David W. Morgan, PH.D.

Dr. Morgan received his BS in Zoology/Chemistry from the University of Georgia in 1966 and his Ph.D. in Biological Oceanography from the Rhode Island Graduate School of Oceanography in 1973, studying communication in the beluga, or white whale. He was a Biology Professor at the University of Notre Dame for several years, where he earned the Madden Award for teaching excellence and carried out research on Lake Michigan. He has served in the Kentucky Environmental and Public Protection Cabinet since 1984 in the Water, Waste Management and Surface Mining Departments and earned his National Public Manager certification in 1990. Dr. Morgan is currently the Director of the Kentucky Division of Water and recently retired from being an adjunct professor of Public Administration at Kentucky State University, where he taught a graduate course in Grantsmanship. He is married with two children and he and his wife are managing their 100 acre Northern Kentucky farm for wildlife diversity.

Bio: Bill Kramer, National Rural Water Association

Bill is a Senior Wastewater Engineer for National Rural Water Association in the D.C. Office. He joined National Rural Water in March 2005 and has since supported a number of programs and initiatives in support of our State Associations. On the wastewater side he has been tracking and reporting upon wastewater regulatory issues including the blending policy, TMDLs, nutrient effluent standards, CMOM and potential CWA regulations for the Drinking Water Point Source Category and Cryptosporidium effluent standards for wastewater plants. Bill has also supported security initiatives in the drinking and wastewater utility sectors through participation in meetings of the National Drinking Water Advisory Council Water Security Working Group, development of a peer review program for security programs and participation in a series of training sessions focused on vulnerability assessments and emergency response plans. In conjunction with National and several State Association member employees he participated in the development of a hydrogeologic sensitivity analysis tool designed for small systems to achieve compliance with the anticipated Groundwater Rule. Bill has also begun supporting source water efforts through participation in the Source Water Collaborative, a working group of multiple associations and agencies formed to advance the source water concept and has begun an effort to expand our source water program through a collaborative effort with EPA's TMDL program.

Prior to joining National Rural Water, Bill was a manager with a Maryland based environmental engineering and consulting firm for 15 years heading up a compliance and engineering group. He was responsible for consulting services that encompassed all of the major environmental regulatory areas from air, drinking water, wastewater, storm water, hazardous and solid waste to endangered species monitoring and OSHA compliance. Bill supervised a group of engineers, scientists and training specialists, managed profit and loss for his group and expanded the group's client base through marketing and proposal development. Bill was responsible for expanding several fledging projects to multi-million dollar support programs.

Bill began his career with Baltimore County Government in the Industrial Pretreatment Program. He was responsible for permit development and enforcement of the National Pretreatment Regulations of the Clean Water Act for a diverse industrial base. He developed permits for manufacturing facilities in the defense, space, electroplating, electronics, medical instrumentation, hospitals, cosmetics, and food manufacturing industries.
