#### ORDER

On August 3, 1999, P.R. Wasterwater Management, Inc. ("P.R.") filed an application for Commission approval to increase its monthly flat rate of \$17.69 by \$8.61 to \$26.30 or 48.67 percent. The proposed rates will generate additional annual revenues of \$13,683, an increase of 58.07 percent above normalized operating revenues.

By Order dated September 17, 1999, the Commission issued a Staff Report that was prepared upon review of P.R.'s test-year operations. Staff's report recommended that P.R.'s requested increase be granted. The Order directed all parties to file comments on the Staff Report or request a hearing or informal conference within 10 days of the date of the Order or the case would stand submitted. The Commission received comments from several of the intervenors.

On November 18, 1999, an informal conference was scheduled to discuss P.R.'s application, Staff's report and the comments thereto. Present at the conference were members of Commission Staff, Lawren Just and Lisa Bush of P.R., David Spenard from the Office of Attorney General, and Intervenors John Mann and Joe Burkhardt. Intervenors Pattie Headie and Marie Edwards were not in attendance.

A memorandum summarizing the discussion at the conference was entered into the record and delivered to all parties on January 19, 2000. The memorandum noted that all intervening parties present at the conference would agree to the contents of the Staff Report if P.R. agreed to submit a rate application once 170 single-family residences are occupied or under construction or in three years, whichever first occurs. P. R. agreed. Commission Staff advised the parties that if a Settlement Agreement was entered into, it must include all parties of record, including those not in attendance at the conference. To date the Commission has not received a Settlement Agreement.

On March 17, 2000, the Commission issued an Order stating that any party desiring a public hearing in this matter should file a written request within 10 days or the case would stand submitted. No such request was received.

The Commission, having considered the evidence of record and being otherwise sufficiently advised, finds that:

- 1. The recommendations and findings contained in the Staff Report are supported by the evidence of record, are reasonable, and should be adopted as the findings of the Commission.
- 2. The rates set forth in Appendix A will produce annual revenue from sewer service of \$37,246.

#### IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. The findings contained in the Staff Report are adopted and incorporated by reference into this Order as if fully set out herein.
- 2. The rates set forth in Appendix A are approved for service rendered by P.R. on and after the date of this Order.

3. Within 30 days of the date of this Order, P.R. shall file with the Commission its revised tariff setting out the rates approved herein.

On November 18, 1999, the Commission held a conference in this case at the Commission's offices in Frankfort, Kentucky. Present were:

Beginning the conference, Anita Mitchell explained the procedure and stated that Commission Staff would prepare minutes of the conference for the case record, that a copy of the minutes would be provided to all parties, and that all parties would have the opportunity to submit written comments upon the minutes.

Ms. Mitchell explained to the participants that the conference was scheduled to provide Commission Staff and the parties the opportunity to meet and discuss the issues raised by the intervenors.

A brief discussion was held regarding the application process and the fact that a utility may, pursuant to 807 KAR 5:076, Section 3, request Commission assistance in preparing its application.

A discussion was then held concerning the owner/manager fee. Mark Frost of Commission Staff explained that the \$3,600 recommended for the owner/manager fee is typical. He explained that the responsibilities of a owner/manager of a sewer system are similar to that of a water commissioner of a water district and that water

commissioner's salaries are set by statute at \$3,600. Ms. Just stated that she has never taken the owner/manager fee. She explained that the fee has simply accrued.

The participants then discussed North Shelby Water Company ("North Shelby") doing the billing and collection for P.R. Wastewater. Ms. Just stated that she had contacted North Shelby to see if North Shelby would be interested in doing the billing and collection for P.R. Wastewater, but stated that she had not received a response. She stated that as soon as she heard something from them she would advise the Commission. Ms. Just stated that even if North Shelby agreed to do the billing and collection, there would be some accounting required of P.R. Wastewater.

Mr. Mann questioned why the interest on long-term debt was calculated using 5 years rather than the full mortgage period. Mr. Frost explained that the interest is calculated using the period of time the rates are expected to be in effect.

A discussion was held on whether the sewage charge should be based on water usage. It was noted that water usage records are not available to P.R. Wastewater. It was also noted that the Department of Water requires plant capacity to be based on the number of residential customers to be served and that operational costs depend on plant capacity, not individual customer usage. Ms. Just proposed that the clubhouse be assessed on a residential equivalent basis to lessen any subsidization.

Mr. Spenard asked Mr. Mann and Mr. Burkhardt if they would agree to Commission Staff's recommendation if they were given assurance by the utility that it will come back in for review at a certain point in time. They stated that they were agreeable if P.R. Wastewater would agree to come back in for review when 170 single-family residences are occupied or under construction or in three years, whichever first occurs. Commission Staff advised the participants that if a Settlement Agreement is entered into it must include all parties of record, including those not in attendance at the informal conference.

