
**CITIZENS MOTION FOR LEAVE
FOR EXTENSION TO FILE DIRECT TESTIMONY**

COME the Concerned Citizens Against the Power Line Extension (“Citizens”), by counsel, and move this Commission for leave for an extension of time in which to file its direct testimony. In support hereof, the Citizens state as follows:

The Citizens have retained GDS Associates, Inc. of Atlanta Georgia (“GDS”) to serve as their consultant/expert in this matter. In the Commission’s scheduling Order dated June 10, 2005, the Commission set July 7, 2005 as the deadline for the parties to file their responses to data requests, and then set July 15, 2005 as the deadline for the parties to file their direct testimony. To date, the Citizens have not received Kentucky Utilities Company (“KU”) responses to their data requests. The Citizens anticipate that KU will produce voluminous material in response to their request, and in light of that fact, and the additional fact that these documents then have to be reviewed first by undersigned counsel, and then shipped to Georgia, it will be impossible for GDS to complete a thorough review of this material prior to the July 15, 2005 deadline.

Wherefore, the Citizens request they be granted leave for an extension of time to file their direct testimony until Tuesday, July 19, 2005, if not later.


