



Thank you for your time and attention in this matter. We at Cingular appreciate Appalachian Wireless allowing us to co-locate equipment on your existing tower network in the East Kentucky market. Your cooperation will help to prevent the need to build new towers at the same location as existing structures.

As East KY sites are located in rural areas, in challenging terrain, we would like to locate our antennas at the highest elevation vacant on the tower. Per the industry norm, standard 10ft separation tip-to-tip from the existing antennas located at the top of the structure.

The attachment details on each existing tower location can be easily agreed too, once you share site specific civil and tower information.
