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

## NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

The Kentucky Public Service Commission has instituted an administrative proceeding to consider the requirements of the federal Energy Policy Act of 2005 regarding time-based metering, demand response, and interconnection service. The Commission's consideration of smart metering and demand response is to determine whether it is appropriate to implement standards for time-based rate schedules and standards for advanced metering and communications technology in order to allow customers to participate in the time-based rate schedules or other demand response programs. The Commission's consideration of interconnection service is to determine whether it is appropriate to implement standards for connecting customers' on-site generating facilities to local distribution facilities. All of Kentucky's jurisdictional electric utilities, including Big Rivers Electric Corporation, Jackson Purchase Energy Corporation, Kenergy Corp., and Meade County Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation, have been made parties to this proceeding.

The Commission will hold a public hearing in this proceeding on July 18, 2006, at 9:00 a.m., Eastern Time, in Hearing Room 1 of the Commission's offices at 211 Sower Boulevard, Frankfort, Kentucky, for the purpose of cross-examination of witnesses. The hearing is open to the public, and anyone wishing to participate in this proceeding may file written comments or offer comments at the public hearing. Comments and questions should reference Case No. 2006-00045 and should be directed to Elizabeth O'Donnell, Executive Director, Public Service Commission, 211 Sower Boulevard, P.O.
