes
18		through the Kentucky Gas Association, and a requirement
19		for employment here is a seven week course at the
20		Transportation Safety Institute in Oklahoma City
21		dealing specifically with pipeline safety.
22	Q.	As time passes, do you continue to have courses and
23		training?
24	A.	Yes, sir, it's a continual process.
25	Q.	Do you know the name "The Gas Group"?
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1	A.	Yes, I do.
2	Q.	Do you know the name "Basil C. Pollitt,"
3	A.	Yes.
4	Q.	P-o-l-l-i-t-t?
5	A.	Yes, sir.
6	Q.	How did you get involved in this case?
7	A.	On February 15, 1999, the State Highway Department
8		District Engineer's Office out of Bowling Green called
9		our offices requesting information about a pipeline
10		running along Highway 185 near Richardsville. There
11		was some proposed construction, and they felt the
12		pipeline was in the way there and wanted to know if we
13		knew the owner. None of us here had any knowledge of a
14		pipeline in the area.
15	Q.	Okay. Did you say that's in Warren County?
16	A.	Yes, sir.
17	Q.	How far is Richardsville and in what direction from
18		Bowling Green?
19	A.	Richardsville is probably about ten or twelve miles
20		north of Bowling Green.
21	Q.	Okay. When did we get the call here at the Commission
22	i	regarding the Highway Department having a problem?
23	A.	February 15, 1999.
24	Q.	Do you know the name "Alan Gregory"?
25	A.	Yes, sir, I do.

1	Q.	Do you know the term "sour gas"?
2	A.	Yes, sir, I do.
3	Q.	Would you tell me what that means, please?
4	A.	It means natural gas that has a concentration of
5		hydrogen sulfide in it.
6	Q.	And why is sulfur - hydrogen sulfide?
7	A.	Yes, sir.
8	Q.	Tell the Commission why that's - tell them about it.
9	A.	Hydrogen sulfide is a very dangerous product. OSHA
10		allows eight hours exposure at 20 parts per million.
11		It's fatal at 700 parts per million. When it comes in
12		contact with moisture, it forms a diluted solution of
13		hydrochloric acid. When it's burned, it forms sulfur
14		dioxide, which is also toxic. It's harmful to the
15		piping, any metal.
16	Q.	Does it corrode the metal?
17	A.	Yes, sir.
18	Q.	In this particular area that we're talking about,
19		Highway 187
20	A.	185.
21	Q.	Highway 185 around Richardsville, has that area
22		of Kentucky and Warren County been known for wells that
23		produce hydrogen sulfide?
24	A.	Yes, it has.
25	Q.	Do you know whether or not this gas that we're talking

		shout in this system contains any?
1		about in this system contains any?
2	A.	No, sir, I don't, at this point.
3	Q.	What things or what matters do you need to know before
4		you and other Staff members in our Gas Pipeline Branch
5		here can take any other action?
6	A.	We need to know the source of the gas, how many wells,
7		where the valves are, where the regulators are,
8		compressors, if any. We need to see a map. We just
9		need to see an overall view of the whole thing to see
10		what's there.
11	Q.	Actually, other than the configuration that you
12		identified, you don't know what's there; do you?
13	A.	I have no idea.
14	Q.	Do you know where the wells are?
15	A.	No, sir.
16	Q.	Based upon your years of experience and service in the
17		natural gas field and your knowledge of producing wells
18		in this area of Kentucky, were you able to determine
19		whether or not in your mind this is a dangerous
20		situation?
21	A.	Yes, sir, I feel it is.
22	Q.	Is it dangerous more from what you don't know than what
23		we know?
24	A.	Yes.
25	Q.	I'm going to hand you a document, Mr. Kinman. Look
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1		that over and tell me what that is.
2	A.	It's an Order to appear before the Public Service
3		Commission.
4	Q.	Is that a Show Cause Order in this case?
5	A.	Yes, sir, it is.
6	Q.	Does it bear Case No. 99-130?
7	A.	That's correct.
8	Q.	Turn to Page 2. On that particular page, I have
9		highlighted the last sentence in Paragraph 2. Will you
10		read that, please?
11	A.	"Since that inspection was conducted, Commission Staff
12		has attempted to contact and communicate with the
13		alleged owner or operator of said facility without
14		success."

16		February 15, 1999, has Commission Staff tried to

22	A.	Basil Pollitt.
23	Q.	Do you believe that he's the owner and operator?
24	A.	Yes, sir, to the best of my knowledge, he is.

20	Q.	Is natural gas considered in that hazardous range?
21	A.	It falls into that range when it becomes either loose

1	Q.	Have you ever had to deal with natural gas emergencies,
2	:	leaks, fires?
3	A.	Yes, sir, that's part of my response package.

