We are legal counsel to the applicant in the above reference matter, and it is in this capacity that we write this letter as a status report.

Cumberland Cellular Partnership ("Cumberland Cellular") filed its application for a certificate of public convenience and necessity on December 16, 2005 with the Public Service Commission of the Commonwealth of Kentucky (the "Commission").

At the direction of the Commission, Cumberland Cellular filed an affidavit with the Commission on April 27, 2006, affirming that each of the property owners, as defined by 807 KAR 5:063 § 1(1)(1) and KRS 278.665(2), were, for a second time, notified of the proposed construction and giving them 20 days to intervene or otherwise respond in writing. Copies of the notices with proof of service for each were attached to the affidavit.

According to the Commission's website docket, there are 31 letters in support of the proposed construction and five (5) letters in opposition and only two (2) have requested intervention, namely: (1) David and Georgia Dick; and (2) various property owners who signed the same petition. Neither request for intervention has been acted upon by the Commission.
