<u>RESPONSE OF KENTUCKY UTILITIES COMPANY</u> <u>TO COMPLAINANT'S MOTION FOR RULING</u>

Cumberland Valley Electric, Inc. ("CVE") has moved the Commission for "an expeditious ruling" on certain issues now pending before it in this matter, including primarily the Motion to Dismiss filed by Kentucky Utilities Company ("KU").¹ While KU does not object to the Commission ruling on issues which have been briefed, it does take exception to one statement made by CVE in its most recent motion. Specifically, on page 1 of that motion, CVE states that "KU has been providing service to [Stillhouse Mine No. 2] through a customer owned distribution line since at least the early summer of 2005. No Commission approval has ever been given for KU to provide such service." That statement is incomplete in that it fails to recognize the length of time for which the distribution line at issue has existed, and is incorrect in implying that KU should have obtained Commission approval before serving the customer at issue.

As set forth fully in KU's Motion to Dismiss and in its Reply Brief in Further Support of that motion, KU is delivering power at the same substation used to provide service to BMR and

predecessor mining companies for over 70 years, which substation is located exclusively in KU's certified territory. From that point, Black Mountain Resources, Inc. ("BMR") delivers power to multiple mining operations via a private distribution line.² While that line has been owned by BMR since the early 1980s, it has been in existence and used by predecessor mining companies for decades.³

KU is doing nothing more than delivering power to BMR at a point wholly within KU's certified territory, as it has done at the same point of delivery for decades. That delivery of power in this instance is fully consistent with the Certified Territories Act, and no Commission approval was or is needed for KU to continue that service. For all of the reasons set forth in previous pleadings filed with this Commission, this action should be dismissed.