6	A.	Yes, sir, I've had training in NFPA 54 and NFPA 58.
7	Q.	What is your territory that you cover?
8	A.	The area includes Warren County and the ten counties
9		surrounding that general area, sir.
10	Q.	Okay. Mr. Gregory, you've sat and listened to Mr.
11		Kinman's testimony,
12	A.	Yes, sir.
13	Q.	and, in order not to get redundant, is there
14		anything that you disagree with on what he said in his
15		testimony?
16	A.	No, sir.
17	Q.	Would you sort of adopt his testimony as yours?
18	A.	Yes, sir.
19	Q.	Did you and Mr. Kinman locate and talk to a consumer
20		that's using gas from this system?
21	A.	Yes, sir.
22	Q.	Do you remember who it was?
23	A.	It was a Doss. The name on the mailbox and the name
24		there was a Donald Doss.

2		Could you spell that, please?
3	A.	D
4	Q.	It's Goss; isn't it?
5	A.	G-o-s-s, Goss.
6	Q.	Now, what did she say when you talked to her?
7	A.	She told us where she was buying her gas from. She
8		also had several complaints about the gas. She
9		couldn't keep - her appliances that were on gas she had
10		a hard time keeping it running. She also had a hard
11		time getting anybody there to service it.
12	Q.	Did she give you a name of a person in charge?
13	A.	Yes, sir, she did.
14	Q.	And what name was that?
15	A.	Basil Pollitt.
16	Q.	Okay. That's it. Did you also get a gas bill or a
17		statement for gas services from Ms. Goss?
18	A.	Yes, sir, I received one from her daughter.
19	Q.	Is that a copy of Donald Goss' gas bill?
20	A.	Yes, sir, it is.
21	Q.	Where does he live?
22	A.	It's showing 8748 Highway 185.
23	Q.	Bowling Green?
24	A.	Bowling Green.
25	Q.	Do you see a meter reading time on there or a date, the

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1		top left-hand part?
2	A.	Oh, meter reading 25 January, '99.
3	Q.	Okay. What is printed on the form, the gas bill or gas
4		statement form, at the top?
5	Α.	At the top? "The Gas Group, 818" it looks like "Rugby
6		Place, Louisville."
7	Q.	Okay. Now, the top line, doesn't it read "The Gas
8		Group, Inc."?
9	A.	Yes, sir.
10	Q.	Okay. Now, what's printed on the gas bill at the
11		bottom?
12	A.	The Gas Group, Inc.
13	Q.	Address?
14	Α.	818 Rugby Place, Louisville, Kentucky.
15	Q.	Okay. Now, where is the original of this gas bill?
16	A.	Apparently, the original is either misplaced or in a
17		different file.
18	Q.	Is it your testimony that you personally made a copy of
19		this gas bill?
20	A.	Yes, sir. It was made here in the Public Service
21		Building.
22	Q.	Okay.
23	A.	I hand carried it up here.
24	Q.	And is that a copy of it?
25	A.	Yes, sir.

ORDER

The Gas Group is a natural gas distribution system operating in an area north of Richardsville, Warren County, Kentucky. The Gas Group is subject to the regulatory and safety jurisdiction of the Commission pursuant to KRS 278.010(3)(b), KRS 278.040(2), KRS 278.990(1) and KRS 278.992(1).

The Commission regulates natural gas facilities pursuant to Title 807, Chapter 5 of the Kentucky Administrative Regulations, specifically including 807 KAR 5:022; 5:023; 5:026; 5:227; and, 5:031. Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:022 sets, *inter alia*, standards for safety, and 807 KAR 5:023 addresses antidrug and drug testing programs. In addition, the Commission enforces the minimum safety standards adopted by the United States Department of Transportation pursuant to the Federal Pipeline Safety Laws, 49 U.S.C. 4 Section 60101, et seq., and amendments thereto, pursuant to KRS 278.992(1).

On February 15, 1999, the District Office of the Department of Highways in Bowling Green, Kentucky contacted Commission Staff regarding a natural gas pipeline

at and near Highway 185 North of Richardsville, Warren County, Kentucky. Commission Staff determined that there are no records on file with the Commission relative to a natural gas distribution system or facility in the area reported. Specifically, Commission records reflect that <u>no</u> certificate of convenience and necessity has been issued as required by KRS 278.020, authorizing the construction and operation of a natural gas utility in the area along Highway 185 North of Richardsville. Pursuant to KRS 278.160 "[E]ach utility shall file with the Commission. . . , schedules showing all rates and conditions for service established by it and collected or enforced. . . ." The Gas Group has failed to make such filing with the Commission.

