ORDER

Delta Natural Gas Company, Inc. ("Delta") is a natural gas utility, pursuant to KRS 278.010(3)(b) and, as a natural gas utility, Delta is subject to Commission jurisdiction, pursuant to KRS 278.040 and 278.495.

KRS 278.280(2) directs the Commission to prescribe rules and regulations for the performance of services by utilities. Commission Staff has submitted to the Commission an Incident Investigation Report dated February 10, 1999, which alleges that Delta violated 807 KAR 5:027, Section 3(1)(c), which states:

Telephonic Notice of Certain Incidents. (1) At the earliest practicable moment but no later than two (2) hours following discovery, each utility shall give notice to the commission in accordance with subsection (3) of this section of any incident that: (c) Results in gas ignition.

The following facts are undisputed:

- 1. On February 6, 1999, an employee of Delta was notified of a natural gas line rupture and ignition.
- 2. On February 8, 1999, the Commission received notice from Delta that a service line break and natural gas fire had occurred on February 6, 1999.

Delta does not contest its violation of 807 KAR 5:027, Section 3(1)(c), but Delta does contest the assessment of any civil penalty for this violation. Delta has waived a public hearing and has agreed that this case is to be submitted to the Commission for a decision upon the record as to the assessment of a penalty, if any.

Delta's response describes several steps it has taken to mitigate the failure to comply with the regulation as reasons not to assess a penalty. Delta states that it had posted notices and had informed its employees of the required notification procedures and that the violation was due to human error.

Delta maintains that it violated a reporting regulation rather than a safety regulation, stating that when the supervisor learned of the incident, Delta reported it forthwith to the Commission. Delta also pointed out its good safety record.

Delta believes that, for the above reasons and in consideration of the actions it has taken (as outlined in its response), Delta should be exempt from the assessment of a civil penalty.

The Commission finds that Delta's argument that it violated a non-safety regulation is not well taken. This administrative regulation, 807 KAR 5:027, establishes rules which apply to reports of leaks by natural gas utilities. Section 2 of 807 KAR 5:027 establishes the scope of the regulation.

(1) This administrative regulation prescribes requirements for reporting gas leaks that are not intended by the utility and that require immediate or scheduled repair....

The Commission finds that the above regulation is in fact a safety regulation in that reporting gas leaks is a major element of the safety of the public. Failure to comply

with that safety regulation is a violation under the provisions of KRS 278.992(1) for which a civil penalty is required.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

- 1. Delta has violated 807 KAR 5:027, Section 3(1)(c).
- 2. Delta is assessed a civil penalty of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for the violation. Within 10 days of the date of this Order, Delta shall pay to the Commonwealth of Kentucky the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00). This payment shall be in the form of a cashier's or certified check made payable to Treasurer, Commonwealth of Kentucky, and shall be mailed or delivered to the Office of General Counsel, Public Service Commission, 730 Schenkel Lane, Post Office Box 615, Frankfort, Kentucky 40602.

An informal conference was held on May 12, 1999 at the Commission's offices, as requested by Delta Natural Gas Company, Inc. ("Delta"), in its response filed May 7, 1999. Delta choose not to have its attorney present. Those present at the informal conference were:

For Delta: Johnny Caudill and Mike Robinson;

Commission Staff: J. R. Goff, Eddie Smith, William Bowker and Larry Amburgey

The Commission staff outlined the purpose of the meeting and the facts of the alleged violation and noted the response filed by Delta. The representatives of Delta did not contest the violation, but did contest the assessment of any civil penalty for the following reasons:

- 1. Delta had posted notices and had informed its employees of the required notification procedures and that the violation was due to human error.
- 2. The violation was not a safety violation, but a violation of a reporting regulation. Delta stated that when the supervisor learned of the incident it was reported forthwith to the Commission.
- 3. Delta also pointed out that it has a good safety record and that it has consistently cooperated with the Commission Staff.

Delta believes that, for the above reasons and in consideration of the actions it took as outlined in its Response, it should be relieved from the assessment of any civil penalty.

Commission staff stated that it would recommend a civil penalty of \$500 for the violation as being consistent with prior Commission penalty levies for this type of violation.

Delta and Commission staff agreed that this case is to be submitted to the Commission upon the record for a decision as to the assessment of a penalty, if any, and that Delta waives the public hearing set for May 25, 1999.

RESPONSE OF DELTA NATURAL GAS COMPANY, INC. TO ORDER OF APRIL 27, 1999, AND MOTION FOR INFORMAL CONFERENCE

Delta Natural Gas Company, Inc. ("Delta") respectfully submits this Response to the Order of April 27, 1999, herein. While Delta does not dispute the factual recitation of the failure to report the incident in the Order, it believes that it should not be penalized as a result thereof.

Specifically, Delta does not dispute the Investigation Report dated February 10, 1999, appended to the Order as an Appendix. Delta has investigated the incident and it appears that the Delta employee, Bob Wells, who was on call on February 6, 1999, went to a plastic service line cut, found that natural gas had ignited and extinguished the fire and restored service. He failed to report the incident to the Commission within two (2) hours as required by 807 KAR 5:027, Section 3(1)(c) and Delta Division Manager, Mike Robinson, did so on February 8, 1999. The incident occurred on a Saturday and it was reported to the Commission on the following Monday.

Mr. Wells, and all Delta Customer Service Representatives, had been provided training relative to the reporting of natural gas emergencies or accidents to the Commission prior to the incident in question. In addition, on the date of the incident in question, copies of the Commission

guidelines on the reporting of such incidents are posted on the bulletin boards in the work locations of Delta's Customer Service Representatives. Mr. Wells advised his supervisors that he simply did not think to report the incident. While this does not excuse Mr. Wells' failure to comply with the incident reporting regulation, Delta had taken all reasonable means to assure that its employees follow the rules. Since the incident occurred on the weekend, Mr. Wells was pretty much on his own and his supervisor was unable to remind him of his responsibilities.

