O R D E R

On August 12, 2005, Bluegrass Wireless LLC (“Applicant”) filed an application seeking a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to construct and operate a wireless telecommunications facility. The proposed facility consists of a self-supporting antenna tower not to exceed 255 feet in height, with attached antenna, to be located at 2508 Old Mount Vernon Road, Somerset, Pulaski County, Kentucky. The coordinates for the proposed facility are North Latitude 37° 13’ 3.83” by West Longitude 84° 27’ 29.02”.

The Applicant has provided information regarding the structure of the tower, safety measures, and antenna design criteria for the proposed facility. Based upon the application, the design of the tower and foundation conforms to applicable nationally recognized building standards, and a Licensed Professional Engineer has certified the plans.

Pursuant to 807 KAR 5:063, the Applicant has notified the County Judge/Executive of the proposed construction. The Applicant has filed applications with the Federal Aviation Administration (“FAA”) and the Kentucky Airport Zoning

Commission (“KAZC”) seeking approval for the construction and operation of the proposed facility. The FAA application has been approved, but the KAZC application is still pending.

The Applicant has filed evidence of the appropriate notices provided pursuant to 807 KAR 5:063. The notices solicited any comments and informed the recipients of their right to request intervention. The Commission received a letter from Ms. Fayrene Gilliland dated August 9, 2005. In the letter, Ms. Gilliland requested information regarding the proposed construction. In a letter dated August 23, 2005, the Commission requested that the Applicant submit a response to Ms. Gilliland addressing her concerns. In addition, Ms. Gilliland was given 30 days from the date of the Commission’s letter to request intervention or a hearing in this matter. On September 2, 2005, the Applicant filed with the Commission its response to Ms. Gilliland. The 30-day timeframe for Ms. Gilliland to file further response has passed, and the Commission has received no further correspondence from Ms. Gilliland regarding her interest in this matter.

The Commission, having considered the evidence of record and being otherwise sufficiently advised, finds that the Applicant has demonstrated that a facility is necessary to provide adequate utility service and that, therefore, a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to construct the proposed facility should be granted.

Pursuant to KRS 278.280, the Commission is required to determine proper practices to be observed when it finds, upon complaint or on its own motion, that the facilities of any utility subject to its jurisdiction are unreasonable, unsafe, improper, or insufficient. To assist the Commission in its efforts to comply with this mandate, the

Applicant should notify the Commission if it does not use this antenna tower to provide service in the manner set out in its application and this Order. Upon receipt of such notice, the Commission may, on its own motion, institute proceedings to consider the proper practices, including removal of the unused antenna tower, which should be observed by the Applicant.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. The Applicant is granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to construct a wireless telecommunications facility. The proposed facility consists of a self-supporting antenna tower not to exceed 255 feet in height, with attached antenna, and is to be located at 2508 Old Mount Vernon Road, Somerset, Pulaski County, Kentucky. The coordinates for the proposed facility are North Latitude 37° 13' 3.83" by West Longitude 84° 27' 29.02".


2. The Applicant shall file a copy of the final decisions regarding the pending KAZC application for the proposed construction within 10 days of receiving this decision.

3. The Applicant shall immediately notify the Commission in writing, if, after the antenna tower is built and utility service is commenced, the tower is not used for a period of 3 months in the manner authorized by this Order.