On February 16, 1999, Commission Staff, with the assistance of a representative of the State Fire Marshal, conducted, to the extent possible, an inspection of the Gas Group's facilities. Commission Staff was unable to determine the extent of the facilities because the owner or operator could not be located. Based upon said inspection, Commission Staff issued a Comprehensive Inspection Report ("Report") dated March 12, 1999 [copy attached]. Since that inspection was conducted, Commission Staff has attempted to contact and communicate with the alleged owner or operator of said facility without success.

An examination of the Commission's records establishes that Gas Group has failed to comply with KRS 278.020 and KRS 278.160 (numbered paragraphs 1 and 2 below). To the extent possible, the Report details the discovery of five (5) apparent violations of 807 KAR 5:022, 807 KAR 5:023, and 49 CFR 192 and 49 CFR 199 as follows (numbered paragraphs 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7):

- 1. The Commission has not issued a certificate of convenience and necessity authorizing the construction and operation of a natural gas utility in or near the area described herein above. KRS 278.020.
- 2. The Gas Group has failed to file any schedules of rates and conditions for service as required by KRS 278.160.
- 3. There are no line markers or signs to indicate the presence of a natural gas pipeline. 807 KAR 5:022, Section 14(5)(a) and 49 CFR 192.707(a).
- 4. There is pipeline aboveground on Anna Sandhill Road near Richardsville, Warren County, Kentucky. There is no sign marking the aboveground pipe which bears a telephone number to call in case of emergency. 807 KAR 5:022, Section 14(5)(c)(2) and 49 CFR 192.707(d)(2).
- 5. Customers of this facility are provided with no local telephone number to call in the event of an emergency. 807 KAR 5:022, Section 14(5)(d)(2) and 49 CFR 192.707(d)(2).
- 6. The Gas Group has not made contact with the appropriate fire, police and other public officials regarding actions to be taken during an emergency. 807 KAR 5:022, Section 13(9) and 49 CFR 192.615.
- 7. There is no proof that the Gas Group has an antidrug and alcohol plan. 807 KAR 5:023 and 49 CFR 199.

The Report notes that the facts as set out herein present a potentially dangerous situation because the gas field in this area of Warren County, Kentucky is known to produce hydrogen sulfide or "sour" gas and because the extent of the distribution system cannot be determined by observation of the aboveground pipe of the system.

COMPREHENSIVE INSPECTION REPORT

THE GAS GROUP Bowling Green, Kentucky

March 12, 1999

BRIEF

As a result of a query from the State Highway Department in Bowling Green, Kentucky, a partial inspection of a natural gas system known as The Gas Group was conducted. This inspection was conducted in accordance with the Public Service Commission's ("PSC") policy of inspecting all jurisdictional operators. Natural gas operators are jurisdictional to the PSC under KRS 278.040, 278.495 and also through a 5(a) Agreement with the United States Department of Transportation, Office of Pipeline Safety, for the enforcement of the Natural Gas Pipeline Safety Act of 1968.

<u>INSPECTION</u>

Assisted by Assistant State Fire Marshal, Alan Gregory, a partial inspection was conducted on February 16, 1999. During the investigation, several residential type meter sets were noted along Highway 185 in Warren County, Kentucky. Aboveground steel pipeline was also found on Anna SandHill Road. This aboveground steel piping was apparently connected to a gas compressor at some point in time. There is no compressor at this site at present; however, the gas lines are still active. Given the configuration of the meters, it must be assumed that this is a natural gas distribution system. Were it a farm tap system, the meters would be required to conform to farm

tap standards (2 regulators, automatic shut-off incorporated into the low-pressure regulator, and pressure relief valves).

Numerous violations of the pipeline safety standards were found and will be further discussed in the findings section of this report,

FINDINGS

The following deficiencies were found:

- 1. There are no line markers or signs to indicate the presence of a natural gas pipeline. 49 CFR 192.707(a) and 807 KAR 5:022, Section 14(5)(a).
- 2. The aboveground piping on Anna Sandhill Road has no sign with a telephone number to call in the event of an emergency. 49 CFR 192.707(d)(2) and KAR 5:022, Section 14(5)(c)(2).
- 3. Customers of this system have no local telephone number to call in the event of an emergency. 49 CFR 192.707(d)(2) and KAR 5:022, Section 14(5)(d)(2).
- 4. The Gas Group has not made contact with the appropriate fire, police and other public officials regarding actions to be taken during emergency situations. 49 CFR 192.615 and KAR 5:022, Section 13(9).
- 5. In the absence of any evidence to the contrary, it must be assumed that this company does not have an anti-drug or an alcohol plan. 49 CFR 199 and KAR 5:023.

RECOMMENDATIONS

It appears that a potentially dangerous situation exists on this pipeline. It is recommended that the Commission initiate a hearing to allow The Gas Group to show cause they should not be penalized to the fullest extent of the law. It should be further noted that the maximum penalty allowable is \$25,000 per day of violation not to exceed \$500,000.


