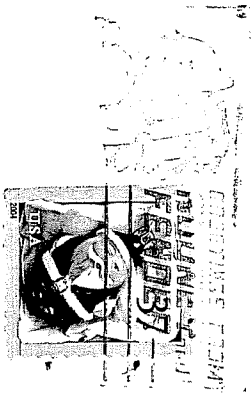

Instead of citing justifiable increased exploration, piping and storage efforts LG&E has simply passed on "increased prices" without justifying to the public where these prices originate.

This appears to be more a case of bad planning and an attempt to raise our energy prices to those of locations which have no resemblance to Louisville. This will drain money away from the city of Louisville and the state of Kentucky.
