**SUPPLEMENTAL REQUEST FOR INFORMATION
POSED BY THE ATTORNEY GENERAL**

Comes now the intervenor, the Attorney General of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, by and through his Office of Rate Intervention, and submits this Supplemental Request for Information to Louisville Gas and Electric Company and Kentucky Utilities Company, to be answered by the date specified in the Commission's Order of Procedure, and in accord with the following:

- (1) In each case where a request seeks data provided in response to a staff request, reference to the appropriate request item will be deemed a satisfactory response.
- (2) Please identify the witness who will be prepared to answer questions concerning each request.
- (3) These requests shall be deemed continuing so as to require further and supplemental responses if the company receives or generates additional information within the scope of these requests between the time of the response and the time of any hearing conducted hereon.
- (4) If any request appears confusing, please request clarification directly from the Office of Attorney General.

(5) To the extent that the specific document, workpaper or information as requested does not exist, but a similar document, workpaper or information does exist, provide the similar document, workpaper, or information.

(6) To the extent that any request may be answered by way of a computer printout, please identify each variable contained in the printout which would not be self evident to a person not familiar with the printout.


(7) If the company has objections to any request on the grounds that the requested information is proprietary in nature, or for any other reason, please notify the Office of the Attorney General as soon as possible.

(8) For any document withheld on the basis of privilege, state the following: date; author; addressee; indicated or blind copies; all persons to whom distributed, shown, or explained; and, the nature and legal basis for the privilege asserted.

(9) In the event any document called for has been destroyed or transferred beyond the control of the company, please state: the identity of the person by whom it was destroyed or transferred, and the person authorizing the destruction or transfer; the time, place, and method of destruction or transfer; and, the reason(s) for its destruction or transfer. If destroyed or disposed of by operation of a retention policy, state the retention policy.

1. Please reference the Company's response to the Commission Staff's First Set of Data Requests, question 6 (b). As the 4:00 p.m. deadline for posting prices is not based upon any requirement of the wholesale power market, does the company believe that posting the day ahead prices at an earlier time, such as by 2:00 p.m., would allow participants more time to plan and respond? If not, why?

2. Please reference the Company's response to the Commission Staff's First Set of Data Requests, question 3 (a & b). Please provide a examples of the same billing calculations and information as found in Example 1 of the response, but calculate the billing for: a) a 10% decrease in all hours without a change in the load pattern b) a 10% increase in all hours with a change in the load pattern. If such calculations are not possible, please state why.

3. Please reference the Company's response to the Attorney General's First Set of Data Requests, question 2 (a). Did either the Duke Energy or Georgia Power RTP plan utilize an adjusted CBL as is proposed by the company as part of this pilot? If so, then please provide the formula used to calculate the adjusted CBL. If not, where did the use of an adjusted CBL originate and why?
