ORDER

Sandy Valley Water District ("Sandy Valley"), Southern Water and Sewer District ("Southern District"), and the city of Pikeville, Kentucky ("Pikeville") (jointly "Petitioners") have applied to the Commission for authority to transfer Sandy Valley's existing water assets and customers to Southern District and Pikeville. Southern District further applies for authority to assume a portion of Sandy Valley's existing debt obligations

On July 31, 2006, the Commission denied Petitioners' request for a deviation from certain provisions of Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:001, Section 6, and directed Petitioners to comply with these provisions. On August 25, 2006, Petitioners supplemented their application to meet these provisions. This supplemental filing does not meet the requirements of 807 KAR 5:001, Section 6(9), as the financial exhibit does not contain a detailed income statement and balance sheet for a 12-month period ending within 90 days of the initial application. The income statements and balance sheets cover only 1-month, 6-month and 7-month periods prior to the application's initial filling.

Because these income statements and balance sheets when considered in conjunction with those previously submitted will allow a review of the required 12-month period, the Commission, on its own motion, finds that the Petitioners should be permitted to deviate from Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:001, Section 6(9), and that their application should be considered filed as of the date of this Order.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. Petitioners are permitted to deviate from Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:001, Section 6(9).
 - 2. Petitioners' application is deemed filed as of the date of this Order.