Delta has taken several steps to mitigate the failure to comply with the incident reporting regulation. Since this incident, verbal and written instructions about compliance with the incident reporting procedures have been communicated to all Delta Customer Service Supervisors by their respective Division Managers. A copy of the e-mail instructions is attached hereto as Exhibit A. Delta's regularly scheduled training of its Customer Service Supervisors, Customer Service Representatives and Customer Representatives about Delta's Emergency Operating Plan, which includes incident reporting procedures, will occur in May and June of 1999. These training sessions had been scheduled since before the incident in question occurred.

Winford Adkins, Delta's Customer Service Supervisor to whom Mr. Wells reports, Mike Robinson, Mr. Wells' Division Manager, and Johnny Caudill, Delta's Vice-President - Administration and Customer Service, have all met with Mr. Wells and reprimanded him for his failure to comply with the regulation. In addition, Delta will not grant Mr. Wells an increase in his salary effective July 1, 1999, which would have otherwise been considered.

Delta had taken reasonable measures to assure that the incident reporting regulation was followed when the incident occurred. Delta has taken all conceivable steps to assure that the incident

reporting regulation is not violated in the future. It is respectfully submitted that it should not be penalized for the failure to report the February 6 incident as promptly as the regulation requires.

Further, pursuant to the Order of April 27, 1999, Delta respectfully moves the Commission to schedule an informal conference with Commission Staff to consider matters which would aid in the handling or disposition of this proceeding.

<u>ORDER</u>

Delta Natural Gas Company, Inc. ("Delta") is a Kentucky corporation and is a utility, pursuant to KRS 278.010(3)(b). As a natural gas utility, Delta is subject to Commission jurisdiction, pursuant to KRS 278.040 and 278.495.

KRS 278.280(2) directs the Commission to prescribe rules and regulations for the performance of services by utilities. Pursuant to this statutory directive, the Commission promulgated 807 KAR 5:027, Section 3(1)(c), which requires utilities to give notice to the Commission of any incident that results in gas ignition.

Commission Staff has submitted to the Commission an Incident Investigation Report dated February 10, 1999, which alleges:

- 1. On February 6, 1999, an employee of Delta was notified of a natural gas line rupture and ignition. The Delta employee extinguished the fire and service was restored in one hour.
- 2. On February 8, 1999, the Commission received notice from Delta that a service line break and natural gas fire had occurred on February 6, 1999.

3. 807 KAR 5:027, Section 3(1)(c), requires that the Commission be notified by the utility at the earliest practicable moment, but no later than two hours following the discovery of gas ignition.

Based on its review of the Incident Investigation Report, and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the Commission finds that *prima facie* evidence exists that Delta failed to comply with Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:027, Section 3(1)(c).

The Commission, on its own motion, HEREBY ORDERS that:

- 1. Delta shall appear before the Commission on May 25, 1999, at 10:30 a.m., Eastern Daylight Time, in Hearing Room 1 of the Commission's offices at 730 Schenkel Lane, Frankfort, Kentucky, for the purpose of presenting evidence concerning the alleged violation of Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:027, Section 3(1)(c), and of showing cause why it should not be subject to the penalties prescribed in KRS 278.990 and 278.992(1) for this alleged violation.
- Delta shall submit to the Commission within 15 days of the date of this
 Order a written response to the allegations contained in the Incident Investigation
 Report.
- 3. The Incident Investigation Report of February 10, 1999, a copy of which is appended hereto, is made a part of the record in this proceeding.
- 4. Any motion requesting an informal conference with Commission Staff to consider matters which would aid in the handling or disposition of this proceeding shall be filed with the Commission no later than 20 days from the date of this Order.

BRIEF

On February 6, 1999, an employee of Delta Natural Gas Company, Inc. ("Delta")

was notified of a natural gas line that had been cut and had ignited. The on-call employee for that day put the fire out. This incident investigation is conducted in accordance with Public Service Commission ("PSC") policy of inspecting all jurisdictional gas operators. Natural gas operators are jurisdictional to the PSC under KRS 278.040, 278.495 and also through a 5(a) agreement with the United States Department of Transportation, Office of Pipeline Safety, for the enforcement of the Natural Gas Pipeline Safety Act of 1968.

INVESTIGATION

At 2:20 p.m., February 8, 1999, the PSC received a telephonic notice from Mike Robinson, Customer Service, Northern Division Manager for Delta, that a service line break had occurred at 11:12 a.m., February 6, 1999, on Morgan Fork Road, Clearfield, Kentucky. The Delta employee on call went to that location and found that a 1-inch plastic service line had been cut and the natural gas had ignited. He put the fire out and had service restored in an hour.

Commission Regulation, 807 KAR 5:027, Section 3(1)(c), requires this Commission be notified at the earliest practicable moment but no later than two (2)

hours following discovery; each utility shall give notice to the Commission in accordance with subsection (3) of this section of any incident that results in gas ignition.

CONCLUSION

Delta is in violation of existing regulations because it did not notify this Commission at the earliest practicable moment, but no later than two (2) hours after the incident, per 807 KAR 5:027, Section 3(1)(c), as required by Commission Regulations. More than forty hours elapsed before this Commission was notified.

RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that Delta review its notification policy with employees that are required to respond to such instances. Please provide this Commission with results of this notification.

It is further recommended that the Commission initiate a hearing to allow Delta to show cause why it should not be penalized for failure to comply with Commission regulations.
