ORDER

On September 3, 1999, Warren County Water District ("Warren County") applied for authority to revise certain non-recurring charges. It subsequently requested leave to amend its application and authority to deviate from the notice requirements of Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:011, Section 10, to avoid newspaper publication of its amended charges. The Attorney General of the Commonwealth of Kentucky ("AG") has moved to intervene in this proceeding

After reviewing the record and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the Commission finds that:

1. KRS 367.150(8) authorizes the AG to appear before the Commission to represent and be heard on behalf of consumers' interests and to be made a real party in interest on behalf of consumer interests in rate-making proceedings.

2. Warren County's request for deviation should be granted. Warren County has previously published in accordance with Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:011, Section 10, notice of its application to amend the non-recurring charges at issue. The public has been given adequate notice of these proceedings.

3. The proposed charges are equal to or less than the expenses incurred to provide the associated services.

4. The charges set forth in Appendix A of this Order are fair, just, and reasonable and should be approved.


IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. The AG's Motion to Intervene is granted.
2. Warren County is granted a deviation from Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:011, Section 10, and shall not be required to publish notice of the revisions to its application.
3. The charges in Appendix A are approved for services rendered on and after the date of this Order.
4. Within 20 days of the date of this Order and in accordance with Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:011, Section 7, Warren County shall file revised tariff sheets setting forth the rates approved herein.

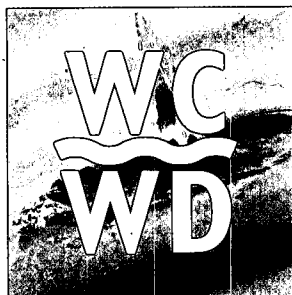

We wish to amend our application related to Case No. 99-373.

1. Service Connect Charge - To recover a charge closer to the actual, the following amendment is requested:

"A charge of \$25.00 shall be made for all service connections made during regular working hours, except that there shall be no connection charge made for service on the original installation of facilities. If service is connected other than during regular working hours, the charge shall be \$65.00."

2. Delinquent Service Charge - We deleted reference to reconnection charge and the following amendment is requested:

"A charge of \$25.00 shall be made for a trip to collect a delinquent account or terminate service. Where a customer's service has been discontinued for nonpayment of bills and the delinquent customer has paid his or her outstanding bills for service and requested reconnection, the water district shall assess a service connection charge in addition to a delinquent service charge to re-establish water service."

If service is reconnected other than during regular working hours, the charge shall be \$65.
2. Delinquent Service Charge. A charge of \$25.00 shall be made for a trip to collect a delinquent account or terminate service. Where a customer's service has been discontinued for nonpayment of bills and the delinquent customer has paid his or her outstanding bills for service and requested reconnection, the water district shall assess a service connection charge in addition to a delinquent service charge to re-establish water service.

4. Meter Test Request. Upon request a customer may have his meter tested and adjustments will be made to the bill where the meter is found to be more than 2 percent fast or slow in accordance with 807:KAR 5:006, Section 18, provided request by the customer is not more frequent than once each twelve months. If such test shows the meter to be less than 2 percent fast, a \$50.00 charge shall be made.



5. PSC Meter Test Complaint. Any customer of the District may request a meter test by written application to the Public Service commission, Post Office Box 615, Frankfort, KY 40602.
6. Service Investigation Charge. A charge of \$25.00 per trip shall be made for service investigation during regular working hours if interruption of a service or service problem is associated with the customers own plumbing facilities and beyond the Water District delivery point and is not caused by failure of District's facilities. The charge for investigation after working hours will be \$65.00 per trip. Any maintenance and repair of facilities beyond District's delivery point is the responsibility of the customer.
7. Meter Investigation Charge. When an investigation of facilities on customers' premises reveals meter seals broken, damaged meters, or unauthorized use of water, a meter investigation fee of \$75.00 shall be charged. The actual cost of repairing damage to the meter service or other Water District facilities, if any, shall also be charged and the customers' bill shall be paid for the amount of water service rendered.
8. Return Check Charge. When a check, including auto payment, is accepted for payment of a bill and the check is not honored by the financial institution, a return check charge \$25.00 shall be charged.
9. Service Line Inspection Charges. A charge of \$50.00 shall be made to inspect a customer's service line from the point of delivery at the meter service to the point of use. The service line inspection charge may be waived if confirmation is received from the Kentucky State Plumbing Inspector that a state plumbing permit has been obtained and the State Plumbing Inspector will inspect the service line.

Dear Mr. Liles:

This letter addresses the issues that we discussed in our telephone conversation of October 29, 1999.

Each water district has proposed a service connection charge of \$20.00 for all service connections and a reconnection charge of \$25.00. Each water district provides same service and incurs the same costs to make a service connection or a service reconnection. While both charges are less than the actual cost of providing the service, each district choose a higher charge for the service reconnection fee because that service results from improper customer conduct (i.e., customer failure to timely pay his or her bill).

