My name is Jim McClanahan and I am the District 3 Magistrate serving on the Scott County Fiscal Court. I wanted to voice my objection to the proposed rates that Kentucky Utilities published in the Lexington Herald-Leader on December 24, 2003 and also published in the Georgetown News Graphic on December 24, 2003.

Of course I am against any increase, but I understand that Kentucky Utilities have not had a rate increase for some time and they do have some of the lowest rates in the United States so I can understand why they are requesting a rate increase at this time.

I want to point out what I consider to be an unfair rate increase on a certain service group. This service is the General Service Rate (GS). This is the rate that is used for electricity for farms that have separate service for barns, etc. The current rate is \$4.11 a month plus any usage. The new rate is \$20.00 per month plus any usage. Many farmers in Scott County like myself have their barns on a separate meter and pay the \$4.11 per month for electricity for our barns. The usage is very small and only 2 or 3 months a year is the bill higher than \$5.00 per month. With the new rate, our bills will be increased from approximately \$60 to \$70 a year to over \$250 per year. This seems very unfair to me and will very much hurt the many farmers who need electricity only during part of the year for their farm operations.

Would you please tell me what I need to do to officially object to this huge increase?
