Dear Customer:

Two years ago next month, Mallard Point Disposal Systems, Inc. filed with the Public Service Commission only its second request in 20 years for consideration of an increase in its revenues to offset rising costs. These increased costs have been borne by its principal, Mark S. Smith, for over a decade subsidizing the net costs billed to each utility customer. Costs have risen so dramatically over the past few years that this is no longer possible or prudent. During the last rate request, several interveners wished to take issue and decry the fact that utility income and costs have not been fully isolated by Mr. Smith from his other interests, even though he owns 100% of the utility fully.

As a result, all income and expenses have been isolated since that time and as a result, the daily operational costs of the utility have risen and now have been able to be identified. These costs have required Mr. Smith to loan moneys in the utility as a rate of approximately \$50,000 per year. Obviously this cannot continue.

For the above reasons, you will find attached a notice of our request for consideration by the Public Service Commission for an increase to our revenues, only our third in the past 21 years.

It has always been our mission to provide the best service for the least cost, and this continues to be our objective.

Reference: Your request for comments on the sewer service rate increase.

In your letter of June 18, 2005 notifying the MP residents about your request for an increase in service revenues for the MP Disposal Systems, you stated that your goal is to provide the best service for the least cost. If your request for a 49.57% increase is granted by the Public Services Commission, Mallard Point residents will be paying twice as much for sewer service than the residents of Moon Lake, who are just down the road from us. How can you claim to be a low cost provider by requesting \$52.78/month from Mallard Point residents, when the Delaplain Disposal Company only charges \$26.25/month for their Moon Lake residents?

I am willing to pay a fair and competitive rate for sewer service, but after just increasing the sewer rate a little over a year ago, and now asking for another 49.57% rate increase seems way out of line to me.

I am hoping that the Public Service Commission will turn down another rate increase at this time.

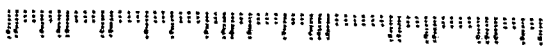

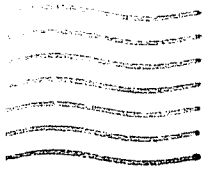