The conference was adjourned.

#### WRITTEN COMMENTS ON INFORMATION REQUEST AND STAFF REPORT:

This Intervenor submits these written comments on Case 99-331 on the information received from the Applicant on October 6, 1999 as well as the Staff Report dated September 17, 1999:

#### 1) Information is again incomplete.

This Intervenor asked on October 4, 1999 for complete answers to the Attorney General questions. Exhibit A are the answers that were received from the Applicant. The answers are incomplete. Specifically, question 5: No copy was enclosed.

#### 2) Question 3 incomplete:

The Applicant states that Lisa Fields is not paid. However the test year shows a \$1,945 expense for outside services. An explanation is needed for that expense, as well a justification for the increase of that amount to \$5,545.

The Applicant states that Lawren A. Just has never taken any pay out of the corporation as the owner/operator; however, the Commission grants a \$3,600 owner fee to the Applicant, which Lawren A. Just owns.

#### 3) Question 9 is incomplete:

A maintenance fee of \$4, 200 is being requested to be paid to the Persimmon Ridge Development Company, however the Applicant does not present any information that will justify this expense, but merely states that this expense is not separated from all other maintenance expenses of Persimmon Ridge Development. The expenses allocated to the Applicant should be validated.

#### 4) Question 10 schedule not received:

A Schedule detailing the \$2, 855 the Internal Supervision and Engineering expense was not received. Various invoices were received, however this Intervenor could not reconcile the invoices to that amount.

#### 5) Question 15 not answered:

The Applicant merely states that the costs was absorbed by the Persimmon Ridge Development. The actual costs of are needed to validate the correct cost.

#### 6) Further comment on the Commission Staff Report:

This Intervenor requests that the Staff do a further rigorous review based these comments to the cost assumptions in order to ascertain the correct costs of operation.

In addition, there are other bills related to office work that require minimal time on a monthly basis. These would include posting and payment of utilities, laboratory, chemical and other incidental bills that may be incurred.

### WRITTEN COMMENTS ON APPLICATION, STAFF REPORT, AND INFORMATION REQUESTS

This Intervenor submits these written comments on Case 99-331:

#### 1) Staff report is biased:

The PSC staff was asked by the Applicant on March 31, 1999 for assistance in the preparation of the application. The Staff provided that assistance. The staff review was a limited financial review to whether the revenues and expenses were representative of normal operations. Immaterial discrepancies were not pursued. The Staff report submitted in case: 99-331 did no further investigation than what was done in helping the applicant prepare the application. This is akin to the foxes guarding the hen house.

The Applicant is part of a conglomerate that uses the same office, staff, utilities, and equipment. A careful review of invoices, job descriptions, time cards, tax returns, etc. need be done by the Staff to insure that expenses allocated to the Applicant are proper. Until that is done, there is no evidence that the expenses stated are properly the Applicant's.

Using the same information that was developed for the application without investigation cited above is not an objective review but must be considered biased as the Staff is reviewing its own work.

#### 2) Attorney General's questions not answered:

The answers that this Intervenor received from the Applicant does not answer all the questions that the Attorney General raised. Exhibit A are the answers that the Intervenor received on September 29th, two days after the period for comments had expired. Specifically, answers to questions no: 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, and 19 were not received by the Intervenor. Answers to these questions would help in determining the correct cost of operating the plant.

Since these questions have not been answered as requested, the intervenor does not have the all information requested in this case. The Intervenor needs complete answers to all questions.

#### 3) Billing costs are too high:

The billing costs being requested by the Applicant is \$49.95 per customer per year. Previously the billing charge was \$24 per customer per year. The lower charge was done by using an outside service (North Shelby Water Company) to bill the accounts. The Applicant is now requesting over 100% increase to bill accounts. This is excessive based on past history. The Applicant should use a more cost effective method for the billing.

#### 4) Flat Rate is discriminatory:

The flat rate method of determining usage discriminates against smaller households. Again, previously the waste water charge was based on water usage. North Shelby Water Company use water usage and to that applied the waste water surcharge. This gives a truer cost to each customer, as the waste water processing costs are based on actual usage, not a flat rate.

#### 5) Time extension for hearings and comments:

This Intervenor will be out of the state until October 29, 1999. It is requested that a time extension be granted until November 15, 1999 to enable this Intervenor to be present for written comments, or attend any hearings that may be result in this case.

#### 6) Certificate of service and filing:

This Intervenor has mailed a true and correct copy of these comments, first class postage to the Applicant and Intervenors as shown in Exhibit B.

#### MOTION FOR CLARIFICATION, DISCLOSURE & ENLARGEMENT OF TIME

By the Commission's Order of September 17, 1999, the intervening parties to this case were given ten days to provide written comments as to the Staff Report made as a result of the Commission's staff's assistance with the Applicant's filing and their perusal of the limited information they were supplied with.