Commission Staff believes that the difference in the proposed charges may result in unreasonable discrimination and thus be contrary to KRS 278.170. Since the service performed and the costs incurred for each charge are the same, no valid basis exists for the difference in pricing.

To avoid a potential conflict with KRS 278.170, Commission Staff suggests that each water district amend its application to reflect only a service connection charge and to delete any reference to a reconnection charge. It further suggests that the following sentence be added to the delinquent service charge provision:





Where a customer's service has been discontinued for nonpayment of bills and the delinquent customer has paid his or her outstanding bills for service and requested reconnection, the water district shall assess a service connection charge in addition to a delinquent service charge to re-establish water service.

As to the level of the service connection fee, Commission Staff notes that this charge should not exceed the cost of providing the service in question. If the water districts amend their application, each may also wish to request a deviation from the notice requirements of Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:011, Section 10, to avoid newspaper publication of its amended charges.

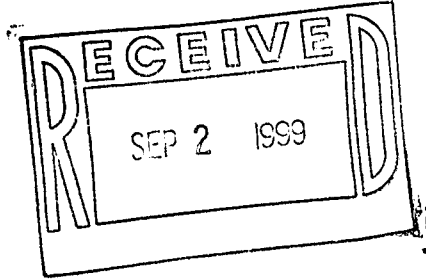



DETAILED STATEMENT

The costs of providing special services have not been reviewed since 1982. The cost associated with providing these services have increased significantly over seventeen years and should have been reviewed prior to this time. These will be reviewed on a more regular basis in the future. No general rate change is planned in the foreseeable future and the charges for special non-recurring charges are so outdated they need immediate correction to reflect the cost of providing these services to the customers who receive the service.

IMPACT STATEMENT

The impact of the changes in special non-recurring charges will affect the following groups of customers.

1. Service Connection Charge - Will affect customers who request to have an existing water service read into their name and turned on to allow water to be used from the service.
2. Delinquent Service Charge - Will affect any customer that fails to pay their bill when due and a field trip is required to collect the delinquent bill or terminate service. The charge is also made to reconnect service which has been terminated for nonpayment.
3. Meter Reading Recheck Charge - Will affect any customer who requests a recheck of the meter reading and the recheck reading reflects the meter was read correctly by the meter reader.
4. Meter Test Request - Will affect any customer who requests the water meter to be tested for accuracy and the test shows the meter to be within PSC rules for accuracy. No charge will be made for testing any water meter where the accuracy is not within acceptable accuracy standards as set forth by PSC rules.
5. Service Investigation Charge - Will affect any customer who requests a field trip to investigate customer service problems that are associated with the customers own plumbing facilities and beyond the Water Districts delivery point.
6. Meter Investigation Charge - Will affect any customer whose meter service location reflects the Water Districts meter seals or lock has been broken, damaged the meter and/or has attempted to obtain unauthorized use of water from the Water Districts facilities by any means.
7. Return Check Charge - Will affect any customer whose check was accepted for payment of a utility bill and the check was not honored by the financial institution.
8. Service Line Inspection Charge - Will affect any customer who requests a new meter service be installed and wants the Water District to inspect the customer's service line from the point of delivery to the point of use by the customer. No charge is made or inspection required when the customer service line is inspected by the state plumbing inspector.

Upon request a customer may have his meter tested and adjustments will be made to the bill where the meter is found to be more than 2 percent fast or slow in accordance with 807:KAR 5:006, Section 18, provided request by the customer is not more frequent than once each twelve months. If such test shows the meter to be less than 2 percent fast, a \$50.00 charge shall be made.

CHARGES FOR NON-RECURRING SERVICES

SUBJECT: Charges for Special Non-recurring Services

Regular working hours are 7:30 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. Monday - Friday (excluding holidays.) After hours charge is any other time.

These charges will be assessed when a sewer customer obtains his water service from another water system or the special non-recurring service is related to the sewer service only.

The following charges for special non-recurring services shall be made:

1. Service Connection Charge. A charge of \$20 shall be made for all service reconnections made during regular working hours, except that there shall be no connection charge made for service on the original installation of facilities. If service is reconnected other than during regular working hours, the charge shall be \$65.
2. Delinquent Service Charge. A charge of \$25.00 shall be made for a trip to collect a delinquent account or terminate service. A reconnection charge of \$25.00 shall be made if reconnected during regular working hours. If reconnected after regular working hours, the charge shall be \$65.00. (See 807 (KAR 5:006 Section 8.)
3. Meter Reading Recheck Charge. A charge of \$25.00 shall be made for a trip to recheck a meter reading when the customer requests the meter to be rechecked for a correct reading and the meter was not misread.
