

# Kremer's Market focuses on fresh food, friendly service

CRESCENT SPRINGS - Thirty years ago, Urban Kremer stopped selling his produce at the family farm, door-to-door, and at local markets

them in the family business. Since then, Tom has assumed the role of day-to-day manager. Returning from a produce pick-up one recent morning, Tom explained that homegrown produce, choice