Since the intervening parties, except for the Assistant Attorney General, were not supplied with any of the documents requested by and supplied to the Attorney General and the Commission until these ten days had run out, they were mailed on September 27th-exactly ten days after the Commission's Order and after a motion to compel, it was impossible to reply within the time allotted.

In the documents that were received, many of the Attorney General's questions to be answered verbally in written form remain unanswered to the interveners and key documents from the initial request were not included.

In going over the S-Corporation tax return supplied by the Applicant, at least one claim stands out as excessive. The claim under "Other Deductions" for Utilities and Telephone in the amount of

\$2,658. As you can see in the attached documentation and letterhead, the Applicant uses the one small room in her home and the single telephone line for many activities and corporations and possibly others that we are not aware of. We cannot make intelligent comments as to the fairness or unfairness of the rates requested unless and until we have a breakout of all these activities and corporations as to the use of the phone and utilities to each of these endeavors as well as room size of the small office in relation to the entire house and total charges on both the phone and utilities to arrive at an approximate idea of how much should have been relegated to P.R. Wastewater, Inc.

The other question that comes to mind is, does P. R. Wastewater, Inc., charge a blanket amount for monthly mailings or charge for the amounts actually mailed or delivered? The reason for this question is in a printout attached hereto. As indicated in the printout, I, and possibly others, make my payments on an annual basis. Are we being charged a five dollar monthly mailing fee for payments made annually?

Please consider this my motion to:

- 1. Compel the Applicant to supply all parties of record with all documents and written answers supplied to or requested by the Assistant Attorney General.
- 2. To clarify the charges for utilities and telephone as listed on the S-corporation tax return with an entity by entity breakdown and total charges paid and the office size in relation to the dwelling.
- 3. Enlarge the time to respond at least ten days beyond the time the above discovery is received by all parties.

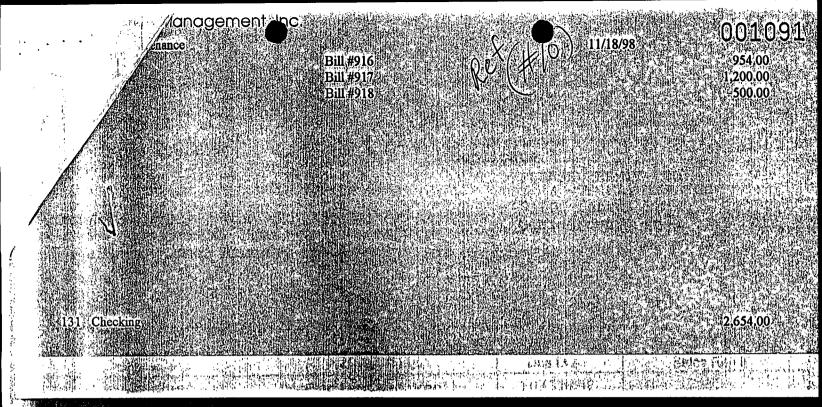

On March 31, 1999, the Public Service Commission ("Commission") received a letter from P. R. Wastewater Management, Inc. ("P. R.") requesting Commission assistance with the preparation of a rate application. Commission Staff ("Staff") provided that assistance by performing a limited financial review of P. R.'s test year operations, the calendar year ending December 31, 1998. The scope of Staff's review was limited to obtaining information as to whether the test period operating revenues and expenses were representative of normal operations. Insignificant or immaterial discrepancies were not pursued and are not addressed herein.

Upon completion of the review, Staff assisted P. R. in the development and preparation of a rate application. The application was filed with the Commission on August 3, 1999. The application included an adjusted pro forma operating income statement wherein adjustments were made to test year operating revenues and expenses that were known and measurable and deemed to be reasonable. The rates proposed in the application were based on the pro forma income statement. The proforma income statement supports a revenue requirement of \$37,246. The rate proposed to meet that requirement is a flat monthly fee of \$26.30 per residential customer and residential equivalent. The proposed rate is a 48.69 percent increase over the current monthly fee of \$17.69.

The pro forma income statement and revenue requirement calculation have been attached to this report as Attachment A. Attachment B details the calculation of the recommended rate. Sam Reid is responsible for all revenue adjustments and the calculation of the recommended rate. Scott Lawless is responsible for the determination of the revenue requirement. Based on the information included in this report, Staff is of the opinion that the rate proposed by P. R. in its application is reasonable and should be approved by this Commission.

