SUBJECT: October 5, 2006 Informal Conference

Pursuant to the Commission's September 22, 2006 Order, an informal conference was held on October 5, 2006. Attached to this memorandum is a list of the participants. The September 22, 2006 Order granted Kentucky Power's petition for rehearing of the Commission's August 16, 2006 Order that denied confidential treatment of the information provided in the responses to the Staff's First Data Request, Item 17(b). Item 17(b) requested information concerning emission allowances activity for Kentucky Power for the period 2006 through 2016. The purpose of the conference was to discuss the issues related to Kentucky Power's petition for confidentiality. Although the Attorney General and the Kentucky Industrial Utility Customers, Inc. are intervenors in this case, neither party attended the duly noticed informal conference.

The Staff stated that participation in the informal conference would in no way affect Kentucky Power's right to seek a hearing on the rehearing issue. Staff indicated that it wished to gain a better understanding of the situation and why the information warranted confidential treatment. Kentucky Power described the situation it, as well as American Electric Power Company ("AEP"), faces in the emission allowance Kentucky Power discussed briefly the nature of the emission allowance markets and how transactions undertaken by AEP in that market could be perceived. Kentucky Power stressed the negative impacts that could result if the information provided in the responses to Item 17(b) were made public.

After Kentucky Power's presentation, the Staff indicated that it better understood the situation faced by Kentucky Power and AEP and its request for confidentiality. The Staff requested that Kentucky Power file in the record information concerning the emission allowance market, which would further support Kentucky Power's request for confidentiality. Kentucky Power indicated it would file this information within two weeks.

With nothing further to discuss, the conference was then adjourned.
