ORDER

The City of Warsaw, Kentucky ("Warsaw") and Gallatin County Water District ("Gallatin District") have agreed upon a rate which Warsaw will charge for wholesale water service and submitted this Agreement to the Commission. This action follows Warsaw's application for an adjustment of its current wholesale rate, Gallatin District's objection to the proposed adjustment, and the initiation of this proceeding to investigate the proposed adjustment. Warsaw originally propsed a wholesale rate of \$1.50 per 1,000 gallons of water. The parties agreed to a wholesale rate of \$1.50 per 1,000 gallons of water.

Having considered the Agreement and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the Commission finds that the agreed rate should be approved. The purpose of the Commission's jurisdiction over a municipal utility's wholesale transactions with a public utility is to ensure that any public utility "consumer/customer that has contracted and become dependent for its supply of water from a city utility is not subject to either excessive rates or inadequate service." Simpson County Water District v. City of Franklin, Ky., 872 S.W.2d 460, 465 (1994).

In the case at bar, this purpose has been served. The public utility that purchases water from Warsaw made clear its objections to the proposed rate adjustment. Warsaw has apparently addressed Gallatin District's concerns and the parties have reached

agreement on the appropriate rates for service for future years and the maximum quantity of water that Gallatin District may purchase from Warsaw on a monthly basis.

As the Agreement on its face appears neither unreasonable nor unconscionable, the Commission sees no need to conduct further proceedings in this matter.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. The Agreement, a copy of which is appended hereto, is approved.
- 2. The rate and conditions of service for wholesale water service set forth in the Agreement are approved for service rendered by Warsaw to Gallatin District on and after the date of this Order.
- 3. Warsaw shall, within 30 days of the date of this Order, file tariff sheets that reflect the rate and conditions of service approved herein.

AMENDMENT TO WATER PURCHASE AGREEMENT

This Amendment of the Water Purchase Contract by and between the parties hereto dated July 28, 1986, entered into on the day and year set forth hereinbelow, by and between the City of Warsaw, Kentucky, Seller, party of the first part, and the Gallatin County Water District, Buyer, party of the second part.

WITNESSETH: That for and in consideration of the agreements, promises and undertakings herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Section A(1) of the Water Purchase Contract dated July 28, 1986, by and between these parties shall be amended to provide that the maximum allowable quantity of water purchased from Seller by Buyer per month shall be twelve million (12,000,000) gallons.
- 2. Section C(1) of the subject contract shall be amended to provide that the term of the contract shall extend for a term expiring January 1, 2045.
- 3. For and during the period commencing herewith and expiring January 1, 2002, the rate charged to Buyer shall be One Dollar and five cents (\$1.05) per thousand gallons purchased and Buyer shall purchase from Seller, per month, a minimum of five million (5,000,000) gallons. From and after January 1, 2002, the forgoing rate and purchase requirement provisions shall be subject to review, adjustment and revision in accordance with agreement of the parties, or orders of a court or regulatory agency of competent jurisdiction, as the case may be. In the absence of adjustment or revision of the foregoing terms as aforesaid, the same shall continue in full force and effect.
- 4. In all other respects not inconsistent herewith, the terms and provisions of said Water Purchase Contract dated July 28, 1986 shall remain in full force and effect.

ORDER

On October 13, 1999, the Commission directed the city of Warsaw, Kentucky ("Warsaw") to show cause why, as a result of Warsaw's failure to comply with the Commission's Orders of August 6, 1999 and September 3, 1999, this proceeding should not be dismissed and Warsaw's proposed wholesale rate adjustment be denied. In its response to our Order, Warsaw has advised that it has been engaged in negotiations with Gallatin County Water District ("Gallatin District") and that the parties have reached a tentative agreement. Warsaw further requests that the Commission grant "another continuance . . . for the parties to finalize their settlement."

While settlement negotiations are an integral part of many rate adjustment proceedings, such negotiations should not interfere with the orderly administration of those proceedings. In this proceeding, Warsaw has yet to file any documentary evidence to support its proposed rate adjustment or meet the minimal filing requirements imposed by the Commission's Order of August 6, 1999. It filed its proposed rate adjustment with the Commission more than 6 months ago. Given the limited time remaining before an order must be rendered in this proceeding, see KRS 278.190(3), the Commission cannot adequately review Warsaw's proposed rates should settlement negotiations fail.

While the Commission will grant the requested continuance, we place Warsaw and all other municipal utilities on notice that settlement negotiations will no longer be reviewed as an acceptable grounds for disturbing the discovery and hearing process. Municipal utilities should conduct their negotiations either prior to the filing of their proposed rate adjustments or concurrent with the discovery process before the Commission. While the Commission continues to encourage amicable settlement of rate disputes between municipal and public utilities, we cannot allow the orderly administration of the Commission's statutory duties to be held hostage to the parties' lackadaisical approach to negotiation. In this regard, we intend to hold municipal utilities to the same standard imposed upon public utilities.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. Warsaw's Motion for Continuance is granted.
- 2. Within 20 days of the date of this Order, Warsaw shall file with the Commission its settlement agreement with Gallatin District.
- 3. If Warsaw fails to file with the Commission its settlement agreement with Gallatin District within 20 days of the date of this Order, this proceeding shall be closed and Warsaw's proposed wholesale rate adjustment shall be denied.
 - 4. No further Order shall be necessary to implement Ordering Paragraph 3.

On August 6, 1999, the Commission directed the city of Warsaw, Kentucky ("Warsaw") to file within 21 days certain information in support of its proposed wholesale rate adjustment. On September 3, 1999, the Commission, upon Warsaw's request, extended the time for submission of this information until September 27, 1999. As of the date of this Order, Warsaw has not filed the requested information.

The Commission, on its own motion, HEREBY ORDERS that Warsaw show cause in writing within 10 days of the date of this Order why as a result of its failure to comply with the Commission's Orders of August 6, 1999 and September 3, 1999, this proceeding should not be dismissed and Warsaw's proposed wholesale rate adjustment be denied.







ORDER

The city of Warsaw, Kentucky ("Warsaw") has proposed to adjust its existing rate for wholesale water service to Gallatin County Water District ("Gallatin District"). Warsaw proposes that these revisions become effective on and after May 1, 1999. Gallatin District has requested that the Commission suspend and investigate the proposed rate adjustment and has further moved to intervene in any Commission investigation of the proposed rate adjustment.

Having considered the proposed rate adjustment and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the Commission finds that, pursuant to KRS 278.190, further proceedings are necessary to determine the reasonableness of the proposed rate.

The Commission further finds that Gallatin District has a special interest in this proceeding which is not otherwise adequately represented and that its intervention is likely to present issues or to develop facts that assist the Commission in fully considering the matter without unduly complicating or disrupting this proceeding.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. Warsaw's proposed rates are suspended for five months from May 1, 1999 up to and including September 30,1999.
- 2. Within 30 days of the date of this Order, Warsaw shall submit the information required by Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:001, Section 10. To the extent that Warsaw considers any of the requirements of this regulation to be onerous or inapplicable, it may petition for a deviation from them.
- 3. Gallatin District is made a party to this proceeding. Any party filing testimony, exhibits, pleadings, correspondence or any other documents with the Commission shall serve a copy of such documents on Gallatin District.
