On December 15, 2005, at 10:00 a.m., Eastern Standard Time, a conference call was convened regarding these proceedings. On the call were David Sieradzki for SouthEast Telephone; Dorothy Chambers, Parkey Hagman, Tony Taylor and Jim Tipton for BellSouth; and Amy Dougherty for Commission Staff.

After discussing the background of these cases, both parties agreed that there were no factual issues in dispute. Hence, no informal conference or evidentiary hearing is warranted. The parties stated that legal briefs and, possibly, oral arguments were necessary to present the issues to the Commission. SouthEast Telephone indicated that its legal arguments were contained in its original complaint.

BellSouth asserted that, in the absence of a Commission order mandating otherwise, it will disconnect SouthEast Telephone's access to LENS imminently and will disconnect SouthEast customers by December 29, 2005.

All agreed that the next procedural step should be the issuance of an order from the Commission.