A) <u>Sewer Service Revenues</u>. Sewer service revenues were adjusted to reflect the number of customers on the system as of May 18, 1999, and the 17 new homes that were under construction at that time. The adjustment was calculated as follows:

- B) <u>Internal Supervision and Engineering</u>. Test year internal supervision and engineering expenses included \$1,200 for aerator repairs and \$500 for a portion of flow meter repairs. Both of these items were considered to be nonrecurring and were amortized over 5 years. Test year expenses were therefore decreased by \$1,360 (\$1,700 / 5 years = \$340, \$340 \$1,700 = (\$1,360)).
- C) <u>Maintenance of Pumping Equipment</u>. Test year maintenance of pumping equipment included \$954 for the remainder of the flow meter repairs and \$120 for grass carp to put in the lagoon. Both of these items were considered to be nonrecurring and were amortized over 5 years. Test year expenses were therefore decreased by \$859 (\$1,074 / 5 years = \$215, \$215 \$1,074 = (\$859)).
- D) <u>Outside Services Employed</u>. An employee of Persimmon Ridge Development, an affiliated company, maintains all customer account information including monthly billings and collections and performs all bookkeeping duties for P. R. No costs related to these services were included in P. R.'s test period operations. The estimated cost of these services was determined to be \$3,600 based on 400 annual labor hours at \$9 per

hour. The hourly rate includes a wage rate as well as all payroll overhead costs. Test year expenses were increased by \$3,600 to reflect the cost of these services.

- E) <u>Interest Expense</u>. Interest expense accrued on long-term debt that was approved by the Commission in Case No. 96-238 has been included as a revenue requirement in this case on a dollar for dollar basis. The annual recovery was determined by calculating the average annual interest payments for the next five years.
- F) <u>Amortization Expense</u>. Prior year legal fees incurred to manage the sale and financing of the treatment plant have been amortized over 15 years. The Commission approved the plant ownership transfer in Case No. 96-238. Recovery of the amortization has been included as a revenue requirement on a dollar for dollar basis.

I recently received a notice that the sewer charges for my home in Persimmon Ridge, would be increased from \$17.69 per month to \$26.30 per month. Please consider this letter my "motion to intervene" and a request that your office examine and take into consider the following as grounds:

- When the original rate was mandated, there were probably two thirds less residents 1. participating in the sewer usage and therefore much less income to the provider. The residents anticipated a decrease in charges, not an increase, when more people were sharing the costs involved.
- We are presently experiencing charges of more than twice the amount charged by other 2. providers.
- I am a Persimmon Ridge home owner, like many others, partially retired and living on a fixed 3. income. While the cost of living is increasing, it is increasing nowhere near the approximately 49% now being requested while we were expecting a decrease due to the additional new dwellings being added.
- Because our water and sewers are billed separately, it is not possible to bill according to 4. usage, which is the fairer structure; but, in Persimmon Ridge, one person, with one income, has the same sewer charges as a large family with dual and triple incomes.

I recently received a notice that the sewer charges for my home in Persimmon Ridge, would be increased from \$17.69 per month to \$26.30 per month. Please consider this letter my "motion to intervene" and a request that your office examine and take into consider the following as grounds:

- 1. When the original rate was mandated, there were probably two thirds less residents participating in the sewer usage and therefore much less income to the provider. The residents anticipated a decrease in charges, not an increase, when more people were sharing the costs involved.
- 2. We are presently experiencing charges of more than twice the amount charged by other providers. I am including copies of water and sewer statements paid by other members of my family for comparisons.
- I am a Persimmon Ridge home owner, like many others, partially retired and living on a fixed income. While the cost of living is increasing, it is increasing nowhere near the approximately 49% now being requested while we were expecting a decrease due to the additional new dwellings being added.
- 4. Because our water and sewers are billed separately, it is not possible to bill according to usage, which is the fairer structure; but, in Persimmon Ridge, one person, with one income, has the same sewer charges as a large family with dual and triple incomes.

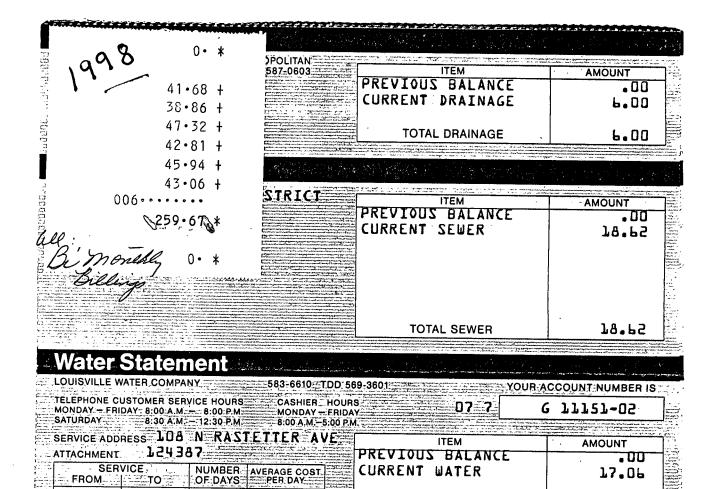
