SUBJECT: Informal Conference, April 20, 2007

Pursuant to the Staff Notice, an informal conference ("IC") was held April 20, 2007. A copy of the conference attendance list is attached. The purpose of the conference was to discuss issues related to the application of Louisville Gas and Electric Company ("LG&E") requesting Commission approval of its proposed Responsive Pricing and Smart Metering Pilot program tariff. The conference began with a brief power point overview of the proposed program (attached for the Main Case File only). LG&E demonstrated the functioning of the programmable thermostat and the inhome energy usage display device. Issues regarding the implementation of the technology, such as customer education, assisting customers with problems or questions, and security of the communications network were also discussed.

The company then addressed specific concerns of the Attorney General ("AG"). The AG questioned LG&E's response to Question No. 44 of the AG data request and produced a handout of four charts showing the applicable energy cost for each hour of the day (copies attached) explaining that the AG was trying to map out the cost per kWh for comparison purposes. LG&E agreed to amend its response to Item No. 44 as a result of the discussion. In addition, the AG expressed concern with the P4 \$0.30 kWh rate because it could result in large electric bills for some customers. LG&E says that past research shows that a rather large critical rate is necessary in order to trigger the appropriate consumer responses to the price signals but agreed to consider the AG's concerns.

The parties then agreed to the procedural schedule proposed by Commission Staff.

Commission Staff agreed to try to meet LG&E's request for a final Order by June 30, 2007 but explained that it could not actually promise an Order by that date.
